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House Health Committee Welcomes University Medical Community to Discuss Autoimmune Misdiagnoses in Children

STATE CAPITOL, PHOENIX – The House Health Committee today welcomed leaders from Banner-University Medicine and University of Arizona to update lawmakers and the public on the Children's Postinfectious Autoimmune Encephalopathy (CPAE) Center of Excellence.

"We are honored to work with CPAE to ensure their fantastic work continues to provide the research, diagnosis, and treatment options to educate practitioners on early identification signs of autoimmune disorders," said House Health Committee Chairwoman Heather Carter (R-15).

A first-of-its-kind center, the CPAE, in partnership with UA-Banner Health, was established with support from the Arizona Legislature, Arizona Department of Health and Human Services (ADHS), and the PACE Foundation with a primary goal to "treat and conduct research into a family of acute-onset neuropsychiatric disorders that historically have been misdiagnosed or undiagnosed in children."

Speakers today included UA-Banner pediatric immunologist Michael Daines MD, Banner Executive VP-University Medicine Kathy Bollinger, UA College of Medicine -Tucson Dean Charles Cairns MD, and PACE Foundation founder Paul Ryan.

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
