HB 2032 (Chapter 120): workers' compensation; assigned risk plan

Specifies factors that exclude an employer from being placed in the assigned risk plan, including if the employer: 1) knowingly fails to meet reasonable health and safety or audit or loss prevention requirements; or 2) knowingly fails to comply with the assigned risk plan's application procedures or makes a material misrepresentation on the application.

HB 2054 (Chapter 222): DIFI; financial enterprises; insurance; compact

Makes various revisions to statutes relating to the Department of Insurance and Financial Institutions licensure requirements and Director responsibilities. Includes filing requirements for insurers relating to fire loss and wildfire risk. Creates the Fire Insurance Review Task Force.

HB 2068 (Chapter 191): NOW: assistance animals; landlord tenant

Specifies a landlord is not liable for injuries or damages caused by an assistance or service animal that is allowed a reasonable accommodation or modification on the landlord's property.

HB 2076 (Chapter 121): life insurance; illustrations

Establishes statutory requirements relating to life insurance illustrations.

HB 2110 (Chapter 41 E): development; adaptive reuse; rezoning; prohibition

An emergency measure that revises municipal requirements in establishing objective standards for multifamily residential development or adaptive reuse of existing commercial, office and mixed use buildings.

HB 2116 (Chapter 24): small estate; affidavit; limits

Increases the monetary cap on the decedent's personal and real property that can be recovered by an affidavit to \$200,000 and to \$300,000, respectively.

HB 2168 (Chapter 164 E): long-term RVs; cooling; prohibition

An emergency measure that precludes a recreational vehicle park landlord from prohibiting a tenant from installing reasonably necessary commercial cooling methods on the tenant's recreational vehicle.

HB 2175 (Chapter 165): NOW: prior authorization; claims

Requires a medical director, prior to the denial of a claim or the issuance of a direct denial of a prior authorization that involves a medical necessity, to individually review the denial.

HB 2193 (Chapter 145): captive insurers; certificate of dormancy

Provides requirements for a captive insurer in applying for a certificate of dormancy.

HB 2195 (Chapter 198): digital advertising; content; children; penalty

Requires a child-directed application to take appropriate measures to prevent the display of inappropriate and mature advertisements on the application.

HB 2200 (Chapter 44): professional registration; reciprocity; endorsement

Outlines the qualifications for registration with the Arizona Board of Technical Registration as a professional engineer, architect, land surveyor or landscape architect in Arizona through reciprocity or endorsement.

HB 2322 (Chapter 46): condominiums; commercial structures; residential structures

Provides requirements for the allocation of common expenses for condominiums that include commercial structures that are separate from residential structures.

HB 2342 (Chapter 81): NOW: blockchain technology; regulation; computational power

Preempts a local government from regulating the act of lawfully accessing or using computational power in a residence.

HB 2345 (Chapter 28): loan agreements; escrow

Prescribes exceptions to an escrow agent's authorization to only use monies in an escrow account to make a onetime payment or multiple payments pursuant to a loan agreement.

HB 2370 (Chapter 215): entrance fee; refunds; time frame

Requires a facility that provides life care services to assign a vacated unit a sequential refund number for providing entrance fees refunds.

HB 2387 (Chapter 171): cryptocurrency kiosk; license; fraud prevention

Prescribes requirements for operating a cryptocurrency kiosk.

HB 2447 (Chapter 31): self-certification program; administrative review

Requires a municipality to authorize administrative personnel to review and approve certain development documents.

HB 2626 (Chapter 126): manufactured housing; certification; compliance

Removes the requirement for the Arizona Department of Housing to issue a certificate to indicate compliance with statutory installation requirements.

HB 2704 (Chapter 251): tax; distribution; county stadium district

Creates a funding mechanism for reconstructing, equipping, repairing, maintaining or improving the Major League Baseball facility owned and operated by the County Stadium District.

HB 2741 (Chapter 91): liquor sampling; reporting; requirements.

Prohibits the Arizona Department of Liquor Licenses and Control from requiring a beer and wine store or liquor store licensee that has sampling privileges to use a

singular, department-maintained system for maintaining required records and reports.

HB 2749 (Chapter 150): unclaimed property; virtual currency; security

Presumes any unclaimed digital asset as abandoned after a three-year period. Establishes the Bitcoin and Digital Assets Reserve Fund consisting of any airdrops, staking rewards or interest earned on unclaimed digital assets and allows the State Treasurer to transfer up to 10% of the digital asset to the state General Fund.

HB 2787 (Chapter 212): ground ambulances; registration

Provides criteria for extending the validity of an ambulance's certificate of registration.

HB 2905 (Chapter 36): craft producer; festival; fair; license

Combines a farm winery, craft distillery and microbrewery festival and fair licenses into a craft producer festival and fair license and establishes requirements for licensure.

SB 1159 (Chapter 38): employment practices; wage claims

Increases the monetary threshold of unpaid wages for which an employee may file a claim with the Industrial Commission of Arizona for such wages from \$5,000 to \$12,000.

SB 1182 (Chapter 181 E): NOW: municipalities; counties; construction hours

An emergency measure that precludes a local government from enacting or enforcing any noise ordinance or rule that prohibits construction activities during specified times of certain months.

SB 1206 (Chapter 63): NOW: banks; special deposits; requirements

Adopts the Uniform Laws Commission's (ULC) Uniform Special Deposits Act which allows a beneficiary to receive payments from a special deposit after the occurrence of an event.

SB 1353 (Chapter 187): municipal development; permits; review

Authorizes third party reviews of single-family residential building permit applications and modifies municipal licensing time frame requirements.

SB 1467 (Chapter 107): liquor; consumption; watercraft

Modifies certain restrictions, under a government series liquor license, to operate a dock and boats as licensed premises for the sale and consumption of spirituous liquor.

SB 1494 (Chapter 71): common expense liens; foreclosure; amount

Increases the time-period and monetary threshold relating to home foreclosure for assessment delinquency.

SB 1540 (Chapter 111): NOW: homestead; personal property; exemptions

Exempts a person's value in a homestead from bankruptcy proceedings, up to the amount of the homestead exemption plus any value increase during pendency of the case. Adds, to the property types that qualify for the \$400,000 homestead exemption, park model trailers, motor homes, travel trailers, fifth wheel trailers, houseboats, manufactured homes and other forms of shelter in which a person resides, including the land on which the shelter is located.

SB 1551 (Chapter 73): workers' compensation; disability; definitions

Revises the schedule of fees for workers' compensation to include fees to be charged by providers of health care, dental care and supplies for injured employees. Increases, from \$25 to \$100, the monthly dependent allowance provided to an employee in addition to compensation for a temporary total disability.

HB 2324 (Vetoed): NOW: forfeiture; digital assets; reserve fund

Provides for the forfeiture and seizure of a digital asset. Establishes the Bitcoin and Digital Assets Reserve Fund.

HB 2450 (Vetoed): unemployment insurance; benefit amounts

Modifies the duration of unemployment insurance (UI) benefits for which an individual may receive during a benefit year based on incremental changes in the unemployment rate (UR) in the prior calendar quarter.

HB 2906 (Vetoed): financial technology; digital assets program

Renames the Regulatory Sandbox Program to the Financial Technology, Digital Assets and Blockchain Sandbox Program and includes *digit assets* as an *innovation*.

SB 1024 (Vetoed): state agencies; payments; cryptocurrency

Authorizes a state agency to enter into an agreement with a cryptocurrency service provider to provide a method for accepting cryptocurrency as a payment method of, and to accept cryptocurrency as a method of payment for, certain amounts due to the state. Allows tax payments to be made in cryptocurrency if the Arizona Department of Revenue enters into an agreement with a cryptocurrency service provider to accept cryptocurrency as a payment method.

SB 1025 (Vetoed): public monies; investment; virtual currency

Allows the State Treasurer, the Arizona State Retirement System and the Public Safety Personnel Retirement System to invest up to 10% of the public monies under its control in virtual currency holdings.

SB 1087 (Vetoed): residential contractor assessments; recovery fund

Sets the amount that the Registrar of Contractors can charge for an initial or renewal biennial assessment and reduces such amount by 50% when the amount in the Residential Contractors' Recovery Fund exceeds \$15,000,000.

SB 1094 (Vetoed): business; discrimination prohibition; social criteria

Prohibits a financial institution, insurer or credit reporting agency from discriminating against any person based on a political affiliation or other social credit, environmental, social or governmental score or similar values-based or impact criteria.

SB 1095 (Vetoed): central bank digital currency; ban

Prohibits a federally recognized central bank digital currency from being the subject or medium of payment of any contract, security or other similar instrument in Arizona or used as *legal tender*.

SB 1296 (Vetoed): unemployment benefits; requirements; disqualifications; determinations

Modifies unemployment insurance (UI) benefits eligibility requirements. Prohibits the Department of Economic Security from paying benefits until the initial claim, or an ongoing claim on a weekly basis, is cross-checked for validity against specified data sets. Restates conditions for disqualification from UI benefits.

SB 1373 (Vetoed): digital assets strategic reserve fund

Establishes the Digital Assets Strategic Reserve Fund (Fund) consisting of monies appropriated by the Legislature and digital assets seized by the state. Prohibits the State Treasurer from investing more than 10% of the total amount of monies deposited in the Fund in any fiscal year. Allows the State Treasurer to loan digital assets from the Fund if the loan does not increase financial risk to the state.
