AN ACT

AMENDING SECTIONS 10-11622, 33-1242, 33-1256, 33-1803 AND 33-1807, ARIZONA
REVISED STATUTES; RELATING TO CONDOMINIUMS AND PLANNED COMMUNITIES.

1 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Arizona:

2 Section 1. Section 10-11622, Arizona Revised Statutes, is amended to
3 read:

4 10-11622. Annual report

5 A. Each domestic corporation and each foreign corporation authorized
6 to conduct affairs in this state shall deliver to the commission for filing
7 an annual report that sets forth all of the following:

8 1. The name of the corporation and the state or country under whose
9 law it is incorporated.

10 2. The address of its known place of business and the name and address
11 of its agent in this state.

12 3. The address of its principal office.

13 4. The names and business addresses of its directors and principal
14 officers.

15 5. A brief description of the nature of its activities.

16 6. Whether or not it has members.

17 7. A certificate of disclosure containing the information set forth in
18 section 10-3202, subsection D.

19 8. A statement that all corporate income tax returns required by title
20 43 have been filed with the department of revenue.

21 B. A UNIT OWNERS' ASSOCIATION THAT IS SUBJECT TO TITLE 33, CHAPTER 9
22 OR A PLANNED COMMUNITY ASSOCIATION THAT IS SUBJECT TO TITLE 33, CHAPTER 16
23 SHALL ATTACH TO AND SUBMIT WITH THE ANNUAL REPORT A SEPARATE STATEMENT
24 CONTAINING THE NAME OF THE DESIGNATED AGENT OR MANAGEMENT COMPANY FOR THE
25 ASSOCIATION, THE ADDRESS FOR THE ASSOCIATION AND THE TELEPHONE NUMBER, E-MAIL
26 ADDRESS AND WEBSITE IF ANY AND FAX NUMBER IF ANY OF THE ASSOCIATION OR ITS
27 DESIGNATED AGENT OR MANAGEMENT COMPANY. UNIT OWNERS' ASSOCIATIONS AND
28 PLANNED COMMUNITY ASSOCIATIONS SHALL FILE AN AMENDED STATEMENT REFLECTING
29 CHANGES IN DESIGNATED AGENT OR MANAGEMENT COMPANY WITHIN THIRTY DAYS OF ANY
30 CHANGE.

31 ~~B.~~ C. The information in the annual report AND THE SEPARATE STATEMENT
32 THAT IS PRESCRIBED BY SUBSECTION B OF THIS SECTION shall be current as of the
33 date the annual report ~~is~~ AND SEPARATE STATEMENT ARE executed on behalf of
34 the corporation.

35 ~~C.~~ D. The annual report for all corporations shall be delivered to
36 the commission for filing, and the annual fee shall be paid on or before the
37 date assigned by the commission. The commission may stagger the annual
38 report filing date for all corporations and adjust the annual fee on a pro
39 rata basis. The corporation shall deliver the annual report to the
40 commission for filing each subsequent year in the anniversary month on the
41 date assigned by the commission. If a corporation is unable to file the
42 annual report required by this section on or before the date prescribed by
43 this section, the corporation may file, but only on or before this date, a
44 written request with the commission for an extension of time, not to exceed
45 six months, in which to file the annual report. The request for an extension

1 of time shall be accompanied by the annual registration fee required by
2 law. After filing the request for an extension of time and on receipt of the
3 annual registration fee, the commission shall grant the request.

4 ~~D.~~ E. If an annual report does not contain the information requested
5 by this section, the commission shall promptly notify the reporting domestic
6 or foreign corporation in writing and shall return the report to it for
7 correction. If the report is corrected to contain the information required
8 by this section and delivered to the commission within thirty days after the
9 effective date of notice, it is deemed to be timely filed.

10 ~~E.~~ F. Any corporation that is exempt from the requirement of filing
11 an annual report shall deliver annually a certificate of disclosure
12 ~~containing~~ THAT CONTAINS the information set forth in section 10-3202,
13 subsection D, ~~AND THAT IS~~ executed by any two executive officers or
14 directors of the corporation on or before May 31. If the certificate is not
15 delivered within ninety days after the due date of the annual report or
16 within ninety days after May 31 in the case of any corporation that is exempt
17 from the requirement of filing an annual report, the commission shall
18 initiate administrative dissolution of that corporation or revoke the
19 application for authority of that corporation ~~in accordance with~~ PURSUANT TO
20 chapters 24 through 40 of this title.

21 Sec. 2. Section 33-1242, Arizona Revised Statutes, is amended to read:

22 33-1242. Powers of unit owners' association; notice to unit
23 owner of violation

24 A. Subject to the provisions of the declaration, the association may:

25 1. Adopt and amend bylaws and rules.

26 2. Adopt and amend budgets for revenues, expenditures and reserves and
27 collect assessments for common expenses from unit owners.

28 3. Hire and discharge managing agents and other employees, agents and
29 independent contractors.

30 4. Institute, defend or intervene in litigation or administrative
31 proceedings in its own name on behalf of itself or two or more unit owners on
32 matters affecting the condominium.

33 5. Make contracts and incur liabilities.

34 6. Regulate the use, maintenance, repair, replacement and modification
35 of common elements.

36 7. Cause additional improvements to be made as a part of the common
37 elements.

38 8. Acquire, hold, encumber and convey in its own name any right, title
39 or interest to real or personal property, except that common elements may be
40 conveyed or subjected to a security interest only pursuant to section
41 33-1252.

42 9. Grant easements, leases, licenses and concessions through or over
43 the common elements.

44 10. Impose and receive any payments, fees or charges for the use,
45 rental or operation of the common elements other than limited common elements

1 described in section 33-1212, paragraphs 2 and 4 and for services provided to
2 unit owners.

3 11. Impose charges for late payment of assessments and, after notice
4 and an opportunity to be heard, impose reasonable monetary penalties upon
5 unit owners for violations of the declaration, bylaws and rules of the
6 association.

7 12. Impose reasonable charges for the preparation and recordation of
8 amendments to the declaration or statements of unpaid assessments.

9 13. Provide for the indemnification of its officers and executive board
10 of directors and maintain directors' and officers' liability insurance.

11 14. Assign its right to future income, including the right to receive
12 common expense assessments, but only to the extent the declaration expressly
13 provides.

14 15. Be a member of a master association or other entity owning,
15 maintaining or governing in any respect any portion of the common elements or
16 other property benefitting or related to the condominium or the unit owners
17 in any respect.

18 16. Exercise any other powers conferred by the declaration or bylaws.

19 17. Exercise all other powers that may be exercised in this state by
20 legal entities of the same type as the association.

21 18. Exercise any other powers necessary and proper for the governance
22 and operation of the association.

23 B. A unit owner who receives a written notice that the condition of
24 the property owned by the unit owner is in violation of a requirement of the
25 condominium documents without regard to whether a monetary penalty is imposed
26 by the notice may provide the association with a written response by sending
27 the response by certified mail within ten business days after the date of the
28 notice. The response shall be sent to the address ~~contained in the notice or~~
29 **IDENTIFIED** in the **NOTICE**. ~~recorded notice prescribed by section 33-1256,~~
30 ~~subsection J.~~

31 C. Within ten business days after receipt of the certified mail
32 containing the response from the unit owner, the association shall respond to
33 the unit owner with a written explanation regarding the notice that shall
34 provide at least the following information unless previously provided in the
35 notice of violation:

36 1. The provision of the condominium documents that has allegedly been
37 violated.

38 2. The date of the violation or the date the violation was observed.

39 3. The first and last name of the person or persons who observed the
40 violation.

41 4. The process the unit owner must follow to contest the notice.

42 D. Unless the information required in subsection C, paragraph 4 of
43 this section is provided in the notice of violation, the association shall
44 not proceed with any action to enforce the condominium documents, including
45 the collection of attorney fees, before or during the time prescribed by

1 subsection C of this section regarding the exchange of information between
2 the association and the unit owner. At any time before or after completion
3 of the exchange of information pursuant to this section, the unit owner may
4 petition for a hearing pursuant to section 41-2198.01 if the dispute is
5 within the jurisdiction of the department of fire, building and life safety
6 as prescribed in section 41-2198.01, subsection B.

7 Sec. 3. Section 33-1256, Arizona Revised Statutes, is amended to read:
8 33-1256. Lien for assessments; priority; mechanics' and
9 materialmen's liens; applicability

10 A. The association has a lien on a unit for any assessment levied
11 against that unit from the time the assessment becomes due. The
12 association's lien for assessments, for charges for late payment of those
13 assessments, for reasonable collection fees and for reasonable attorney fees
14 and costs incurred with respect to those assessments may be foreclosed in the
15 same manner as a mortgage on real estate but may be foreclosed only if the
16 owner has been delinquent in the payment of monies secured by the lien,
17 excluding reasonable collection fees, reasonable attorney fees and charges
18 for late payment of and costs incurred with respect to those assessments, for
19 a period of one year or in the amount of one thousand two hundred dollars or
20 more, whichever occurs first. Fees, charges, late charges, monetary
21 penalties and interest charged pursuant to section 33-1242, subsection A,
22 paragraphs 10, 11 and 12, other than charges for late payment of assessments,
23 are not enforceable as assessments under this section. If an assessment is
24 payable in installments, the full amount of the assessment is a lien from the
25 time the first installment of the assessment becomes due. The association
26 has a lien for fees, charges, late charges, other than charges for late
27 payment of assessments, monetary penalties or interest charged pursuant to
28 section 33-1242, subsection A, paragraphs 10, 11 and 12 after the entry of a
29 judgment in a civil suit for those fees, charges, late charges, monetary
30 penalties or interest from a court of competent jurisdiction and the
31 recording of that judgment in the office of the county recorder as otherwise
32 provided by law. The association's lien for monies other than for
33 assessments, for charges for late payment of those assessments, for
34 reasonable collection fees and for reasonable attorney fees and costs
35 incurred with respect to those assessments may not be foreclosed and is
36 effective only on conveyance of any interest in the real property.

37 B. A lien for assessments, for charges for late payment of those
38 assessments, for reasonable collection fees and for reasonable attorney fees
39 and costs incurred with respect to those assessments under this section is
40 prior to all other liens, interests and encumbrances on a unit except:

41 1. Liens and encumbrances recorded before the recordation of the
42 declaration.

43 2. A recorded first mortgage on the unit, a seller's interest in a
44 first contract for sale pursuant to chapter 6, article 3 of this title on the

1 unit recorded prior to the lien arising pursuant to subsection A of this
2 section or a recorded first deed of trust on the unit.

3 3. Liens for real estate taxes and other governmental assessments or
4 charges against the unit.

5 C. Subsection B of this section does not affect the priority of
6 mechanics' or materialmen's liens or the priority of liens for other
7 assessments made by the association. The lien under this section is not
8 subject to chapter 8 of this title.

9 D. Unless the declaration otherwise provides, if two or more
10 associations have liens for assessments created at any time on the same real
11 estate, those liens have equal priority.

12 E. Recording of the declaration constitutes record notice and
13 perfection of the lien for assessments, for charges for late payment of those
14 assessments, for reasonable collection fees and for reasonable attorney fees
15 and costs incurred with respect to those assessments. Further recordation of
16 any claim of lien for assessments under this section is not required.

17 F. A lien for unpaid assessments is extinguished unless proceedings to
18 enforce the lien are instituted within three years after the full amount of
19 the assessments becomes due.

20 G. This section does not prohibit actions to recover sums for which
21 subsection A of this section creates a lien or does not prohibit an
22 association from taking a deed in lieu of foreclosure.

23 H. A judgment or decree in any action brought under this section shall
24 include costs and reasonable attorney fees for the prevailing party.

25 I. The association on written request shall furnish to a lienholder,
26 escrow agent, unit owner or person designated by a unit owner a statement
27 setting forth the amount of unpaid assessments against the unit. The
28 statement shall be furnished within ten days after receipt of the request and
29 the statement is binding on the association, the board of directors and every
30 unit owner if the statement is requested by an escrow agency that is licensed
31 pursuant to title 6, chapter 7. Failure to provide the statement to the
32 escrow agent within the time provided for in this subsection shall extinguish
33 any lien for any unpaid assessment then due.

34 ~~J. The association shall record in the office of the county recorder
35 in the county in which the condominium is located a notice stating the name
36 of the association or designated agent or management company for the
37 association, the address for the association and the telephone number of the
38 association or its designated agent or management company. The notice shall
39 include the name of the condominium community, the date of the recording and
40 the recorded instrument number or book and page for the main document that
41 constitutes the declaration. If an association's address, designated agent
42 or management company changes, the association shall amend its notice or
43 record a new notice within ninety days after the change.~~

44 ~~K.~~ J. Notwithstanding any provision in the condominium documents or
45 in any contract between the association and a management company, unless the

1 member directs otherwise, all payments received on a member's account shall
2 be applied first to any unpaid assessments, for unpaid charges for late
3 payment of those assessments, for reasonable collection fees and for unpaid
4 attorney fees and costs incurred with respect to those assessments, in that
5 order, with any remaining amounts applied next to other unpaid fees, charges
6 and monetary penalties or interest and late charges on any of those amounts.

7 ~~L.~~ K. This section does not apply to timeshare plans or associations
8 that are subject to chapter 20 of this title.

9 Sec. 4. Section 33-1803, Arizona Revised Statutes, is amended to read:

10 33-1803. Penalties; notice to member of violation

11 A. Unless limitations in the community documents would result in a
12 lower limit for the assessment, the association shall not impose a regular
13 assessment that is more than twenty ~~per-cent~~ PERCENT greater than the
14 immediately preceding fiscal year's assessment without the approval of the
15 majority of the members of the association. Unless reserved to the members
16 of the association, the board of directors may impose reasonable charges for
17 the late payment of assessments. A payment by a member is deemed late if it
18 is unpaid fifteen or more days after its due date, unless the community
19 documents provide for a longer period. Charges for the late payment of
20 assessments are limited to the greater of fifteen dollars or ten ~~per-cent~~
21 PERCENT of the amount of the unpaid assessment. Any monies paid by the
22 member for an unpaid assessment shall be applied first to the principal
23 amount unpaid and then to the interest accrued.

24 B. After notice and an opportunity to be heard, the board of directors
25 may impose reasonable monetary penalties on members for violations of the
26 declaration, bylaws and rules of the association. Notwithstanding any
27 provision in the community documents, the board of directors shall not impose
28 a charge for a late payment of a penalty that exceeds the greater of fifteen
29 dollars or ten ~~per-cent~~ PERCENT of the amount of the unpaid penalty. A
30 payment is deemed late if it is unpaid fifteen or more days after its due
31 date, unless the declaration, bylaws or rules of the association provide for
32 a longer period. Any monies paid by a member for an unpaid penalty shall be
33 applied first to the principal amount unpaid and then to the interest
34 accrued. Notice pursuant to this subsection shall include information
35 pertaining to the manner in which the penalty shall be enforced.

36 C. A member who receives a written notice that the condition of the
37 property owned by the member is in violation of the community documents
38 without regard to whether a monetary penalty is imposed by the notice may
39 provide the association with a written response by sending the response by
40 certified mail within ten business days after the date of the notice. The
