# SENATE BILL 1525

AN ACT

AMENDING SECTIONS 15-391 AND 15-393, ARIZONA REVISED STATUTES; AMENDING TITLE 15, CHAPTER 3, ARTICLE 6, ARIZONA REVISED STATUTES, BY ADDING SECTION 15-393.01; RELATING TO JOINT TECHNICAL EDUCATION DISTRICTS.

1 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Arizona:

2 Section 1. Heading change

3 The article heading of title 15, chapter 3, article 6, Arizona Revised  
4 Statutes, is changed from "JOINT TECHNOLOGICAL EDUCATION DISTRICTS" to "JOINT  
5 TECHNICAL EDUCATION DISTRICTS".

6 Sec. 2. Section 15-391, Arizona Revised Statutes, is amended to read:  
7 15-391. Definitions

8 In this article, unless the context otherwise requires:

9 1. "Joint board" means a joint technical education district governing  
10 board.

11 2. "Joint district" means a joint technical education district.

12 3. "Joint technical education course" means a course that is offered  
13 by a joint technical education district as part of a joint technical  
14 education district program, that is approved by the career and technical  
15 education division of the department of education and that meets each of the  
16 following requirements:

17 (a) Is taught by an instructor who is certified to teach career and  
18 technical education by the state board of education or by a postsecondary  
19 educational institution.

20 (b) Is part of a program that requires students to obtain a passing  
21 score ~~OF AT LEAST SIXTY PERCENT~~ on an ~~examination~~ ASSESSMENT that  
22 demonstrates ~~a~~ THE level of ~~skill or competency~~ SKILLS, KNOWLEDGE AND  
23 COMPETENCIES NECESSARY TO BE SUCCESSFUL IN THE DESIGNATED VOCATION OR  
24 INDUSTRY for that program of study ~~that is accepted by a vocation or an~~  
25 ~~industry.~~

26 (c) Is part of an approved joint technical education district program.

27 (d) IS NOT A COURSE OR ANY VARIATION OF A COURSE, INCLUDING HONORS,  
28 THAT IS REQUIRED UNDER THE MINIMUM COURSE OF STUDY PURSUANT TO SECTION  
29 15-701.01 IN ORDER TO GRADUATE FROM HIGH SCHOOL.

30 (e) REQUIRES A MAJORITY OF INSTRUCTIONAL TIME TO BE CONDUCTED IN A  
31 LABORATORY ENVIRONMENT, FIELD-BASED ENVIRONMENT OR WORK-BASED LEARNING  
32 ENVIRONMENT.

33 (f) HAS DEMONSTRATED A NEED FOR EXTRA FUNDING IN ORDER TO PROVIDE THE  
34 JOINT TECHNICAL EDUCATION COURSE.

35 (g) REQUIRES SPECIALIZED EQUIPMENT IN ORDER TO PROVIDE INSTRUCTION TO  
36 STUDENTS THAT EXCEEDS THE COST OF A STANDARD EDUCATIONAL COURSE.

37 4. "Joint technical education district" means a district that is  
38 formed pursuant to this article and that offers joint technical education  
39 courses.

40 5. "Joint technical education district program" means a sequence of  
41 courses that is offered by a joint technical education district and that  
42 meets all of the following requirements:

43 (a) Is taught by an instructor who is certified to teach career and  
44 technical education by the state board of education or by a postsecondary  
45 educational institution.

1 (b) Requires an assessment that demonstrates ~~a~~ THE level of ~~skill or~~  
2 ~~competency in a~~ SKILLS, KNOWLEDGE AND COMPETENCIES NECESSARY TO BE SUCCESSFUL  
3 IN THE DESIGNATED vocation or industry ~~or that leads to~~ OR AN ASSESSMENT  
4 NECESSARY FOR certification in and acceptance by that vocation or industry.  
5 ANY ASSESSMENT ADOPTED PURSUANT TO THIS SUBDIVISION SHALL REQUIRE A PASSING  
6 SCORE OF AT LEAST SIXTY PERCENT.

7 (c) Requires specialized equipment ~~or instructional materials~~ IN ORDER  
8 TO PROVIDE INSTRUCTION TO STUDENTS that ~~exceed~~ EXCEEDS the ~~scope and~~ cost of  
9 a standard educational course.

10 (d) Requires A MAJORITY OF INSTRUCTIONAL TIME TO BE CONDUCTED IN A  
11 LABORATORY ENVIRONMENT, FIELD-BASED ENVIRONMENT OR work-based learning  
12 ~~components,~~ ENVIRONMENT, AND REQUIRES career and technical student  
13 organization participation ~~and laboratory experience as determined by the~~  
14 ~~career and technical education division of the department of education.~~

15 (e) ~~Meets~~ DEMONSTRATES ALIGNMENT THROUGH A CURRICULUM, INSTRUCTIONAL  
16 MODEL AND COURSE SEQUENCE TO MEET the standards of a career and technical  
17 education preparatory program as determined by the career and technical  
18 education division of the department of education.

19 (f) ~~Had~~ HAS a defined pathway to career and postsecondary education IN  
20 A SPECIFIC VOCATION OR INDUSTRY AS DETERMINED BY THE CAREER AND TECHNICAL  
21 EDUCATION DIVISION OF THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION.

22 (g) Is approved by the career and technical education division of the  
23 department of education based on the requirements prescribed in this  
24 paragraph ~~within one hundred twenty days~~ after the submission of all required  
25 documentation.

26 (h) Is certified by the joint technical education district governing  
27 board to have met all the requirements prescribed in this article.

28 (i) Is offered only to students in grades nine, ten, eleven and  
29 twelve.

30 (j) FILLS A HIGH-NEED VOCATIONAL OR INDUSTRY NEED AS DETERMINED BY THE  
31 CAREER AND TECHNICAL EDUCATION DIVISION OF THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION.

32 (k) REQUIRES A SINGLE OR STACKABLE CREDENTIAL AS DESCRIBED IN  
33 SUBDIVISION (1) OF THIS PARAGRAPH OR A SKILL THAT WILL ALLOW A STUDENT TO  
34 OBTAIN WORK AS DESCRIBED IN SUBDIVISION (1) OF THIS PARAGRAPH ON GRADUATION  
35 BEFORE RECEIVING AN ASSOCIATE'S DEGREE OR BACCALAUREATE DEGREE.

36 (1) LEADS TO CERTIFICATION OR LICENSURE IN THE DESIGNATED VOCATION OR  
37 INDUSTRY THAT HAS BEEN VERIFIED AND ACCEPTED BY THAT VOCATION OR INDUSTRY AND  
38 THAT QUALIFIES THE RECIPIENT OF THE CERTIFICATION OR LICENSURE FOR EMPLOYMENT  
39 FOR WHICH THE STUDENT WOULD NOT OTHERWISE QUALIFY. IF THERE IS NO  
40 CERTIFICATION OR LICENSURE THAT IS ACCEPTED BY THE VOCATION OR INDUSTRY,  
41 COMPLETION OF THE PROGRAM MUST QUALIFY THE STUDENT FOR EMPLOYMENT FOR WHICH  
42 THE STUDENT WOULD NOT OTHERWISE QUALIFY WITHOUT COMPLETION OF THE JOINT  
43 TECHNICAL EDUCATION DISTRICT PROGRAM.

44 (m) REQUIRES INSTRUCTION AND INSTRUCTIONAL MATERIALS IN COURSES THAT  
45 ARE SUBSTANTIALLY DIFFERENT FROM AND EXCEED THE SCOPE OF STANDARD INSTRUCTION

1 AND THAT INCLUDE VOCATIONAL SKILLS, COMPETENCIES AND KNOWLEDGE TO BE  
2 SUCCESSFUL IN THE DESIGNATED JOINT TECHNICAL EDUCATION DISTRICT PROGRAM  
3 VOCATION OR INDUSTRY.

4 (n) AN INDUSTRY OR VOCATION HAS AGREED TO PROVIDE FINANCIAL OR  
5 TECHNICAL SUPPORT TO THE JOINT TECHNICAL EDUCATION DISTRICT FOR A SPECIFIC  
6 JOINT TECHNICAL EDUCATION DISTRICT PROGRAM. FOR THE PURPOSES OF THIS  
7 SUBDIVISION, "FINANCIAL SUPPORT" INCLUDES IN-KIND CONTRIBUTIONS AND  
8 DONATIONS.

9 (o) A JOINT TECHNICAL EDUCATION DISTRICT HAS DEMONSTRATED A NEED FOR  
10 EXTRA FUNDING IN ORDER TO PROVIDE THE JOINT TECHNICAL EDUCATION DISTRICT  
11 PROGRAM.

12 6. "State board" means the state board of education.

13 Sec. 3. Section 15-393, Arizona Revised Statutes, is amended to read:

14 15-393. Joint technical education district governing board;  
15 report; definitions

16 A. The management and control of the joint district are vested in the  
17 joint technical education district governing board, including the content and  
18 quality of the courses offered by the district, the quality of teachers who  
19 provide instruction on behalf of the district, the salaries of teachers who  
20 provide instruction on behalf of the district and the reimbursement of other  
21 entities for the facilities used by the district. Unless the governing  
22 boards of the school districts participating in the formation of the joint  
23 district vote to implement an alternative election system as provided in  
24 subsection B of this section, the joint board shall consist of five members  
25 elected from five single member districts formed within the joint district.  
26 The single member district election system shall be submitted as part of the  
27 plan for the joint district pursuant to section 15-392 and shall be  
28 established in the plan as follows:

29 1. The governing boards of the school districts participating in the  
30 formation of the joint district shall define the boundaries of the single  
31 member districts so that the single member districts are as nearly equal in  
32 population as is practicable, except that if the joint district lies in part  
33 in each of two or more counties, at least one single member district may be  
34 entirely within each of the counties comprising the joint district if this  
35 district design is consistent with the obligation to equalize the population  
36 among single member districts.

37 2. The boundaries of each single member district shall follow election  
38 precinct boundary lines, as far as practicable, in order to avoid further  
39 segmentation of the precincts.

40 3. A person who is a registered voter of this state and who is a  
41 resident of the single member district is eligible for election to the office  
42 of joint board member from the single member district. The terms of office  
43 of the members of the joint board shall be as prescribed in section 15-427,  
44 subsection B. An employee of a joint technical education district or the  
45 spouse of an employee shall not hold membership on a governing board of a

1 joint technical education district by which the employee is employed. A  
2 member of one school district governing board or joint technical education  
3 district governing board is ineligible to be a candidate for nomination or  
4 election to or serve simultaneously as a member of any other governing board,  
5 except that a member of a governing board may be a candidate for nomination  
6 or election for any other governing board if the member is serving in the  
7 last year of a term of office. A member of a governing board shall resign  
8 the member's seat on the governing board before becoming a candidate for  
9 nomination or election to the governing board of any other school district or  
10 joint technical education district, unless the member of the governing board  
11 is serving in the last year of a term of office.

12 4. Nominating petitions shall be signed by the number of qualified  
13 electors of the single member district as provided in section 16-322.

14 B. The governing boards of the school districts participating in the  
15 formation of the joint district may vote to implement any other alternative  
16 election system for the election of joint district board members. If an  
17 alternative election system is selected, it shall be submitted as part of the  
18 plan for the joint district pursuant to section 15-392, and the  
19 implementation of the system shall be as approved by the United States  
20 justice department.

21 C. The joint technical education district shall be subject to the  
22 following provisions of this title:

- 23 1. Chapter 1, articles 1 through 6.
- 24 2. Sections 15-208, 15-210, 15-213 and 15-234.
- 25 3. Articles 2, 3 and 5 of this chapter.
- 26 4. Section 15-361.
- 27 5. Chapter 4, articles 1, 2 and 5.
- 28 6. Chapter 5, articles 1, 2 and 3.
- 29 7. Sections 15-701.01, 15-722, 15-723, 15-724, 15-727, 15-728, 15-729  
30 and 15-730.
- 31 8. Chapter 7, article 5.
- 32 9. Chapter 8, articles 1, 3 and 4.
- 33 10. Sections 15-828 and 15-829.
- 34 11. Chapter 9, article 1, article 6, except for section 15-995, and  
35 article 7.
- 36 12. Sections 15-941, 15-943.01, 15-948, 15-952, 15-953 and 15-973.
- 37 13. Sections 15-1101 and 15-1104.
- 38 14. Chapter 10, articles 2, 3, 4 and 8.

39 D. Notwithstanding subsection C of this section, the following apply  
40 to a joint technical education district:

- 41 1. A joint district may issue bonds for the purposes specified in  
42 section 15-1021 and in chapter 4, article 5 of this title to an amount in the  
43 aggregate, including the existing indebtedness, not exceeding one percent of  
44 the taxable property used for secondary tax purposes, as determined pursuant  
45 to title 42, chapter 15, article 1, within the joint technical education

1 district as ascertained by the last property tax assessment previous to  
2 issuing the bonds.

3 2. The number of governing board members for a joint district shall be  
4 as prescribed in subsection A of this section.

5 3. The student count for the first year of operation of a joint  
6 technical education district as provided in this article shall be determined  
7 as follows:

8 (a) Determine the estimated student count for joint district classes  
9 that will operate in the first year of operation. This estimate shall be  
10 based on actual registration of pupils as of March 30 scheduled to attend  
11 classes that will be operated by the joint district. The student count for  
12 the district of residence of the pupils registered at the joint district  
13 shall be adjusted. The adjustment shall cause the district of residence to  
14 reduce the student count for the pupil to reflect the courses to be taken at  
15 the joint district. The district of residence shall review and approve the  
16 adjustment of its own student count as provided in this subdivision before  
17 the pupils from the school district can be added to the student count of the  
18 joint district.

19 (b) The student count for the new joint district shall be the student  
20 count as determined in subdivision (a) of this paragraph.

21 (c) For the first year of operation, the joint district shall revise  
22 the student count to the actual average daily membership as prescribed in  
23 section 15-901, subsection A, paragraph 1 for students attending classes in  
24 the joint district. A joint district shall revise its student count, the  
25 base support level as provided in section 15-943.02, the revenue control  
26 limit as provided in section 15-944.01 and the district additional assistance  
27 as provided in section 15-962.01 prior to May 15. A joint district that  
28 overestimated its student count shall revise its budget prior to May 15. A  
29 joint district that underestimated its student count may revise its budget  
30 prior to May 15.

31 (d) After March 15 of the first year of operation, the district of  
32 residence shall adjust its student count by reducing it to reflect the  
33 courses actually taken at the joint district. The district of residence  
34 shall revise its student count, the base support level as provided in section  
35 15-943, the revenue control limit as provided in section 15-944 and the  
36 district additional assistance as provided in section 15-962.01 prior to  
37 May 15. A district that underestimated the student count for students  
38 attending the joint district shall revise its budget prior to May 15. A  
39 district that overestimated the student count for students attending the  
40 joint district may revise its budget prior to May 15.

41 (e) A joint district for the first year of operation shall not be  
42 eligible for adjustment pursuant to section 15-948.

43 (f) The procedures for implementing this paragraph shall be as  
44 prescribed in the uniform system of financial records.

1 (g) Pupils in an approved joint technical education district  
2 centralized program may generate an average daily membership of 1.0 during  
3 any day of the week and at any time between July 1 and June 30 of each fiscal  
4 year.

5 For the purposes of this paragraph, "district of residence" means the  
6 district that included the pupil in its average daily membership for the year  
7 before the first year of operation of the joint district and that would have  
8 included the pupil in its student count for the purposes of computing its  
9 base support level for the fiscal year of the first year of operation of the  
10 joint district if the pupil had not enrolled in the joint district.

11 4. A student includes any person enrolled in the joint district  
12 without regard to the person's age or high school graduation status, except  
13 that:

14 (a) A student in a kindergarten program or in grades one through nine  
15 who enrolls in courses offered by the joint technical education district  
16 shall not be included in the joint district's student count or average daily  
17 membership.

18 (b) A student in a kindergarten program or in grades one through nine  
19 who is enrolled in career and technical education courses shall not be funded  
20 in whole or in part with monies provided by a joint technical education  
21 district, except that a pupil in grade eight or nine may be funded with  
22 monies generated by the five cent qualifying tax rate authorized in  
23 subsection F of this section.

24 (c) BEGINNING JULY 1, 2016, a student who HAS GRADUATED FROM HIGH  
25 SCHOOL OR RECEIVED A GENERAL EQUIVALENCY DIPLOMA OR WHO is over twenty-one  
26 years of age shall not be included in the student count of the joint district  
27 for the purposes of chapter 9, articles 3, 4 and 5 of this title. A STUDENT  
28 WHO HAS YET TO GRADUATE OR RECEIVE A GENERAL EQUIVALENCY DIPLOMA AND WAS  
29 LAWFULLY ENROLLED IN A JOINT TECHNICAL EDUCATION DISTRICT PROGRAM ON JANUARY  
30 1, 2016 MAY CONTINUE TO PARTICIPATE IN THE PROGRAM AFTER THE EFFECTIVE DATE  
31 OF THIS AMENDMENT TO THIS SECTION.

32 (d) A STUDENT WHO IS ENROLLED IN ANY INTERNSHIP COURSE AS PART OF A  
33 JOINT TECHNICAL EDUCATION DISTRICT PROGRAM SHALL NOT BE INCLUDED IN THE  
34 STUDENT COUNT OF THE JOINT DISTRICT FOR THAT INTERNSHIP COURSE FOR THE  
35 PURPOSES OF CHAPTER 9, ARTICLES 3, 4 AND 5 OF THIS TITLE.

36 5. A joint district may operate for more than one hundred eighty days  
37 per year, with expanded hours of service.

38 6. A joint district may use the carryforward provisions of section  
39 15-943.01.

40 7. A school district that is part of a joint district shall use any  
41 monies received pursuant to this article to supplement and not supplant base  
42 year career and technical education courses, and directly related equipment  
43 and facilities, except that a school district that is part of a joint  
44 technical education district and that has used monies received pursuant to  
45 this article to supplant career and technical education courses that were

1 offered before the first year that the school district participated in the  
2 joint district or the first year that the school district used monies  
3 received pursuant to this article or that used the monies for purposes other  
4 than for career and technical education courses shall use one hundred percent  
5 of the monies received pursuant to this article to supplement and not  
6 supplant base year career and technical education courses.

7 8. A joint technical education district shall use any monies received  
8 pursuant to this article to enhance and not supplant career and technical  
9 education courses and directly related equipment and facilities.

10 9. A joint technical education district or a school district that is  
11 part of a joint district or a charter school shall only include pupils in  
12 grades ten through twelve in the calculation of student count or average  
13 daily membership if the pupils are enrolled in courses that are approved  
14 jointly by the governing board of the joint technical education district and  
15 each participating school district or charter school for satellite courses  
16 taught within the participating school district or charter school, or  
17 approved solely by the joint technical education district for centrally  
18 located courses. Student count and average daily membership from courses  
19 that are not part of an approved program for career and technical education  
20 shall not be included in student count and average daily membership of a  
21 joint technical education district.

22 E. The joint board shall appoint a superintendent as the executive  
23 officer of the joint district.

24 F. Taxes may be levied for the support of the joint district as  
25 prescribed in chapter 9, article 6 of this title, except that a joint  
26 technical education district shall not levy a property tax pursuant to law  
27 that exceeds five cents per one hundred dollars assessed valuation except for  
28 bond monies pursuant to subsection D, paragraph 1 of this section. Except  
29 for the taxes levied pursuant to section 15-994, such taxes shall be obtained  
30 from a levy of taxes on the taxable property used for secondary tax purposes.

31 G. The schools in the joint district are available to all persons who  
32 reside in the joint district and to pupils whose district of residence within  
33 this state is paying tuition on behalf of the pupils to a district of  
34 attendance that is a member of the joint technical education district,  
35 subject to the rules for admission prescribed by the joint board.

36 H. The joint board may collect tuition for adult students and the  
37 attendance of pupils who are residents of school districts that are not  
38 participating in the joint district pursuant to arrangements made between the  
39 governing board of the district and the joint board.

40 I. The joint board may accept gifts, grants, federal monies, tuition  
41 and other allocations of monies to erect, repair and equip buildings and for  
42 the cost of operation of the schools of the joint district.

43 J. One member of the joint board shall be selected chairman. The  
44 chairman shall be selected annually on a rotation basis from among the



1 participating school districts. The chairman of the joint board shall be a  
2 voting member.

3 K. A joint board and a community college district may enter into  
4 agreements for the provision of administrative, operational and educational  
5 services and facilities.

6 L. BEGINNING JULY 1, 2016, any agreement between the governing board  
7 of a joint technical education district and another joint technical education  
8 district, a school district, a charter school or a community college district  
9 shall be in the form of an intergovernmental agreement or other written  
10 contract. The auditor general shall modify the uniform system of financial  
11 records and budget forms in accordance with this subsection. The  
12 intergovernmental agreement or other written contract shall completely and  
13 accurately specify each of the following:

14 1. The financial provisions of the intergovernmental agreement or  
15 other written contract and the format for the billing of all services.

16 2. The accountability provisions of the intergovernmental agreement or  
17 other written contract.

18 3. The responsibilities of each joint technical education district,  
19 each school district, each charter school and each community college district  
20 that is a party to the intergovernmental agreement or other written contract.

21 4. The type of instruction that will be provided under the  
22 intergovernmental agreement or other written contract, including  
23 individualized education programs pursuant to section 15-763.

24 5. The quality of the instruction that will be provided under the  
25 intergovernmental agreement or other written contract.

26 6. The transportation services that will be provided under the  
27 intergovernmental agreement or other written contract and the manner in which  
28 transportation costs will be paid.

29 7. The amount that the joint technical education district will  
30 contribute to a course and the amount of support required by the school  
31 district or the community college.

32 8. That the services provided by the joint technical education  
33 district, the school district, the charter school or the community college  
34 district be proportionally calculated in the cost of delivering the service.

35 9. That the payment for services shall not exceed the cost of the  
36 services provided.

37 10. THAT THE JOINT TECHNICAL EDUCATION DISTRICT WILL PROVIDE THE  
38 FOLLOWING MINIMUM SERVICES FOR ALL MEMBER DISTRICTS:

39 (a) PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT OF CAREER AND TECHNICAL TEACHERS IN THE  
40 JOINT DISTRICT WHO ARE TEACHING PROGRAMS OR COURSES AT A SATELLITE CAMPUS.

41 (b) ONGOING EVALUATION AND SUPPORT OF SATELLITE CAMPUS PROGRAMS AND  
42 COURSES TO ENSURE QUALITY AND COMPLIANCE.

43 11. AN ITEMIZED LISTING OF OTHER GOODS AND SERVICES THAT ARE PROVIDED  
44 TO THE MEMBER DISTRICT AND THAT ARE PAID FOR BY THE RETENTION OF SATELLITE  
45 CAMPUS STUDENT FUNDING.

1 ~~M. On or before December 31 of each year, each joint technical~~  
2 ~~education district shall submit a detailed report to the career and technical~~  
3 ~~education division of the department of education. The career and technical~~  
4 ~~education division of the department of education shall collect, summarize~~  
5 ~~and analyze the data submitted by the joint districts, shall submit an annual~~  
6 ~~report that summarizes the data submitted by the joint districts to the~~  
7 ~~governor, the speaker of the house of representatives, the president of the~~  
8 ~~senate and the state board of education and shall submit a copy of this~~  
9 ~~report to the secretary of state. The data submitted by each joint technical~~  
10 ~~education district shall include the following:~~

- 11 ~~1. The average daily membership of the joint district.~~
- 12 ~~2. The program listings and program descriptions of programs offered~~  
13 ~~by the joint district, including the course sequences for each program.~~
- 14 ~~3. The costs associated with each program offered by the joint~~  
15 ~~district.~~
- 16 ~~4. The completion rate for each program offered by the joint district.~~  
17 ~~For the purposes of this paragraph, "completion rate" means the completion~~  
18 ~~rate for students who are designated as concentrators in that program by the~~  
19 ~~department of education under the career and technology approved plan.~~
- 20 ~~5. The graduation rate from the school district of residence of~~  
21 ~~students who have completed a program in the joint district.~~
- 22 ~~6. A detailed description of the career opportunities available to~~  
23 ~~students after completion of the program offered by the joint district.~~
- 24 ~~7. A detailed description of the career placement of students who have~~  
25 ~~completed the program offered by the joint district.~~
- 26 ~~8. Any other data deemed necessary by the department of education to~~  
27 ~~carry out its duties under this subsection.~~

28 ~~N. M. A MEMBER SCHOOL DISTRICT OR CHARTER SCHOOL MAY NOT SUBMIT~~

3           A. The career and technical education task force is established

7 party. The president of the senate shall designate one of these members to  
8 serve as cochairperson of the committee.

9           2. Three members of the house of representatives who are appointed by  
10 the speaker of the house of representatives, not more than two of whom are  
11 members of the same political party. The speaker of the house of  
12 representatives shall designate one of these members to serve as  
13 cochairperson of the committee.

14           3. One member who is affiliated with a statewide policy and research  
15 organization that has a background in school finance, school choice and  
16 education policy and who is appointed by the governor.

17           4. One member who is affiliated with a major taxpayer organization and  
18 who is appointed by the governor.

19           5. One member who represents a high-need vocation or industry in this  
20 state and who is appointed by the governor.

21           6. Two members who each represent a different joint technical  
22 education district and who are appointed by the president of the senate. One  
23 of these members shall be from a joint technical education district that has  
24 two thousand or more students enrolled in a centralized campus and the other  
25 member shall be from a joint district with a majority of students enrolled at  
26 satellite campuses.

27           7. Two members who each represent a different joint technical  
28 education district and who are appointed by the speaker of the house of  
29 representatives. Both of these members shall be from separate joint  
30 technical education districts with less than two thousand students.

31           B. Task force members are not eligible to receive compensation but are  
32 eligible to receive reimbursement of expenses pursuant to title 38, chapter

34           C. The career and technical education division of the department of  
35 education and the department of education shall lend technical support to the  
36 task force and provide any data, research or information that the task force

38           D. The task force shall study and analyze:

39           1. Uniformity in career and technical education course offerings and  
40 titles across all joint technical education districts.

41           2. Uniformity in course sequencing for completing career and technical  
42 education programs across all joint technical education districts.

43           3. Uniformity in certifications and licensure issued on completion of  
44 career and technical education programs across all joint technical education  
45 districts.

1           4. The establishment of open enrollment and school choice across all  
2 joint technical education districts.

3           5. Joint technical education district financing and allocation of  
4 monies to member districts and charter schools for students enrolled at  
5 satellite campuses.

6           6. The reduction of duplicative career and technical education  
7 programs and courses based on locations of other satellite campus,  
8 centralized campus, leased centralized campus and community college career  
9 and technical education program and course offerings.

10          7. Any other issues to reform, promote and enhance career and  
11 technical education.

12          E. The task force shall submit an annual report of its findings and  
13 recommendations for administrative and legislative action on or before  
14 December 15 to the governor, the president of the senate and the speaker of  
15 the house of representatives and shall provide a copy of this report to the  
16 secretary of state.

17          F. This section is repealed from and after December 31, 2018.

18          Sec. 6. Department of education; joint legislative budget  
19 committee review of new requirements; reports

20          On the effective date of this act, the department of education shall  
21 immediately start reviewing the compliance and eligibility of all joint  
22 technical education district programs and joint technical education courses  
23 currently in effect with the new requirements set forth in this act. Through  
24 December 31, 2018, the department of education shall submit quarterly reports  
25 to the joint legislative budget committee for review on its progress and the  
26 subsequent approval or rejection of currently eligible joint technical  
27 education district programs and joint technical education courses. Any joint  
28 technical education program or joint technical education course that is

3           7. The variety, scope and duplication of joint technical education  
4 district program and course offerings.

5           8. Any follow-up issues arising since the previous audit or any other  
6 issues necessary for the completion of the audit as determined by the auditor  
7 general.

8           Sec. 8. House of Representatives; findings and intent

9           A. The Arizona House of Representatives finds that:

10          1. Joint Technical Education Districts, known as JTEDs, are an  
11 important component of a well-rounded education system by providing access to  
12 Career and Technical Education programs that offer training to students to  
13 equip them with the tools needed to enter the workforce after high school in  
14 jobs that demand highly-skilled employees.

15          2. Restoring funding to JTEDs and implementing accountability measures  
16 to the programs was an important priority of members of the Arizona House of  
17 Representatives, including Representatives Ackerley, Allen, Alston, Andrade,  
18 Barton, Benally, Bolding, Borrelli, Bowers, Boyer, Brophy McGee, Campbell,  
19 Cardenas, Carter, Clark, Cobb, Coleman, Espinoza, Fann, Farnsworth E,  
20 Fernandez, Finchem, Friese, Gabaldón, Gonzales, Gowan, Gray, Hale, Kern,  
21 Kopec, Larkin, Lawrence, Leach, Livingston, Lovas, Mendez, Mesnard, Meyer,  
22 Mitchell, Montenegro, Norgaard, Olson, Otondo, Petersen, Plumlee, Pratt,  
23 Rios, Rivero, Robson, Saldate, Shope, Stevens, Thorpe, Townsend, Velasquez  
24 and Weninger.

25          3. To accomplish the goal of swift and efficient enactment of funding  
26 and reforms to JTEDs, House and Senate members and staff worked with  
27 stakeholders to develop an agreement which culminated in the introduction of  
28 House Bill 2642 on February 4, 2016. House Bill 2642 was heard in a Special  
29 Education Committee on February 8, 2016 and passed by the House and  
30 transmitted to the Senate on February 9, 2016, with the understanding that a  
31 motion would be made in the Senate pursuant to Senate Rule 11 to substitute  
32 House Bill 2642 on Third Reading and send the bill to the Governor.

33          4. The Senate introduced Senate Bill 1525, identical to House  
34 Bill 2642, and amended Senate Bill 1525 in Committee of the Whole, which  
35 caused the bills to no longer be identical, and passed Senate Bill 1525 on  
36 Third Reading and transmitted it to the House on February 11, 2016.

37          B. It is the intent of the Arizona House of Representatives to ensure  
38 that these vital JTED programs are funded to meet the needs of both Arizona's  
39 students and businesses. The Arizona House of Representatives urges the  
40 Arizona State Senate to immediately concur in the House amendments to Senate  
41 Bill 1525, pass the bill on Final Passage, and transmit the bill to the  
42 Governor.

1           Sec. 9. Retroactivity

2           Section 15-393, Arizona Revised Statutes, as amended by this act,  
3 applies retroactively to from and after June 30, 2016.

4           Sec. 10. Emergency

5           This act is an emergency measure that is necessary to preserve the  
6 public peace, health or safety and is operative immediately as provided by  
7 law.
