## House Appropriations Committee Passes Representative Heather Carter's College Readiness Assessment Bill

**STATE CAPITOL, PHOENIX** – The House Appropriations Committee yesterday passed <u>HB</u> <u>2210</u>, a bill sponsored by Representative Heather Carter (R-15) that will provide for a nationally-recognized college readiness assessment to be provided, free of charge, to Arizona high school juniors in a pilot program.

"This is an important opportunity for Arizona to increase the college enrollment rate in Arizona," said Representative Carter. "Administering college readiness assessments to all juniors will increase postsecondary awareness and access for our students."

Research shows that increased post-secondary degree attainment contributes to greater statewide economic gains, decreased reliance on government services, and reduced crime rates. HB 2210 addresses over-testing concerns and allows for students to opt-out of the pilot program.

"This can be a game-changer and open doors to postsecondary education pathways that many students do not know exist," said Representative Carter.
