AN ACT

AMENDING SECTION 36-125.05, ARIZONA REVISED STATUTES; RELATING TO THE UNIFORM PATIENT REPORTING SYSTEM.

1 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Arizona:
2 Section 1. Section 36-125.05, Arizona Revised Statutes, is amended to
3 read:
4 36-125.05. Uniform patient reporting system; statistical and
5 demographic reports; exemption
6 A. The department shall prescribe and implement a uniform patient
7 reporting system for hospital inpatient and emergency department services.
8 The requirements imposed for this reporting system shall be substantially the
9 same as the uniform billing requirements prescribed by the ~~federal~~ UNITED
10 STATES department of health and human services pursuant to titles XVIII and
11 XIX of the social security act, as amended (42 United States Code sections
12 1395 through 1395pp), whether or not the effective date for the federal
13 billing system is after January 31, 1984.
14 B. The department shall require hospitals to report inpatient
15 statistical data designed to promote cost containment as the department
16 determines. These data shall be derivable from the data obtained under the
17 uniform patient reporting system prescribed by subsection A and, for all
18 inpatient services, shall include the following:
19 1. The number of confinements.
20 2. The average length of stay.
21 3. The average charge per day.
22 4. The average charge per confinement, which is the product of the
23 average length of stay multiplied by the average charge per day.
24 5. The average charge per confinement for each attending physician.
25 C. Each of the categories of data specified in subsection B shall be
26 further categorized by one or more of the following methods as the department
27 determines:
28 1. Discharge diagnoses.
29 2. Groupings of related diagnoses.
30 3. Groupings of diagnoses that typically have similar lengths of
31 confinement.
32 4. Any other similar categories that may be determined by the
33 department.
34 D. The department shall require hospital emergency departments to
35 report outpatient service statistical data designed to promote cost
36 containment. The department shall adopt rules establishing the procedures
37 for reporting. These data shall be derivable from the data obtained under
38 the uniform patient reporting system prescribed in subsection A, and shall
39 include the following:
40 1. Date of service.
41 2. Surgical procedures.
42 3. Related diagnosis.
43 4. Charges for services.

1 E. The department may require hospitals and emergency departments to
2 report other clinical and demographic data regarding patient age, sex or
3 insurance coverage for inpatient and emergency department services.

4 F. ~~Hospitals providing primarily psychiatric services are~~ THE STATE
5 HOSPITAL IS exempt from the reporting requirements imposed by subsections B,
6 D and E.

7 G. The data from the period beginning January 1 and ending June 30 of
8 each year shall be reported on or before August 15 of that year. The data
9 from the period beginning July 1 and ending December 31 of each year shall be
10 reported on or before February 15 of the following year.

11 H. All reports filed pursuant to this section are open to public
12 inspection at the offices of the department. The department shall ensure
13 that this public access to reports does not breach confidentiality of
14 privileged medical information or privileged information on an individual's
15 work performance or earnings.

16 I. If further investigation is considered necessary or desirable to
17 verify the accuracy of information in reports submitted under this section,
18 the department may further examine records and accounts related to the
19 reporting requirements of this section. The department shall bear the cost
20 incurred in connection with this examination unless the department finds that
21 the records examined are significantly deficient or incorrect, in which case
22 the department may charge the cost of the investigation to the facility
23 examined.
