**Agency Description** — *The Boxing Commission licenses, investigates and regulates the professional boxing and kick-boxing industry in Arizona. The Department of Racing is responsible for collection and accounting of Boxing Commission revenues.*

**Commission Meetings** — The approved FY 2000 amount includes an increase of \$2,500 to pay for the costs of additional meetings. The additional meetings are necessitated by Laws 1997, Chapter 294, which requires the commission to regulate non-traditional fighting events. This amount is continued in FY 2001.

<sup>1/</sup> The Boxing Commission shall report to the President of the Senate, the Speaker of the House of Representatives, the Chairmen of the Senate and House of Representatives Appropriations Committees and the Director of the Joint Legislative Budget Committee on a semiannual basis. The report shall contain the number of boxing events, gross receipts, state revenues and license fee collections. (General Appropriation Act footnote)
