Chapter/ Bill No.	Reference Title	Description of Vetoed Bill
<u>Forty-Seventh Legislature - First Regular Session</u>		
H.B. 2033	AIMS Tutoring; Advisory Committee; Appropriation	Would codify existing Department of Education Special Line Item transfer of \$10 million from surplus education formula funding to pay for expanded Arizona Instrument to Measures Standards (AIMS) tutoring in FY 2005.
H.B. 2379	Tuition Organizations; Corporate Tax Credit	Would allow corporations to claim an income tax credit for contributions towards educational scholarships. The Governor also vetoed S.B. 1527, a modified version of this bill.
H.B. 2718	English Language Learners	Appropriated \$28.8 million to restructure the state's English language learner programs to comply with <i>Flores v. Arizona</i> . The FY 2006 amount does not include \$13.5 million that this bill sought to redirect from previous appropriations.
H.B. 2782	Full-Day Kindergarten; Expansion	Would create a \$5.5 million school voucher program and allow corporations to claim an income tax credit for contributions towards educational scholarships. Also included Full Day Kindergarten funding of \$38 million.
S.B. 1067	Appropriation; Zuni Tribe Water Settlement	Would meet the state's obligations under the Federal Zuni Indian Tribe Water Rights Settlement Act of 2003 (P.L. 108-34). Laws 2005, Chapter 332 enacted a modified version of this bill.
S.B. 1095 ^{1/}	Budget Reconciliation; Taxation; Corporations; Property	Would reduce and cap business and residential property tax rates. Laws 2005, Chapter 302 enacted a modified version of this bill.
S.B. 1202 ^{1/}	Budget Reconciliation; Revenue; Marriage; Taxation	Would make changes to the state tax code to conform with the Internal Revenue Code would annually adjust individual income standard deductions for inflation; would increase certain tax credits for married couples. Laws 2005, Chapter 334 enacted a modified version of this bill.
S.B. 1246	Property Tax Valuation; Telecommunications Companies	Would alter valuation methods for telecommunications company property.
S.B. 1247	Electric Generation Facilities; Tax Valuation	Would alter valuation methods for real and personal property used in operating electric generation facilities.
S.B. 1394 ^{1/}	Budget Reconciliation; School Facilities Board	Laws 2005, Chapter 287 enacted a modified version of this bill.
S.B. 1395 ^{1/}	Budget Reconciliation; Fees for Services	Laws 2005, Chapter 299 enacted a modified version of this bill.
S.B. 1396 ^{1/}	Budget Reconciliation; Environmental Protections	Laws 2005, Chapter 332 enacted a modified version of this bill.
S.B. 1397 ^{1/}	Budget Reconciliation; Criminal Justice	Laws 2005, Chapter 300 enacted a modified version of this bill.
S.B. 1398 ^{1/}	Budget Reconciliation; Budget Procedures	Laws 2005, Chapter 331 enacted a modified version of this bill.
S.B. 1399 ^{1/}	Budget Reconciliation; State Automation; Telecommunications	Laws 2005, Chapter 301 enacted the same version of this bill.
S.B. 1401 ^{1/}	Budget Reconciliation; Capital Outlay	Laws 2005, Chapter 298 enacted a modified version of this bill.
S.B. 1402 ^{1/}	Budget Reconciliation; Transportation	Would revise Arizona Department of Transportation's procedures to analyze suspected fraudulent documents. The Governor also vetoed S.B. 1523, a modified version of this bill.

S.B. 1403 ^{1/}	Budget Reconciliation; General Revenues	Laws 2005, Chapter 288 enacted a modified version of this bill.
S.B. 1404 ^{1/}	Budget Reconciliation; Health and Welfare	Laws 2005, Chapter 328 enacted a modified version of this bill.
S.B. 1405 ^{1/}	K-12 Education; Budget Reconciliation	Laws 2005, Chapter 329 enacted a modified version of this bill.
S.B. 1406 ^{1/}	Budget Reconciliation; Higher Education	Laws 2005, Chapter 330 enacted a modified version of this bill.
S.B. 1407 ^{1/}	Budget Reconciliation; Ladewig Settlement Payments	Laws 2005, Chapter 333 enacted the same version of this bill.
S.B. 1408 ^{1/}	General Appropriations; 2005-2006	Laws 2005, Chapter 286 enacted a modified version of this bill.
S.B. 1523	Transportation; Budget	Would revise the Arizona Department of Transportation's procedures to analyze suspected fraudulent documents. The Governor also vetoed S.B. 1402, the originally passed version of this bill.
S.B. 1527	Tuition Organizations; Tax Credit; Budget	Would allow corporations to claim an income tax credit for contributions towards educational scholarships. The Governor also vetoed H.B. 2379, a similar version of this bill.
Ch. 286/ S.B. 1513	General Appropriation Act; 2005-2006	The Governor line-item vetoed the deposit of all excess FY 2005 revenues into the Budget Stabilization Fund.
Ch. 287/ H.B. 2769	School Facilities Board; Budget	The Governor line-item vetoed a change in the School Facilities Board building renewal formula.
Ch. 288/ H.B. 2770	General Revenues; Budget	The Governor line-item vetoed the deposit of unrestricted federal monies into the state General Fund and the elimination of the minimum tax distribution to the Arizona Sports and Tourism Authority. The latter would have increased General Fund revenues by \$1.2 million.

^{1/} This bill was a component of the March 18 budget, which the Governor vetoed.
