AN ACT

ESTABLISHING THE GREEN PUBLIC SCHOOLS TASK FORCE.

1 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Arizona:

2 Section 1. Green public schools task force; membership; duties;
3 report; delayed repeal

4 A. The green public schools task force is established consisting of
5 the following members:

6 1. Two members of the senate who are appointed by the president of the
7 senate and who represent different political parties.

8 2. Two members of the house of representatives who are appointed by
9 the speaker of the house of representatives and who represent different
10 political parties.

11 3. The chief executive officer of the Arizona commerce authority or
12 the chief executive officer's designee.

13 4. The executive director of the school facilities board or the
14 executive director's designee.

15 5. The superintendant of public instruction or the superintendant's
16 designee.

17 6. The chairperson of a nonprofit organization that is dedicated to
18 sustainable building design and construction or the chairperson's designee.
19 The governor shall appoint this member.

20 7. One representative of a statewide organization of school district
21 governing board members. The president of the senate shall appoint this
22 member.

23 8. One representative of a statewide organization of school district
24 administrators. The speaker of the house of representatives shall appoint
25 this member.

26 9. A member of the public. The governor shall appoint this member.

27 B. The task force shall:

28 1. Identify the procedures and methods to retrofit public schools in
29 this state to conform to the leadership in energy and environmental design
30 building standards.

31 2. Recommend a model green cleaning policy for public schools in this
32 state.

33 3. Make recommendations relating to the establishment and financing of
34 a system to ensure that existing public schools are retrofitted and new
35 public schools are constructed in a manner that promotes energy efficiency
36 and sustainability.

37 4. Submit to the governor, the president of the senate and the speaker
38 of the house of representatives a report of its findings and recommendations
39 on or before November 1, 2014. The task force shall provide a copy of its
40 report to the secretary of state.

41 C. Task force members are not eligible to receive compensation, but
42 members appointed pursuant to subsection A, paragraphs 6, 7, 8 and 9 of this
43 section are eligible for reimbursement of expenses under title 38, chapter 4,
44 article 2, Arizona Revised Statutes.

45 D. This section is repealed from and after December 31, 2014.
