HB 2159 (Chapter 249): vehicle impoundment; release of vehicle

Exempts towing operators from liability for damages when moving a vehicle under ADOT or law enforcement direction to mitigate a potential fire or safety hazard. Requires the release of an immobilized or impounded vehicle to the registered owner if the owner was not driving during removal and the vehicle is a commercial vehicle, street sweeper or heavy equipment. Allocates 20% of all abandoned vehicle fees for abandoned vehicle tows. Establishes the Abandoned Vehicle Administration Fund under ADOT for administering reimbursements on abandoned vehicle tows. Requires written authorization for all private property tows. Prohibits the removal of vehicles authorized to park on private property unless there is evidence of abandonment, which cannot solely be expired registration. Requires the certified statement in a transfer of ownership application to include proof no person has taken financial responsibility for the vehicle's release. Requires a person to submit specified documentation to prove vehicle ownership. Exempts a demonstration project conducted by ADOT from the following too closely restriction under specified conditions. Effective: August 9, 2017.

HB 2247 (Chapter 196): school bus drivers; fingerprint cards

Requires a person to have and maintain a valid FPCC issued by ADPS for certification as a school bus driver. Directs ADPS to suspend a school bus driver's certificate if the FPCC is invalid, suspended, canceled or revoked. Requires current certified school bus drivers to obtain valid FPCC by December 31, 2018 in order to maintain certification. Allows a certified school bus driver who holds a valid FPCC to use the current card until expiration. Effective: August 9, 2017.

HB 2249 (Chapter 322): vehicle registration; nonresidents; penalty

Stipulates a nonresident or person who is operating a foreign vehicle owned by a nonresident on an Arizona highway without proper license plates and vehicle registration is responsible for a civil traffic violation rather than a Class 2 misdemeanor ([4 months/ \\$750 plus surcharge](#)). Effective: August 9, 2017.

HB 2251 (Chapter 142): ADOT; Meridian Road

Requires ADOT to work with interested parties to extend Meridian Road southbound across State Trust Land and consult with ASLD and any affected city, town or county.

HB 2331 (Chapter 231): auto dealers; recalls; manufacturer compensation

Requires an auto manufacturer to compensate an auto dealer for all labor and parts required to perform recall repairs when used motor vehicles are subject to safety recalls, emissions recalls, a stop-sale or a do not drive notification has been issued. Stipulates if a remedy is not available to perform a recall service for a used motor vehicle and a stop-sale or do not drive notification has been issued, the manufacturer must compensate the dealer at a rate of at least 1.5% per month. Specifies the value of the used motor vehicle is the average trade-in value determined by reference to a nationally recognized publication that reports on used motor vehicle values. Requires the manufacturer to approve or disapprove a claim within 30 days of receiving the claim. Stipulates

any claim not specifically disapproved in writing within 30 days of the manufacturer receiving the claim is approved. Effective: August 9, 2017.

HB 2354 (Chapter 75): science education special plates

Requires ADOT to issue science education special license plates. Stipulates out of the \$25 fee for the purchase of the special plate \$8 is an administration fee and \$17 is an annual donation to a nonprofit organization that benefits science education. Establishes the Science Education Special Plate Fund to be administered by the Director of ADOT. Effective: August 9, 2017.

HB 2368 (Chapter 295): oxygenated fuel standards; formula

Removes Iso-butanol from the list of oxygenates that cannot collectively contribute to more than 0.10% oxygen by weight in gasoline that is sold for fueling motor vehicles. Allows a gasoline blend other than a gasoline-ethanol blend to be sold for motor vehicle use in a county with a population of 1.2 million or more and any portion of the county contained in Area A, between November 1 and March 31 of each year. Conditions enactment on EPA approval of the proposed modifications to the gasoline fuel formulation requirements as part of the state implementation plan for air quality by July 1, 2022. Effective: August 9, 2017.

HB 2371 (Chapter 47): oversize commercial vehicles; local authority

Requires a local authority that issues a permit to operate an oversize vehicle to adopt and enforce ordinances that are identical to ADOT rules relating to overweight commercial vehicles. This act applies to ordinances adopted by a local authority before and after the effective date. Effective: August 9, 2017.

HB 2399 (Chapter 201): waste tires; definitions

Expands the definition of *waste tire* to include a motor vehicle tire that is no longer suitable for its original intended purpose because of age, improper repair or manufacturer's recall. Defines *age*, *improper repair* and *manufacturer's recall*. Effective: August 9, 2017.

HB 2483 (Chapter 48): motor vehicle dealers; title information

Requires the notice of transfer of a vehicle title to be submitted within 15 days of the transfer. Stipulates the notice of transfer does not apply to wholesale motor vehicle auction dealers until ADOT implements a system that allows the dealer to electronically submit the notice and 90 days after ADOT notifies each dealer of the system's implementation. Effective: August 9, 2017.

SB 1017 (Chapter 4): electric personal assistive mobility devices

Expands the definition of *electric personal assistive mobility devices* to include self-balancing devices with one wheel. Effective: August 9, 2017.

SB 1073 (Chapter 83): license plate covers; prohibition

Prohibits a person from covering or making any alterations to a license plate that obscures from any angle the numbers, letters, validating years or jurisdiction issuing the plate. Effective: August 9, 2017.

SB 1080 (Chapter 209): teenage drivers; communication devices prohibited

Prohibits instructional permit holders from operating a motor vehicle while using a wireless communication device. Prohibits Class G licensees from operating a motor vehicle while using a wireless communication device during the first six months of driving or until the licensees 18th birthday. Allows the use of wireless communication devices during specific emergency situations. Permits use of an audible turn-by-turn navigation system under specified conditions. Effective: July 1, 2018.

SB 1082 (Chapter 10): motorcycle safety fund

Continues the Motorcycle Safety Fund through June 30, 2021. Effective: August 9, 2017.

SB 1132 (Chapter 84): amateur radio operator special plates

Creates the Arizona Amateur Radio Education and Community Involvement Fund for the existing amateur radio special plate. Effective: August 9, 2017.

SB 1139 (Chapter 110): collector car auction special plates

Requires ADOT to issue collector car auction special license plates and active duty installation support special plates. Stipulates out of the \$25 fee for the purchase of the special plate \$8 is an administration fee and \$17 is an annual donation to a nonprofit organization for each plate. Establishes the Collector Car Auction Special Plate Fund and the Active Duty Installation Support Special Plate Fund to be administered by the Director of ADOT. Effective: August 9, 2017.

SB 1150 (Chapter 331): ignition interlock device; regulation; installers

Modifies requirements for ignition interlock devices (IID) and establishes application and contract requirements for IID service providers. Requires IIDs to meet or exceed national standards and authorizes the Assistant Director of the MVD to establish standards and qualifications for service provider technicians. Requires service providers to maintain insurance and have a sufficient number of service locations in all 15 counties and allows mobile service centers but prohibits a towing truck from being a mobile service center. Establishes the Ignition Interlock Device Fund consisting of monies collected by ADOT from service providers for installation. Effective: July 1, 2018.

SB 1211 (Chapter 44): ADOT omnibus

Allows ADOT to bypass federal environmental regulatory practices when constructing new highways so long as the state takes responsibility for civil suits against it. Removes the requirement for drivers to apply for license reinstatement after suspension. Removes [ARS §§ 28-6543](#) and [28-6544](#) relating to local highway budget reporting. Exempts light rail operators from administrative payments to ADOT. Effective: August 9, 2017.

SB 1216 (Chapter 177) towing firms; assets; definition

Prohibits an owner of a towing firm that has a shared use of assets with another towing firm from applying for a contractual agreement with ADPS or a city, town or county within the same geographic area for that application. Requires the Director of ADPS or a city, town or county to determine that each towing firm is in compliance and to review any complaints that are submitted with supporting documentation. Specifies when a towing firm shares any employees or staff with another firm, the firms must be considered as one company for the purposes of the rotation list in that geographically contracted towing area. Effective: August 9, 2017.

SB 1239 (Chapter 85): parking violation; disabilities; access aisles

Prohibits any vehicle, including those with the international symbol of access, from parking in the access aisle of a disabled vehicle parking spot. Effective: August 9, 2017.

SB 1379 (Chapter 274): misused transportation excise tax; repayment

Instructs ADOT to require a jurisdiction that misuses transportation excise tax monies to repay the full amount of the misused monies either in a lump sum or in consecutive annual payments of at least 10%. Effective: August 9, 2017.
