

# Interstate Compact for the Supervision of Adult Offenders

**PURPOSE:** To 1) provide the framework for the promotion of public safety and protect the rights of victims through the control and regulation of the interstate movement of offenders in the community; 2) provide for the effective tracking, supervision and rehabilitation of these offenders by the sending and receiving states; and 3) equitably distribute the costs, benefits and obligations of the compact among the compacting states.

Notes: Beginning in 2022 and every eight years thereafter, the Legislature shall review this State's participation in the Interstate Compact for Supervision of Adult Offenders in order to determine whether to remain a compacting State. If the Legislature determines that this State should withdraw from the compact, this State shall withdraw from the Compact pursuant to Section 31-467, Article XII.
