Agency Description — *The board reviews and approves charter school applications, including renewal applications, and monitors the schools that it sponsors for compliance with the provisions of their individual charters. It consists of the Superintendent of Public Instruction, 6 members of the general public, 2 members of the business community who are appointed by the Governor, and 3 members of the Legislature who serve as advisory members.*

- 1/ The State Board for Charter Schools shall conduct a survey of parents of charter school students in order to establish parent quality ratings for every charter school in this state. Each charter school in this state shall provide the board with the information needed in order to conduct the survey. (General Appropriation Act footnote)
- 2/ The appropriated amount includes \$25,000 in FY 2000 and \$25,000 in FY 2001 to conduct a survey of employees in each charter school in this state in order to determine, for each employee, the employee's quality rating for the charter school where the employee works. (General Appropriation Act footnote)
- 3/ General Appropriation Act funds are appropriated as an Operating Lump Sum with Special Line Items by Agency.
