House Speaker-elect Mesnard and Senate Presidentelect Yarbrough Submit Amicus Brief Urging Status Quo Until Prop. 206 Ruling

STATE CAPITOL, PHOENIX – House Speaker-elect J.D. Mesnard and Senate President-elect Steve Yarbrough, along with the Office of Strategic Planning & Budgeting, today submitted an amicus curiae brief urging the Arizona Supreme Court to stay the implementation of Prop. 206 until the Court can rule on its constitutionality.

"Arizona voters approved a constitutional amendment in 2004 requiring that future initiatives with a budgetary impact include a dedicated funding source, and both lawmakers and voters deserve clarity on how Prop. 206 can be constitutional without one," said Mesnard. "In the meantime, given that the immediate impact to the general fund will cost the taxpayers millions of dollars, maintaining the status quo until the Court can make a ruling will minimize Prop. 206's disruption on the state budget process and the economy."

Speaker-elect Mesnard and President-elect Yarbrough submitted the brief in their capacity as incoming leaders of the State Legislature.
