AMENDING SECTIONS 41-3014.06, 49-1201, 49-1202, 49-1203, 49-1261, 49-1263, 49-1264, 49-1265 AND 49-1267, ARIZONA REVISED STATUTES; CHANGING THE DESIGNATION OF TITLE 49, CHAPTER 8, ARTICLE 2, ARIZONA REVISED STATUTES, TO "CLEAN WATER REVOLVING FUND, DRINKING WATER REVOLVING FUND AND HARDSHIP GRANT FUND FINANCIAL PROVISIONS"; AMENDING TITLE 49, CHAPTER 8, ARIZONA REVISED STATUTES. BY ADDING ARTICLE 3; RELATING TO THE WATER INFRASTRUCTURE FINANCE PROGRAM; PROVIDING FOR CONDITIONAL ENACTMENT.

The agreement shall be for a term of not more than three years and the maximum amount that may be borrowed is limited to not more than five hundred thousand dollars.

18 13. ONE MEMBER WHO IS APPOINTED BY THE GOVERNOR TO REPRESENT INDIAN 19 TRIBES.

20 Members OF THE BOARD AND THE COMMITTEE WHO ARE appointed by the B. C. 21 governor serve at the governor's pleasure and serve staggered five year 22 terms. Members of the board AND THE COMMITTEE are not eligible to receive 23 compensation for their services but are eligible for reimbursement for travel 24 and other expenses pursuant to title 38, chapter 4, article 2. Members of the 25 board AND THE COMMITTEE are public officers for purposes of title 38, and the 26 authority is a AND THE COMMITTEE ARE public body BODIES for purposes of title 27 38, chapter 3, article 3.1.

F. THE DEPARTMENT OF WATER RESOURCES SHALL PROVIDE TECHNICAL
 ASSISTANCE TO THE COMMITTEE AS REQUESTED BY THE COMMITTEE.

Sec. 4. Section 49-1203, Arizona Revised Statutes, is amended to read:

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49-1203. Powers and duties of authority; definition

A. The authority is a corporate and politic body and shall have an official seal that shall be judicially noticed. The authority may sue and be sued, contract and acquire, hold, operate and dispose of property.

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B. The authority, through its board, may:

1 1. Issue negotiable water quality bonds pursuant to section 49-1261 2 for the following purposes:

3 (a) To generate the state match required by the clean water act for 4 the clean water revolving fund and to generate the match required by the safe 5 drinking water act for the drinking water revolving fund.

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6 (b) To provide financial assistance to political subdivisions, Indian 7 tribes and eligible drinking water facilities for constructing, acquiring or improving wastewater treatment facilities, drinking water facilities, 8 9 nonpoint source projects and other related water quality facilities and 10 projects.

11 2. ISSUE WATER SUPPLY DEVELOPMENT BONDS FOR THE PURPOSE OF PROVIDING 12 FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE TO WATER PROVIDERS FOR WATER SUPPLY DEVELOPMENT PURPOSES 13 PURSUANT TO SECTIONS 49-1274 AND 49-1275.

2. 3. Provide financial assistance to political subdivisions and 14 15 Indian tribes from monies in the clean water revolving fund to finance 16 wastewater treatment projects.

17 3. 4. Provide financial assistance to drinking water facilities from 18 monies in the drinking water revolving fund to finance these facilities.

19 5. PROVIDE FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE TO WATER PROVIDERS FROM MONIES IN THE 20 WATER SUPPLY DEVELOPMENT REVOLVING FUND TO FINANCE WATER SUPPLY DEVELOPMENT.

21 4. 6. Guarantee debt obligations of, and provide linked deposit guarantees through third party lenders to: 22

(a) Political subdivisions that are issued to finance wastewater 23 24 treatment projects.

25 (b) Drinking water facilities that are issued to finance these 26 facilities.

27 (c) WATER PROVIDERS THAT ARE ISSUED TO FINANCE WATER SUPPLY 28 DEVELOPMENT PROJECTS.

29 5. 7. Provide linked deposit guarantees through third party lenders 30 to political subdivisions, and drinking water facilities AND WATER PROVIDERS.

31 6. 8. Apply for, accept and administer grants and other financial 32 assistance from the United States government and from other public and 33 private sources.

7. 9. Enter into capitalization grant agreements with the United 34 35 States environmental protection agency.

36 8. 10. Adopt rules pursuant to title 41, chapter 6 governing the 37 application for and awarding of wastewater treatment facility, drinking water facility and nonpoint source project financial assistance under this article 38 39 CHAPTER, the administration of the clean water revolving fund and the 40 drinking water revolving fund and the issuance of water quality bonds.

9. 11. Hire a director and staff for the authority.

42 10. 12. Contract for the services of outside advisors, attorneys, 43 consultants and aides reasonably necessary or desirable to allow the 44 authority to adequately perform its duties.

1 11. 13. Contract and incur obligations as reasonably necessary or 2 desirable within the general scope of authority activities and operations to 3 allow the authority to adequately perform its duties.

4 12. 14. Assess financial assistance origination fees and annual fees 5 to cover the reasonable costs of administering the authority and the monies 6 administered by the authority. Any fees collected pursuant to this paragraph 7 constitute governmental revenue and may be used for any purpose consistent 8 with the mission and objectives of the authority.

9 13. 15. Perform any function of a fund manager under the CERCLA 10 Brownfields cleanup revolving loan fund program as requested by the 11 department. The board shall perform any action authorized under this article 12 on behalf of the Brownfields cleanup revolving loan fund program established 13 pursuant to chapter 2, article 1.1 of this title at the request of the 14 department. In order to perform these functions, the board shall enter into 15 a written agreement with the department.

16 14. 16. Provide grants, staff assistance or technical assistance in 17 the form of loan repayment agreements and other professional assistance to 18 political subdivisions, any county with a population of less than five 19 hundred thousand persons, Indian tribes and community water systems in 20 connection with the development or financing of wastewater, drinking water, 21 water reclamation or related water infrastructure. Assistance provided under 22 a technical assistance loan repayment agreement shall be in a form and under 23 terms determined by the authority and shall be repaid not more than three 24 years after the date that the monies are advanced to the applicant. The 25 provision of technical assistance by the authority does not create any 26 liability for the authority or this state regarding the design, construction 27 or operation of any infrastructure project.

28 17. PROVIDE GRANTS, STAFF ASSISTANCE OR TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE IN THE 29 FORM OF LOAN REPAYMENT AGREEMENTS AND OTHER PROFESSIONAL ASSISTANCE TO WATER 30 PROVIDERS IN CONNECTION WITH THE PLANNING OR DESIGN OF WATER SUPPLY 31 DEVELOPMENT PROJECTS AS DETERMINED BY THE COMMITTEE PURSUANT TO SECTION 32 49-1274. A SINGLE GRANT SHALL NOT EXCEED ONE HUNDRED THOUSAND DOLLARS. 33 ASSISTANCE PROVIDED UNDER A TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE LOAN REPAYMENT AGREEMENT 34 SHALL BE IN A FORM AND UNDER TERMS DETERMINED BY THE COMMITTEE AND SHALL BE 35 REPAID NOT MORE THAN THREE YEARS AFTER THE DATE THAT THE MONIES ARE ADVANCED TO THE APPLICANT. THE PROVISION OF TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE BY THE AUTHORITY OR 36 37 THE COMMITTEE DOES NOT CREATE ANY LIABILITY FOR THE AUTHORITY, THE COMMITTEE 38 OR THIS STATE REGARDING THE DESIGN, CONSTRUCTION OR OPERATION OF ANY WATER 39 SUPPLY DEVELOPMENT PROJECT.

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C. THE AUTHORITY, IN CONSULTATION WITH THE COMMITTEE, MAY:

ADOPT RULES PURSUANT TO TITLE 41, CHAPTER 6 GOVERNING THE
APPLICATION FOR AND AWARDING OF WATER SUPPLY DEVELOPMENT FUND PROJECT
FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE UNDER THIS CHAPTER AND THE ADMINISTRATION OF THE WATER
SUPPLY DEVELOPMENT REVOLVING FUND.

452. APPOINT A TECHNICAL ADVISORY SUBCOMMITTEE OF NOT MORE THAN FIVE46PERSONS WITH EXPERTISE IN WATER RESOURCE PLANNING AND DEVELOPMENT TO ADVISE

3 C. D. The board shall deposit, pursuant to sections 35-146 and 4 35-147, any monies received pursuant to subsection B, paragraph 6-8 of this 5 section in the appropriate fund as prescribed by the grant or other financial 6 assistance agreement.

7 D. E. Disbursements of monies by the water infrastructure finance 8 authority pursuant to a financial assistance agreement are not subject to 9 title 41, chapter 23.

10 E. F. For THE purposes of the safe drinking water act, the department 11 of environmental quality is the state agency with primary responsibility for 12 administration of this state's public water system supervision program and, 13 in consultation with other appropriate state agencies, is the lead agency in 14 establishing assistance priorities as prescribed by section 49-1243, 15 subsection A, paragraph 6 and section 49-1244, subsection B, paragraph 3.

16 F. G. For THE purposes of this section, "CERCLA" has the same meaning 17 prescribed in section 49-201.

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Sec. 5. <u>Heading change</u>

19 The article heading of title 49, chapter 8, article 2, Arizona Revised 20 Statutes, is changed from "FINANCIAL PROVISIONS" to "CLEAN WATER REVOLVING 21 FUND, DRINKING WATER REVOLVING FUND AND HARDSHIP GRANT FUND FINANCIAL 22 PROVISIONS."

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Sec. 6. Section 49-1261, Arizona Revised Statutes, is amended to read: 49-1261. <u>Water quality bonds</u>

A. The authority, through the board of directors, may issue negotiable water quality bonds in a principal amount that in its opinion is necessary to provide sufficient monies for financial assistance under this chapter ARTICLE, maintaining sufficient reserves to secure the bonds, to pay the necessary costs of issuing, selling and redeeming the bonds and to pay other expenditures of the authority incidental to and necessary and convenient to carry out the purposes of this article.

32 B. The board must authorize the bonds by resolution. The resolution 33 shall prescribe:

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1. The rate or rates of interest and the denominations of the bonds.

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3. The coupon or registered form of the bonds.

4. The manner of executing the bonds.

2. The date or dates of the bonds and maturity.

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5. The medium and place of payment.

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6. The terms of redemption.

C. The bonds shall be sold at public or private sale at the price and on the terms determined by the board. All proceeds from the issuance of bonds shall be deposited in the appropriate accounts of the funds administered by the board.

D. The board shall publish a notice of its intention to issue bonds under this article for at least five consecutive days in a newspaper published in this state. The last day of publication must be at least ten days before issuing the bonds. The notice shall state the amount of the bonds to be sold and the intended date of issuance. A copy of the notice shall be hand delivered or sent, by certified mail, return receipt requested, to the director of the department of administration on or before the last day of publication.

7 E. To secure any bonds authorized by this section, the board by 8 resolution may:

9 1. Provide that bonds issued under this section may be secured by a 10 first lien on all or part of the monies paid into the appropriate account or 11 subaccount of the funds administered by the authority.

12 2. Pledge or assign to or in trust for the benefit of the holder or 13 holders of the bonds any part or appropriate account or subaccount of the 14 monies in the funds as is necessary to pay the principal and interest of the 15 bonds as they come due.

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3. Set aside, regulate and dispose of reserves and sinking funds.

4. Provide that sufficient amounts of the proceeds from the sale of
the bonds may be used to fully or partly fund any reserves or sinking funds
set up by the bond resolution.

5. Prescribe the procedure, if any, by which the terms of any contract with bondholders may be amended or abrogated, the amount of bonds the holders of which must consent to and the manner in which consent may be given.

6. Provide for payment from the proceeds of the sale of the bonds of all legal and financial expenses incurred by the board in issuing, selling, delivering and paying the bonds.

7. Do any other matters that in any way may affect the security andprotection of the bonds.

F. The members of the board or any person executing the bonds are not personally liable for the payment of the bonds. The bonds are valid and binding obligations notwithstanding that before the delivery of the bonds any of the persons whose signatures appear on the bonds cease to be members of the board. From and after the sale and delivery of the bonds, they are incontestable by the board.

34 G. The board, out of any available monies, may purchase bonds, which 35 may be canceled, at a price not exceeding either of the following:

If the bonds are then redeemable, the redemption price then
 applicable plus accrued interest to the next interest payment date.

38 2. If the bonds are not then redeemable, the redemption price
 39 applicable on the first date after purchase on which the bonds become subject
 40 to redemption plus accrued interest to that date.

41 42 Sec. 7. Section 49-1263, Arizona Revised Statutes, is amended to read: 49-1263. <u>Bond obligations of the authority</u>

Bonds issued under this chapter ARTICLE are obligations of the water infrastructure finance authority of Arizona, are payable only according to their terms and are not obligations general, special or otherwise of this state. The bonds do not constitute a legal debt of this state and are not 1 enforceable against this state. Payment of the bonds is not enforceable out 2 of any state monies other than the income and revenue pledged and assigned 3 to, or in trust for the benefit of, the holder or holders of the bonds.

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Sec. 8. Section 49-1264, Arizona Revised Statutes, is amended to read: 49-1264. <u>Certification of bonds by attorney general</u>

The board may submit any water quality bonds issued under this chapter 6 7 ARTICLE to the attorney general after all proceedings for their authorization 8 have been completed. On submission the attorney general shall examine and 9 pass on the validity of the bonds and the regularity of the proceedings. If the proceedings comply with this article, and if the attorney general 10 11 determines that, when delivered and paid for, the bonds will constitute 12 binding and legal obligations of the board, the attorney general shall 13 certify on the back of each bond, in substance, that it is issued according 14 to the constitution and laws of this state.
