

PROPOSITION 105
SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION 1022

ANALYSIS BY LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL

1 The Arizona Constitution creates a State Board of Education consisting of the
2 Superintendent of Public Instruction and 8 members appointed by the Governor: the president of
3 a state university or college, a superintendent of a high school district, a classroom teacher, a
4 county school superintendent, three public members and a member of the state junior college
5 board. The powers and duties of the State Board of Education are established in state statutes,
6 and include exercising general supervision over and regulating the conduct of the public school
7 system. The successor agency to the state junior college board was eliminated in 2003.
8 Proposition 105 would amend the Arizona Constitution by changing the membership of
9 the State Board of Education. The member of the state junior college board would be replaced by
10 a president or chancellor of a community college district. Two additional members would be
11 added: one additional public member and one owner or administrator of a charter school.
