Agency Description — *The agency licenses, investigates, and conducts examinations of architects, assayers (assessors of mineral value), engineers, geologists, land surveyors, and landscape architects. Laws 2000, Chapter 86 increases the board's responsibilities to include the certification of home inspectors.*

Examinations — The approved supplemental appropriation adds \$100,000 in FY 2000 to cover outstanding debts generated by the vendor under contract to administer the board's licensing examinations. Laws 2000, Chapter 86 allows the board to enter into an agreement with the National Councils to administer their own exams. The board therefore will no longer need to enter into a contract with a private vendor.

Additional Appropriations: Regulating Home Inspectors (Chapter 86) — This act increases the board's responsibilities to include the regulation of home inspectors. It appropriates \$75,000 in FY 2001 from the Technical Registration Fund for start-up and operating costs related to the certification of home inspectors.

^{1/} This appropriation is available for use pursuant to the provisions of A.R.S. § 35-143.01C and is exempt from the provisions of A.R.S. § 35-190, relating to lapsing of appropriations until June 30, 2001. In addition to the amounts appropriated in FY 2001, an increase of \$50,000 or 20% of the agency's total appropriations, whichever is greater is appropriated to the agency in FY 2001 for unanticipated costs. Before expending any of these monies, the agency shall submit the intended use of the monies to the Joint Legislative Budget Committee for review. (General Appropriation Act footnote, as amended by Laws 2000, Chapter 3)

^{2/} The appropriated FY 2000 amount includes \$100,000 to cover outstanding debts related to examination fees. The Joint Legislative Budget Committee Staff shall be notified before the expenditure of these monies for any other purpose. (General Appropriation Act footnote, as added by Laws 2000, Chapter 3)

^{3/} General Appropriation Act funds are appropriated as a Lump Sum by Agency.
