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HCM 2006		endangered species act; urging reform (<i>See: Resolutions & Memorials</i>)	144
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HB 2762 (Chapter 204): food products; labeling; cultivated cells

Requires the manufacturer, seller or retailer of a food product derived from cultivated cells to place a label on the food product's packing that states *cell-cultivated* or *cell-cultured*.

SB 1137 (Chapter 147): underground facilities; excavations; notification

Modifies requirements for excavators and underground facility operators relating to the location and marking of underground facilities. Defines *large project* and outlines the requirements of coordinating a large project. Details requirements of an interactive positive response system as it relates to the marking of underground facilities. Prescribes civil penalties for an underground facility operator and directs a one-call notification center to adopt written procedures for the purpose of implementing these requirements.

SB 1198 (Chapter 218): NOW: beef council; veterinary board; continuation

Continues the Arizona Beef Council and Arizona State Veterinary Medical Examining Board for eight years, until July 1, 2034.

SB 1683 (Chapter 240 W/O E): landownership; foreign adversary; prohibition

Expands prohibitions of land ownership by foreign adversary nations and their agents. Outlines transaction and data prohibitions against foreign adversary nations and agents and prescribes penalties for violations.

Vetoed Bills

HB 2013 (Vetoed): exceptional events; air quality; wildfires

Requires the Arizona Department of Environmental Quality to submit an exceptional event demonstration to the Environmental Protection Agency if a wildfire that is larger than 25,000 acres occurs on federally managed land and affects the state.

HB 2100 (Vetoed): small land subdivision; requirements

Allows a county board of supervisors to adopt regulations authorizing small land subdivisions if outlined requirements are met. Prescribes requirements for an applicant to propose a small land subdivision. Outlines reporting requirements of the Commissioner of the Arizona Department of Real Estate.

HB 2167 (Vetoed): attorney general; nuisance action; damages

Designates the Attorney General (AG) as liable for damages to any person injured in a public nuisance action or consumer fraud action the AG has filed. Details requirements of damages awarded.

HB 2787 (Vetoed): federal nullification; Mexican wolf; reintroduction

Prohibits the state, any state agency, political subdivision, actor or state employee from using resources to enforce, administer or cooperate with the Mexican Wolf Reintroduction Program pursuant to the Endangered Species Act of 1973. Specifies the prohibition does not apply to the Livestock Loss Program.

SB 1075 (Vetoed): NOW: foreign entities; land; review commission

Establishes the Foreign Entity Review Commission (Commission) within the Arizona Department of Real Estate. Prescribes Commission membership, term limits, meeting requirements and duties. Prohibits the conveyance, sale, lease or sublease of specified lands to hostile foreign entities without approval of the Commission.

SB 1280 (Vetoed): public monies; Mexican wolf; prohibition

Prohibits the Arizona Game and Fish Commission from transporting Mexican gray wolf puppies into state boundaries or spending public monies or resources for the transportation of Mexican gray wolf puppies into state boundaries.
