

Study Committee on Alternative Behavioral Health Transportation

PURPOSE: To research and make recommendations for the implementation and use of alternative behavioral health transportation providers for individuals involved in court-ordered evaluation or treatment as an alternative to transportation by peace officers including: (1) establishing criteria for the certification of behavioral health transportation providers, including the development of a training curriculum required to achieve the certification; (2) recommending the appropriate agency for providing the certification; (3) identifying barriers to the use of alternative behavioral health transportation, detailing the costs associated with the implementation of alternative transportation providers including cost savings and benefits; and (4) identifying means of improved integration of authorized transporters in the behavioral health system. The Committee shall submit a report regarding its findings and recommendations to the Governor, the President of the Senate, and the Speaker of the House of Representatives on or before December 31, 2023 and provide a copy of the report to the Secretary of State.
