# 2010 ARIZONA LEGISLATIVE INTERNSHIP PROGRAM

## PROGRAM OVERVIEW

The Legislative Internship Program is offered during the spring semester. Interns are placed in various positions at the Arizona State Senate or House of Representatives. Generally, interns conduct legislative and public policy research, present information to committees, caucuses and individual legislators, analyze bills and write summaries.

Interns receive a stipend and a tuition/fee waiver, and earn 12 hours of undergraduate upper division credit or 9 hours of graduate credit upon successful completion of the internship. Students from outside Maricopa County are eligible to apply for reimbursement of qualified relocation expenses.

## ELIGIBILITY

Applicants must be candidates for a Bachelor's or Master's degree with a GPA of 3.0 or higher at the time of application. Candidates for a Bachelor's degree must have earned at least 75 hours at the end of the fall semester. All academic disciplines are encouraged to apply.

## APPLICATION AND SELECTION PROCESS

There are two rounds of interviews. Campus interviews are conducted in October to determine which candidates will be interviewed at the State Capitol by the Legislative Selection Committee.
