EXECUTIVE NOMINATIONS

Nadine Basha – Member, Arizona Early Childhood Development and Health Board – CONFIRMATION RECOMMENDED

Nadine Basha gave an overview of her resume and discussed the Arizona Early Childhood Development and Health Board.

Senator Ward moved the Health and Human Services Committee recommend to the full Senate the CONFIRMATION of Nadine Basha as a member of the Arizona Early Childhood Development and Health Board. The motion CARRIED with a roll call vote of 5-0-2 (Attachment 1).

HB 2241 - appropriation; client services trust fund – DO PASS

Brandy Petrone, Arizona Association of Providers for People with Disabilities, testified in support of HB 2241.

Senator Ward noted the individuals who registered their position on the bill (Attachment B).

Senator Burges moved HB 2241 be returned with a DO PASS recommendation. The motion CARRIED with a roll call vote of 4-0-3 (Attachment 13).

HB 2531 – court-ordered evaluation services; payment – DO PASS

HB 2367 - AHCCCS; annual waiver submittals – DO PASS AMENDED

Marianne Yamnik, Health and Human Services Committee Analyst, explained HB 2367 and the 6-line Barto amendment dated 03/18/14 at 3:01 p.m. (Attachment F).

Christina Corieri, Goldwater Institute, testified in support of HB 2367.

Senator Yee moved HB 2367 be returned with a DO PASS recommendation.

Senator Yee moved the 6-line Barto amendment dated 03/18/14 at 3:01 p.m. (Attachment F) be ADOPTED. The motion CARRIED by voice vote.

Senator Yee moved HB 2367 be returned with an AS AMENDED, DO PASS recommendation. The motion CARRIED with a roll call vote of 3-2-2 (Attachment 19).
