A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

ON THE DEATH OF THE HONORABLE DAN H. SCHOTTEL.

1 The Honorable Dan H. Schottel, former Arizona legislator, passed away
2 at the age of seventy-five.

3 Born in St. Louis, Missouri on August 10, 1935, Dan Schottel served
4 four years in the United States Air Force before moving to Tucson in 1957.
5 There, he owned and operated a trucking company and the Wooden Nickel Tavern
6 and raised four children with his wife, Eileen. He became active in
7 Republican circles, serving with the Pima County Executive Republican
8 Committee and the Pima County Republican Party. He ran for the Arizona House
9 of Representatives in 1992 and ably served his constituents as a legislator
10 for District 12 from 1993 to 2000.

11 During his legislative tenure, Representative Schottel served on
12 various House committees, including Appropriations, Government Reform and
13 States Rights, Health, and Public Institutions and Universities. He also
14 served as chairman of the House Education Committee for several years and was
15 one of three Arizona Commissioners to serve on the Western Interstate
16 Commission for Higher Education. Committed to improving the quality of
17 education in this state, he sponsored or supported various worthwhile
18 legislative measures relating to charter schools, school funding reform,
19 special-needs children and parental choice.

20 Dedicated to his family, Dan Schottel will be greatly missed by his
21 wife of nearly fifty-five years, Eileen, his four children, his six
22 grandchildren and his six great-grandchildren.

23 Therefore

24 Be it resolved by the Senate of the State of Arizona, the House of
25 Representatives concurring:

26 That the Members of the Legislature express regret at the passing of
27 the Honorable Dan H. Schottel and extend their deepest sympathies to his
28 surviving family members.
