SENATE AMENDMENTS TO H.B. 2162

(Reference to House engrossed bill)

1 Strike everything after the enacting clause and insert:

2 "Section 1. Arizona border security commission; membership;
3 duties; report; delayed repeal

4 A. The Arizona border security commission is established consisting of
5 the following members:

6 1. The governor, or the governor's designee, who serves as chairperson
7 of the commission.

8 2. The president of the senate or the president's designee.

9 3. The speaker of the house of representatives or the speaker's
10 designee.

11 4. Two members of the house of representatives who are appointed by
12 the speaker of the house of representatives.

13 5. Two members of the senate who are appointed by the president of the
14 senate.

15 6. The adjutant general or the adjutant general's designee.

16 7. The attorney general.

17 8. The director of the department of public safety or the director's
18 designee.

19 9. The director of the Arizona department of homeland security or the
20 director's designee.

21 10. The president of an association of county sheriffs or the
22 president's designee.

23 11. The president of an association of county attorneys or the
24 president's designee.

25 12. A representative from the United States customs and border
26 protection.

27 13. A representative from the federal bureau of investigation.

28 14. A representative of a chiefs' of police association.

1 15. A representative from the civil air patrol.

2 16. A representative from a city that is adjacent to the United States
3 and Mexico border who is appointed by the governor.

4 B. Commission members are not eligible to receive compensation but are
5 eligible for reimbursement of expenses pursuant to title 38, chapter 4,
6 article 2, Arizona Revised Statutes.

7 C. The commission shall meet monthly and shall:

8 1. Report on the status of the United States and Mexico border.

9 2. Analyze border crossing statistics.

10 3. Analyze related crime statistics. The commission shall measure
11 border security success by comparing the monthly number and severity of
12 illegal alien caused burglaries, home invasions and ranching infrastructure
13 or livestock losses. The commission shall devise and recommend a procedure
14 to disclose these statistics and the commission's analysis to residents of
15 counties in this state that are adjacent to the United States-Mexico border.

16 4. Make recommendations on methods and procedures to increase border
17 security.

18 5. Recommend the establishment of twelve forward operating bases along
19 the United States-Mexico border beginning east of an Indian reservation that
20 is adjacent to the United States-Mexico border and continuing to the Arizona-
21 New Mexico state line and urge the federal government and the state of New
22 Mexico to add additional forward operating bases along the United
23 States-Mexico border that is located in the state of New Mexico.

24 6. Recommend to the appropriate federal authority:

25 (a) The immediate deployment of operational units of the United States
26 military to the United States-Mexico border within this state to secure the
27 border and to provide for the safety of citizens of this state.

28 (b) The addition of at least three thousand border patrol agents on or
29 before December 31, 2011 to be deployed in this state.

30 (c) On or before December 31, 2010, expediting the deployment of new
31 generation digital radio technology to border patrol agents who are deployed
32 in this state and the state of New Mexico.

1 (d) A substantial increase in the border patrol recon 3, MSS/Radar and
2 FLIR mobile surveillance units and appropriate operational personnel along
3 the United States-Mexico border that is located in this state.

4 7. Urge the governor to deploy Arizona national guard units to the
5 United States-Mexico border that is located in this state.

6 D. The commission may use the services of legislative staff as
7 required.

8 E. Beginning October 1, 2010 and each month thereafter, the commission
9 shall submit a written report of its findings and recommendations to the
10 speaker of the house of representatives and the president of the senate. The
11 commission shall provide a copy of the report to the secretary of state.

12 F. This section is repealed from and after December 31, 2014.

13 Sec. 2. Appropriation; border security; use of GIITEM monies

14 A. Of the monies appropriated to the department of public safety for
15 the gang and immigration intelligence team enforcement mission in fiscal year
16 2010-2011, the sum of \$200,000 shall be distributed to the Cochise county
17 sheriff's office for border security, including the costs of equipment
18 related to a pilot program to dispatch a volunteer security force to the
19 United States-Mexico border.

20 B. The director of the department of public safety shall use monies
21 appropriated to the department of public safety for the gang and immigration
22 intelligence team enforcement mission for the purpose of directing department
23 of public safety officers to Cochise county for the purpose of securing the
24 United States-Mexico border or to establish a pilot program for this
25 purpose."
