

# Oversight Council on Driving or Operating Under the Influence Abatement

**PURPOSE:** To: (1) make grants from the driving under the influence abatement fund to political subdivisions and tribal governments that apply for monies for enforcement purposes, prosecutorial and judicial activities and alcohol abuse treatment services related to preventing and abating driving or operating under the influence occurrences in a motor vehicle or a motorized watercraft; (2) make grants from the Driving Under the Influence Abatement Fund to innovative programs that use emerging technologies to educate, prevent or deter occurrences of driving or operating under the influence in a motor vehicle or a motorized watercraft; and (3) receive quarterly reports from the entities receiving grants and evaluate their effectiveness. The Council may make additional grants to the recipients and oversee the progress of those programs. On or before December 1 of each year the Council will submit a written report on the effectiveness of the grants provided in reducing the incidence of driving or operating under the influence to the Governor, The Speaker of the House of Representatives, the President of the Senate, and provide a copy of this report to the Secretary of State and the Director of the Arizona State Library, Archives and Public Records.
