HOUSE BILL 2633

AN ACT

AMENDING SECTION 33-1125, ARIZONA REVISED STATUTES; RELATING TO PERSONAL
PROPERTY EXEMPTIONS.

1 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Arizona:

2 Section 1. Section 33-1125, Arizona Revised Statutes, is amended to
3 read:

4 33-1125. Personal items

5 The following property of a debtor used primarily for personal, family
6 or household purposes shall be exempt from process:

7 1. All wearing apparel not in excess of a fair market value of five
8 hundred dollars.

9 2. All musical instruments provided for the debtor's individual or
10 family use not in excess of an aggregate fair market value of four hundred
11 dollars.

12 3. Domestic pets, horses, milk cows and poultry not in excess of an
13 aggregate fair market value of eight hundred dollars.

14 4. All engagement and wedding rings not in excess of an aggregate fair
15 market value of two thousand dollars.

16 5. The library of a debtor, including books, manuals, published
17 materials and personal documents not in excess of an aggregate fair market
18 value of two hundred fifty dollars.

19 6. One watch not in excess of a fair market value of one hundred fifty
20 dollars.

21 7. One typewriter, one computer, one bicycle, one sewing machine, a
22 family bible, a lot in any burial ground, one shotgun or one rifle or one
23 pistol, not in excess of an aggregate fair market value of one thousand
24 dollars.

25 8. Equity in one motor vehicle not in excess of six thousand
26 dollars. If the debtor or debtor's dependent is physically disabled AND THE
27 MOTOR VEHICLE IS NECESSARY TO ACCOMMODATE THE DISABILITY, the equity in the
28 motor vehicle shall not exceed twelve thousand dollars. THE USE OR OWNERSHIP
29 OF A LICENSE PLATE OR REMOVABLE WINDSHIELD PLACARD BEARING THE INTERNATIONAL
30 SYMBOL OF ACCESS DOES NOT PRESUMPTIVELY DEMONSTRATE THAT THE PERSON IS
31 PHYSICALLY DISABLED.

32 9. Professionally prescribed prostheses for the debtor or a dependent
33 of the debtor, including a wheelchair.
