# SENATE BILL 1201

AN ACT

AMENDING SECTIONS 28-101, 28-966, 28-2157 AND 28-3101, ARIZONA REVISED  
STATUTES; RELATING TO MOTOR VEHICLES.

(TEXT OF BILL BEGINS ON NEXT PAGE)

1 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Arizona:

2 Section 1. Section 28-101, Arizona Revised Statutes, is amended to  
3 read:

4 28-101. Definitions

5 In this title, unless the context otherwise requires:

6 1. "Alcohol" means any substance containing any form of alcohol,  
7 including ethanol, methanol, propynol and isopropynol.

8 2. "Alcohol concentration" if expressed as a percentage means either:

9 (a) The number of grams of alcohol per one hundred milliliters of  
10 blood.

11 (b) The number of grams of alcohol per two hundred ten liters of  
12 breath.

13 3. "All-terrain vehicle" means either of the following:

14 (a) A motor vehicle that satisfies all of the following:

15 (i) Is designed primarily for recreational nonhighway all-terrain  
16 travel.

17 (ii) Is fifty or fewer inches in width.

18 (iii) Has an unladen weight of one thousand two hundred pounds or  
19 less.

20 (iv) Travels on three or more nonhighway tires.

21 (v) Is operated on a public highway.

22 (b) A recreational off-highway vehicle that satisfies all of the  
23 following:

24 (i) Is designed primarily for recreational nonhighway all-terrain  
25 travel.

26 (ii) Is sixty-five or fewer inches in width.

27 (iii) Has an unladen weight of one thousand eight hundred pounds or  
28 less.

29 (iv) Travels on four or more nonhighway tires.

30 4. "Authorized emergency vehicle" means any of the following:

31 (a) A fire department vehicle.

32 (b) A police vehicle.

33 (c) An ambulance or emergency vehicle of a municipal department or  
34 public service corporation that is designated or authorized by the department  
35 or a local authority.

36 (d) Any other ambulance, fire truck or rescue vehicle that is  
37 authorized by the department in its sole discretion and that meets liability  
38 insurance requirements prescribed by the department.

39 **5. "AUTOCYCLE" MEANS A THREE-WHEELED MOTORCYCLE ON WHICH THE DRIVER**  
40 **AND PASSENGERS RIDE IN A COMPLETELY ENCLOSED SEATING AREA THAT IS EQUIPPED**  
41 **WITH A ROLL CAGE, SAFETY BELTS FOR EACH OCCUPANT AND ANTILOCK BRAKES AND THAT**  
42 **IS DESIGNED TO BE CONTROLLED WITH A STEERING WHEEL AND PEDALS.**

43 ~~5.~~ 6. "Aviation fuel" means all flammable liquids composed of a  
44 mixture of selected hydrocarbons expressly manufactured and blended for the

1 purpose of effectively and efficiently operating an internal combustion  
2 engine for use in an aircraft but does not include fuel for jet or turbine  
3 powered aircraft.

4 ~~6-~~ 7. "Bicycle" means a device, including a racing wheelchair, that  
5 is propelled by human power and on which a person may ride and that has  
6 either:

7 (a) Two tandem wheels, either of which is more than sixteen inches in  
8 diameter.

9 (b) Three wheels in contact with the ground, any of which is more than  
10 sixteen inches in diameter.

11 ~~7-~~ 8. "Board" means the transportation board.

12 ~~8-~~ 9. "Bus" means a motor vehicle designed for carrying sixteen or  
13 more passengers, including the driver.

14 ~~9-~~ 10. "Business district" means the territory contiguous to and  
15 including a highway if there are buildings in use for business or industrial  
16 purposes within any six hundred feet along the highway, including hotels,  
17 banks or office buildings, railroad stations and public buildings that occupy  
18 at least three hundred feet of frontage on one side or three hundred feet  
19 collectively on both sides of the highway.

20 ~~10-~~ 11. "Combination of vehicles" means a truck or truck tractor and  
21 semitrailer and any trailer that it tows but does not include a forklift  
22 designed for the purpose of loading or unloading the truck, trailer or  
23 semitrailer.

24 ~~11-~~ 12. "Controlled substance" means a substance so classified under  
25 section 102(6) of the controlled substances act (21 United States Code  
26 section 802(6)) and includes all substances listed in schedules I through V  
27 of 21 Code of Federal Regulations part 1308.

28 ~~12-~~ 13. "Conviction" means:

29 (a) An unvacated adjudication of guilt or a determination that a  
30 person violated or failed to comply with the law in a court of original  
31 jurisdiction or by an authorized administrative tribunal.

32 (b) An unvacated forfeiture of bail or collateral deposited to secure  
33 the person's appearance in court.

34 (c) A plea of guilty or no contest accepted by the court.

35 (d) The payment of a fine or court costs.

36 ~~13-~~ 14. "County highway" means a public road constructed and  
37 maintained by a county.

38 ~~14-~~ 15. "Dealer" means a person who is engaged in the business of  
39 buying, selling or exchanging motor vehicles, trailers or semitrailers and  
40 who has an established place of business.

41 ~~15-~~ 16. "Department" means the department of transportation acting  
42 directly or through its duly authorized officers and agents.

43 ~~16-~~ 17. "Director" means the director of the department of  
44 transportation.

1       ~~17.~~ 18. "Drive" means to operate or be in actual physical control of a  
2 motor vehicle.  
3       ~~18.~~ 19. "Driver" means a person who drives or is in actual physical  
4 control of a vehicle.  
5       ~~19.~~ 20. "Driver license" means a license that is issued by a state to  
6 an individual and that authorizes the individual to drive a motor vehicle.  
7       ~~20.~~ 21. "Electric personal assistive mobility device" means a  
8 self-balancing two nontandem wheeled device with an electric propulsion  
9 system that limits the maximum speed of the device to fifteen miles per hour  
10 or less and that is designed to transport only one person.  
11       ~~21.~~ 22. "Farm" means any lands primarily used for agriculture  
12 production.  
13       ~~22.~~ 23. "Farm tractor" means a motor vehicle designed and used  
14 primarily as a farm implement for drawing implements of husbandry.  
15       ~~23.~~ 24. "Foreign vehicle" means a motor vehicle, trailer or  
16 semitrailer that is brought into this state other than in the ordinary course  
17 of business by or through a manufacturer or dealer and that has not been  
18 registered in this state.  
19       ~~24.~~ 25. "Golf cart" means a motor vehicle that has not less than three  
20 wheels in contact with the ground, that has an unladen weight of less than  
21 one thousand eight hundred pounds, that is designed to be and is operated at  
22 not more than twenty-five miles per hour and that is designed to carry not  
23 more than four persons including the driver.  
24       ~~25.~~ 26. "Hazardous material" means a material, and its mixtures or  
25 solutions, that the United States department of transportation determines  
26 under 49 Code of Federal Regulations is, or any quantity of a material listed  
27 as a select agent or toxin under 42 Code of Federal Regulations part 73 that  
28 is, capable of posing an unreasonable risk to health, safety and property if  
29 transported in commerce and that is required to be placarded or marked as  
30 required by the department's safety rules prescribed pursuant to chapter 14  
31 of this title.  
32       ~~26.~~ 27. "Implement of husbandry" means a vehicle designed primarily  
33 for agricultural purposes and used exclusively in the conduct of agricultural  
34 operations, including an implement or vehicle whether self-propelled or  
35 otherwise that meets both of the following conditions:  
36       (a) Is used solely for agricultural purposes including the preparation  
37 or harvesting of cotton, alfalfa, grains and other farm crops.  
38       (b) Is only incidentally operated or moved on a highway whether as a  
39 trailer or self-propelled unit. For the purposes of this subdivision,  
40 "incidentally operated or moved on a highway" means travel between a farm and  
41 another part of the same farm, from one farm to another farm or between a  
42 farm and a place of repair, supply or storage.  
43       ~~27.~~ 28. "Limousine" means a motor vehicle providing prearranged ground  
44 transportation service for an individual passenger, or a group of passengers,

1 that is arranged in advance or is operated on a regular route or between  
2 specified points and includes ground transportation under a contract or  
3 agreement for services that includes a fixed rate or time and is provided in  
4 a motor vehicle with a seating capacity not exceeding fifteen passengers  
5 including the driver.

6 ~~28.~~ 29. "Livery vehicle" means a motor vehicle that:

7 (a) Has a seating capacity not exceeding fifteen passengers including  
8 the driver.

9 (b) Provides passenger services for a fare determined by a flat rate  
10 or flat hourly rate between geographic zones or within a geographic area.

11 (c) Is available for hire on an exclusive or shared ride basis.

12 (d) May do any of the following:

13 (i) Operate on a regular route or between specified places.

14 (ii) Offer prearranged ground transportation service as defined in  
15 section 28-141.

16 (iii) Offer on demand ground transportation service pursuant to a  
17 contract with a public airport, licensed business entity or organization.

18 ~~29.~~ 30. "Local authority" means any county, municipal or other local  
19 board or body exercising jurisdiction over highways under the constitution  
20 and laws of this state.

21 ~~30.~~ 31. "Manufacturer" means a person engaged in the business of  
22 manufacturing motor vehicles, trailers or semitrailers.

23 ~~31.~~ 32. "Moped" means a bicycle that is equipped with a helper motor  
24 if the vehicle has a maximum piston displacement of fifty cubic centimeters  
25 or less, a brake horsepower of one and one-half or less and a maximum speed  
26 of twenty-five miles per hour or less on a flat surface with less than a one  
27 per cent grade.

28 ~~32.~~ 33. "Motor driven cycle" means a motorcycle, including every motor  
29 scooter, with a motor that produces not more than five horsepower.

30 ~~33.~~ 34. "Motor vehicle":

31 (a) Means either:

32 (i) A self-propelled vehicle.

33 (ii) For the purposes of the laws relating to the imposition of a tax  
34 on motor vehicle fuel, a vehicle that is operated on the highways of this  
35 state and that is propelled by the use of motor vehicle fuel.

36 (b) Does not include a motorized wheelchair, an electric personal  
37 assistive mobility device or a motorized skateboard. For the purposes of  
38 this subdivision:

39 (i) "Motorized skateboard" means a self-propelled device that has a  
40 motor, a deck on which a person may ride and at least two tandem wheels in  
41 contact with the ground.

42 (ii) "Motorized wheelchair" means a self-propelled wheelchair that is  
43 used by a person for mobility.

1           ~~34.~~ 35. "Motor vehicle fuel" includes all products that are commonly  
2 or commercially known or sold as gasoline, including casinghead gasoline,  
3 natural gasoline and all flammable liquids, and that are composed of a  
4 mixture of selected hydrocarbons expressly manufactured and blended for the  
5 purpose of effectively and efficiently operating internal combustion engines.  
6 Motor vehicle fuel does not include inflammable liquids that are specifically  
7 manufactured for racing motor vehicles and that are distributed for and used  
8 by racing motor vehicles at a racetrack, use fuel as defined in section  
9 28-5601, aviation fuel, fuel for jet or turbine powered aircraft or the  
10 mixture created at the interface of two different substances being  
11 transported through a pipeline, commonly known as transmix.

12           ~~35.~~ 36. "Motorcycle" means a motor vehicle that has a seat or saddle  
13 for the use of the rider and that is designed to travel on not more than  
14 three wheels in contact with the ground but excluding a tractor and a moped.

15           37. "MOTORIZED QUADRICYCLE" MEANS A SELF-PROPELLED MOTOR VEHICLE TO  
16 WHICH ALL OF THE FOLLOWING APPLY:

17           (a) THE VEHICLE IS SELF-PROPELLED BY AN EMISSION-FREE ELECTRIC MOTOR  
18 AND MAY INCLUDE PEDALS OPERATED BY THE PASSENGERS.

19           (b) THE VEHICLE HAS AT LEAST FOUR WHEELS IN CONTACT WITH THE GROUND.

20           (c) THE VEHICLE SEATS AT LEAST EIGHT PASSENGERS, INCLUDING THE DRIVER.

21           (d) THE VEHICLE IS OPERABLE ON A FLAT SURFACE USING SOLELY THE  
22 ELECTRIC MOTOR WITHOUT ASSISTANCE FROM THE PEDALS OR PASSENGERS.

23           (e) THE VEHICLE IS A COMMERCIAL MOTOR VEHICLE AS DEFINED IN SECTION  
24 28-5201.

25           (f) THE VEHICLE SHALL BE LICENSED BY THE DEPARTMENT OF WEIGHTS AND  
26 MEASURES TO OPERATE AS A LIMOUSINE PURSUANT TO SECTION 41-2091.

27           (g) THE VEHICLE IS MANUFACTURED BY A MOTOR VEHICLE MANUFACTURER THAT  
28 IS LICENSED PURSUANT TO CHAPTER 10 OF THIS TITLE.

29           (h) THE VEHICLE COMPLIES WITH THE DEFINITION AND STANDARDS FOR LOW  
30 SPEED VEHICLES SET FORTH IN FEDERAL MOTOR VEHICLE SAFETY STANDARD 500 AND 49  
31 CODE OF FEDERAL REGULATIONS SECTION 571.3(b) AND 571.500, RESPECTIVELY.

32           ~~36.~~ 38. "Neighborhood electric vehicle" means a self-propelled  
33 electrically powered motor vehicle to which all of the following apply:

34           (a) The vehicle is emission free.

35           (b) The vehicle has at least four wheels in contact with the ground.

36           (c) The vehicle complies with the definition and standards for low  
37 speed vehicles set forth in federal motor vehicle safety standard 500 and 49  
38 Code of Federal Regulations sections 571.3(b) and 571.500, respectively.

39           ~~37.~~ 39. "Nonresident" means a person who is not a resident of this  
40 state as defined in section 28-2001.

41           ~~38.~~ 40. "Off-road recreational motor vehicle" means a motor vehicle  
42 that is designed primarily for recreational nonhighway all-terrain travel and  
43 that is not operated on a public highway. Off-road recreational motor

1 vehicle does not mean a motor vehicle used for construction, building trade,  
2 mining or agricultural purposes.

3 ~~39-~~ 41. "Operator" means a person who drives a motor vehicle on a  
4 highway, who is in actual physical control of a motor vehicle on a highway or  
5 who is exercising control over or steering a vehicle being towed by a motor  
6 vehicle.

7 ~~40-~~ 42. "Owner" means:

8 (a) A person who holds the legal title of a vehicle.

9 (b) If a vehicle is the subject of an agreement for the conditional  
10 sale or lease with the right of purchase on performance of the conditions  
11 stated in the agreement and with an immediate right of possession vested in  
12 the conditional vendee or lessee, the conditional vendee or lessee.

13 (c) If a mortgagor of a vehicle is entitled to possession of the  
14 vehicle, the mortgagor.

15 ~~41-~~ 43. "Pedestrian" means any person afoot. A person who uses an  
16 electric personal assistive mobility device or a manual or motorized  
17 wheelchair is considered a pedestrian unless the manual wheelchair qualifies  
18 as a bicycle. For the purposes of this paragraph, "motorized wheelchair"  
19 means a self-propelled wheelchair that is used by a person for mobility.

20 ~~42-~~ 44. "Power sweeper" means an implement, with or without motive  
21 power, that is only incidentally operated or moved on a street or highway and  
22 that is designed for the removal of debris, dirt, gravel, litter or sand  
23 whether by broom, vacuum or regenerative air system from asphaltic concrete  
24 or cement concrete surfaces, including parking lots, highways, streets and  
25 warehouses, and a vehicle on which the implement is permanently mounted.

26 ~~43-~~ 45. "Public transit" means the transportation of passengers on  
27 scheduled routes by means of a conveyance on an individual passenger  
28 fare-paying basis excluding transportation by a sight-seeing bus, school bus  
29 or taxi or a vehicle not operated on a scheduled route basis.

30 ~~44-~~ 46. "Reconstructed vehicle" means a vehicle that has been  
31 assembled or constructed largely by means of essential parts, new or used,  
32 derived from vehicles or makes of vehicles of various names, models and types  
33 or that, if originally otherwise constructed, has been materially altered by  
34 the removal of essential parts or by the addition or substitution of  
35 essential parts, new or used, derived from other vehicles or makes of  
36 vehicles. For the purposes of this paragraph, "essential parts" means  
37 integral and body parts, the removal, alteration or substitution of which  
38 will tend to conceal the identity or substantially alter the appearance of  
39 the vehicle.

40 ~~45-~~ 47. "Residence district" means the territory contiguous to and  
41 including a highway not comprising a business district if the property on the  
42 highway for a distance of three hundred feet or more is in the main improved  
43 with residences or residences and buildings in use for business.

1           ~~46.~~ 48. "Right-of-way" when used within the context of the regulation  
2 of the movement of traffic on a highway means the privilege of the immediate  
3 use of the highway. Right-of-way when used within the context of the real  
4 property on which transportation facilities and appurtenances to the  
5 facilities are constructed or maintained means the lands or interest in lands  
6 within the right-of-way boundaries.

7           ~~47.~~ 49. "School bus" means a motor vehicle that is designed for  
8 carrying more than ten passengers and that is either:

9           (a) Owned by any public or governmental agency or other institution  
10 and operated for the transportation of children to or from home or school on  
11 a regularly scheduled basis.

12           (b) Privately owned and operated for compensation for the  
13 transportation of children to or from home or school on a regularly scheduled  
14 basis.

15           ~~48.~~ 50. "Semitrailer" means a vehicle that is with or without motive  
16 power, other than a pole trailer, that is designed for carrying persons or  
17 property and for being drawn by a motor vehicle and that is constructed so  
18 that some part of its weight and that of its load rests on or is carried by  
19 another vehicle. For the purposes of this paragraph, "pole trailer" has the  
20 same meaning prescribed in section 28-601.

21           ~~49.~~ 51. "State" means a state of the United States and the District of  
22 Columbia.

23           ~~50.~~ 52. "State highway" means a state route or portion of a state  
24 route that is accepted and designated by the board as a state highway and  
25 that is maintained by the state.

26           ~~51.~~ 53. "State route" means a right-of-way whether actually used as a  
27 highway or not that is designated by the board as a location for the  
28 construction of a state highway.

29           ~~52.~~ 54. "Street" or "highway" means the entire width between the  
30 boundary lines of every way if a part of the way is open to the use of the  
31 public for purposes of vehicular travel.

32           ~~53.~~ 55. "Taxi" means a motor vehicle that has a seating capacity not  
33 exceeding fifteen passengers, including the driver, that is registered as a  
34 taxi in this state or any other state, that provides passenger services and  
35 that:

36           (a) Does not primarily operate on a regular route or between specified  
37 places.

38           (b) Offers local transportation for a fare determined on the basis of  
39 the distance traveled or prearranged ground transportation service as defined  
40 in section 28-141 for a predetermined fare.

41           ~~54.~~ 56. "Traffic survival school" means a school that offers  
42 educational sessions to drivers who are required to attend and successfully  
43 complete educational sessions pursuant to this title that are designed to



1 improve the safety and habits of drivers and that are approved by the  
2 department.

3 ~~55-~~ 57. "Trailer" means a vehicle that is with or without motive  
4 power, other than a pole trailer, that is designed for carrying persons or  
5 property and for being drawn by a motor vehicle and that is constructed so  
6 that no part of its weight rests on the towing vehicle. A semitrailer  
7 equipped with an auxiliary front axle commonly known as a dolly is deemed to  
8 be a trailer. For the purposes of this paragraph, "pole trailer" has the  
9 same meaning prescribed in section 28-601.

10 ~~56-~~ 58. "Truck" means a motor vehicle designed or used primarily for  
11 the carrying of property other than the effects of the driver or passengers  
12 and includes a motor vehicle to which has been added a box, a platform or  
13 other equipment for such carrying.

14 ~~57-~~ 59. "Truck tractor" means a motor vehicle that is designed and  
15 used primarily for drawing other vehicles and that is not constructed to  
16 carry a load other than a part of the weight of the vehicle and load drawn.

17 ~~58-~~ 60. "Vehicle" means a device in, on or by which a person or  
18 property is or may be transported or drawn on a public highway, excluding  
19 devices moved by human power or used exclusively on stationary rails or  
20 tracks.

21 ~~59-~~ 61. "Vehicle transporter" means either:

22 (a) A truck tractor capable of carrying a load and drawing a  
23 semitrailer.

24 (b) A truck tractor with a stinger-steered fifth wheel capable of  
25 carrying a load and drawing a semitrailer or a truck tractor with a dolly  
26 mounted fifth wheel that is securely fastened to the truck tractor at two or  
27 more points and that is capable of carrying a load and drawing a semitrailer.

28 Sec. 2. Section 28-966, Arizona Revised Statutes, is amended to read:

29 ~~28-966.~~ Neighborhood electric vehicles; motorized quadricycles;  
30 speed; restrictions

31 A. A neighborhood electric vehicle shall not be operated at a speed of  
32 more than twenty-five miles per hour. **A MOTORIZED QUADRICYCLE SHALL NOT BE**  
33 **OPERATED AT A SPEED OF MORE THAN FIFTEEN MILES PER HOUR.**

34 B. A neighborhood electric vehicle **AND A MOTORIZED QUADRICYCLE** shall  
35 not be driven on a highway that has a posted speed limit of more than  
36 thirty-five miles per hour. This subsection does not prohibit a neighborhood  
37 electric vehicle **OR A MOTORIZED QUADRICYCLE** from crossing a highway that has  
38 a posted speed limit of more than thirty-five miles per hour at an  
39 intersection.

40 C. A neighborhood electric vehicle **AND A MOTORIZED QUADRICYCLE** shall  
41 have a notice of the operational restrictions applying to the vehicle  
42 permanently attached to or painted on the vehicle in a location that is in  
43 clear view of the driver.

1           Sec. 3. Section 28-2157, Arizona Revised Statutes, is amended to read:  
2           28-2157. Application for registration

3           A. A person shall apply to the department for registration of a motor  
4 vehicle, trailer or semitrailer on forms prescribed or authorized by the  
5 department.

6           B. The application shall contain:

7           1. The name and complete residence address of the owner.

8           2. A description of the vehicle, including the serial number.

9           3. If it is a new vehicle, the date of sale by the manufacturer or  
10 dealer to the person first operating the vehicle.

11           4. If the owner of the vehicle rents or intends to rent the vehicle  
12 without a driver, a statement of that fact.

13           5. Other facts required by the department.

14           C. The registering officer shall indicate on the face of the  
15 registration application that the registrant may be subject to vehicle  
16 emissions testing requirements pursuant to section 49-542.

17           D. On request of an applicant, the department shall allow the  
18 applicant to provide on the registration of a motor vehicle, trailer or  
19 semitrailer a post office box address that is regularly used by the applicant  
20 and that is located in the county in which the applicant resides.

21           E. The person shall include with the application the required fees and  
22 the certificate of title to the vehicle for which registration is sought.  
23 The registering officer may waive the requirement that the applicant present  
24 a certificate of title at the time of making an application for renewal if  
25 the registering officer has available complete and sufficient records to  
26 accurately compute the vehicle license tax.

27           F. The department may request an applicant who appears in person to  
28 register a motor vehicle, trailer or semitrailer to ~~complete~~ satisfactorily  
29 COMPLETE the vision screening test prescribed by the department.

30           G. A person applying for initial registration of a neighborhood  
31 electric vehicle OR A MOTORIZED QUADRICYCLE shall certify in writing that a  
32 notice of the operational restrictions applying to the vehicle as provided in  
33 section 28-966 are contained on a permanent notice attached to or painted on  
34 the vehicle in a location that is in clear view of the driver.

35           Sec. 4. Section 28-3101, Arizona Revised Statutes, is amended to read:  
36           28-3101. Driver license classes

37           A. Except as provided in subsections B and C of this section and  
38 section 28-3102, the following driver license classes are valid:

39           1. Class A. A class A license is valid for operating either of the  
40 following:

41           (a) A motor vehicle that tows a vehicle with a gross vehicle weight  
42 rating of more than ten thousand pounds if the combined gross vehicle weight  
43 rating is twenty-six thousand one or more pounds.

44           (b) A vehicle that requires a class B, C or D license.

1           2. Class B. A class B license is valid for operating any of the  
2 following:

3           (a) A single motor vehicle with a gross vehicle weight rating of  
4 twenty-six thousand one or more pounds.

5           (b) A motor vehicle with a gross vehicle weight rating of twenty-six  
6 thousand one or more pounds that tows a vehicle with a gross vehicle weight  
7 rating of ten thousand pounds or less.

8           (c) A vehicle that requires a class C or D license for operation.

9           3. Class C. A class C license is valid for operating any of the  
10 following:

11           (a) A single motor vehicle with a gross vehicle weight rating of  
12 twenty-six thousand pounds or less.

13           (b) A motor vehicle with a gross vehicle weight rating of twenty-six  
14 thousand pounds or less that tows a vehicle with a gross vehicle weight  
15 rating of ten thousand pounds or less.

16           (c) A motor vehicle with a gross vehicle weight rating of twenty-six  
17 thousand pounds or less that tows a vehicle with a gross vehicle weight  
18 rating of more than ten thousand pounds, if the combined gross vehicle weight  
19 rating is less than twenty-six thousand one pounds.

20           (d) A vehicle that is required to be placarded for hazardous  
21 materials.

22           (e) A bus or school bus.

23           (f) A vehicle that requires a class D license for operation.

24           4. Class D. A class D license is valid for operating any of the  
25 following:

26           (a) A single motor vehicle with a gross vehicle weight rating of  
27 twenty-six thousand pounds or less.

28           (b) A motor vehicle with a gross vehicle weight rating of twenty-six  
29 thousand pounds or less that tows a vehicle with a gross vehicle weight  
30 rating of ten thousand pounds or less.

31           (c) A motor vehicle with a gross vehicle weight rating of twenty-six  
32 thousand pounds or less that tows a vehicle with a gross vehicle weight  
33 rating of more than ten thousand pounds if the combined gross vehicle weight  
34 rating is less than twenty-six thousand one pounds.

35           (d) A motorized touring vehicle. For the purposes of this  
36 subdivision, "motorized touring vehicle" means a motor vehicle that is all of  
37 the following:

38           (i) Owned by a commercial entity.

39           (ii) Rented for use during a sightseeing tour that is guided by an  
40 employee of the commercial entity that rents the motor vehicle.

41           (iii) Designed to travel with three wheels on the ground.

42           (iv) Capable of a maximum speed of forty-five miles per hour.

1           5. Class G. A class G license is valid for operating a single motor  
2 vehicle with a gross vehicle weight rating of twenty-six thousand pounds or  
3 less.

4           6. Class M. A class M license is valid for operating a motorcycle,  
5 motor driven cycle or moped **BUT IS NOT NECESSARY FOR OPERATING AN AUTOCYCLE**.  
6 For the purpose of licensing a driver, the department may endorse a class M  
7 license classification on a valid class A, B, C, D or G license.

8           B. A class A, B, C, D or G license is not valid for operating a  
9 vehicle that requires a class M license or a vehicle that requires a special  
10 endorsement unless the proper endorsement appears on the license.

11           C. A commercial driver license is not required to operate a vehicle  
12 described in subsection A, paragraph 1, 2 or 3 of this section if the vehicle  
13 has been issued a historic vehicle license plate pursuant to section 28-2484  
14 and the department provides in the vehicle registration record both of the  
15 following:

16           1. That the vehicle is classified as a noncommercial vehicle and may  
17 not be used as a commercial vehicle.

18           2. The vehicle's gross vehicle weight is entered as zero.
