# **HOUSE BILL 2534**

#### AN ACT

AMENDING SECTION 15-203, ARIZONA REVISED STATUTES; AMENDING TITLE 15, CHAPTER 5, ARTICLE 1, ARIZONA REVISED STATUTES, BY ADDING SECTION 15-501.01; AMENDING SECTION 15-534.04, ARIZONA REVISED STATUTES; RELATING TO TEACHER CERTIFICATION.

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1 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Arizona: Section 1. Section 15-203, Arizona Revised Statutes, is amended to 2 3 read: 4 15-203. Powers and duties 5 A. The state board of education shall: 6 Exercise general supervision over and regulate the conduct of 1. 7 the public school system and adopt any rules and policies it deems 8 necessary to accomplish this purpose. 9 2. Keep a record of its proceedings. 10 3. Make rules for its own government. 11 4. Determine the policy and work undertaken by it. 12 5. Subject to title 41, chapter 4, article 4, employ staff. 6. Prescribe and supervise the duties of its employees pursuant to 13 14 title 41, chapter 4, article 4, if not otherwise prescribed by statute. Delegate to the superintendent of public instruction the 15 7. 16 execution of board policies and rules. 17 Recommend to the legislature changes or additions to 8. the 18 statutes pertaining to schools. 19 9. Prepare. publish and distribute reports concerning the 20 educational welfare of this state. 21 10. Prepare a budget for expenditures necessary for proper 22 maintenance of the board and accomplishment of its purposes and present 23 the budget to the legislature. 24 11. Aid in the enforcement of laws relating to schools. 25 12. Prescribe a minimum course of study in the common schools, 26 minimum competency requirements for the promotion of pupils from the third 27 grade and minimum course of study and competency requirements for the 28 promotion of pupils from the eighth grade. The state board of education 29 shall prepare a fiscal impact statement of any proposed changes to the 30 minimum course of study or competency requirements and, on completion, shall send a copy to the director of the joint legislative budget 31 32 committee and the executive director of the school facilities board. The 33 state board of education shall not adopt any changes in the minimum course 34 of study or competency requirements in effect on July 1, 1998 that will 35 have a fiscal impact on school capital costs. 36 13. Prescribe minimum course of study and competency requirements 37 for the graduation of pupils from high school. The state board of 38 education shall prepare a fiscal impact statement of any proposed changes 39 to the minimum course of study or competency requirements and, on 40 completion, shall send a copy to the director of the joint legislative budget committee and the executive director of the school facilities 41 board. The state board of education shall not adopt any changes in the 42 43 minimum course of study or competency requirements in effect on July 1,

1998 that will have a fiscal impact on school capital costs.

1 14. PURSUANT TO SECTION 15-501.01, supervise and control the 2 certification of persons engaged in instructional work directly as any 3 classroom, laboratory or other teacher or indirectly as a supervisory 4 teacher, speech therapist, principal or superintendent in a school 5 district, including school district preschool programs, or any other 6 educational institution below the community college, college or university 7 level, and prescribe rules for certification. The rules:

8 (a) Shall provide for a variety of alternative teacher and administrator preparation programs that allow for variations in program 9 10 sequence and design to apply for program approval. The state board shall 11 adopt rules pursuant to this subdivision designed to allow for a variety 12 of formats and shall not require a prescribed answer or design from the program provider in order to obtain approval from the state board. Any 13 14 rules adopted by the state board pursuant to this subdivision shall be substantially different from the rules adopted for the approval of 15 16 traditional preparation programs and may not unnecessarily restrict a 17 variety of alternative preparation programs from operating and providing instruction in this state. The state board shall evaluate each program 18 provider based on the program's ability to prepare teachers and 19 20 administrators and to recruit teachers and administrators with a variety of experiences and talents. The state board shall permit universities 21 22 under the jurisdiction of the Arizona board of regents, community colleges in this state, private postsecondary institutions licensed by this state, 23 24 school districts, charter schools, professional organizations, nonprofit organizations and private entities to apply for program approval and shall 25 create application procedures and certification criteria that are 26 27 substantially less restrictive than those for traditional preparation 28 programs. At the completion of an alternative preparation program, 29 graduates shall:

30 (i) Hold a bachelor's degree from an accredited postsecondary 31 education institution.

32 (ii) If applicable, demonstrate professional knowledge and subject
 33 knowledge proficiency pursuant to section 15-533.

34 (iii) Obtain a fingerprint clearance card pursuant to section 35 15-534.

36 (iv) If applicable, complete training in structured English
 37 immersion as prescribed by the state board pursuant to section 15-756.09.

38 (v) If applicable, complete training in research-based systematic
 39 phonics instruction as prescribed in subdivision (b) of this paragraph.

40 (vi) Demonstrate the required proficiency in the Constitutions of
 41 the United States and Arizona as prescribed in section 15-532.

42 (b) Shall require applicants for all certificates for common school
 43 instruction to complete a minimum of forty-five classroom hours or three
 44 college level credit hours, or the equivalent, of training in

1 research-based systematic phonics instruction from a public or private
2 provider.

3 (c) Shall not require a teacher to obtain a master's degree or to 4 take any additional graduate courses as a condition of certification or 5 recertification.

6 (d) Shall allow a general equivalency diploma to be substituted for 7 a high school diploma in the certification of emergency substitute 8 teachers.

(e) Shall allow but shall not require the superintendent of a 9 10 school district to obtain certification from the state board of education. 11 (f) Shall provide for the issuance of a subject matter expert 12 standard teaching certificate to persons who have expertise in a content area or subject matter. Persons who are certified pursuant to this 13 14 subdivision shall complete training, if applicable, in structured English immersion as prescribed by the state board pursuant to section 15-756.09. 15 16 Persons who are certified pursuant to this subdivision are exempt from the 17 subject knowledge proficiency requirements prescribed in section 15-533 18 and from the proficiency requirements prescribed in section 15-532 on the Constitutions of the United States and Arizona. Persons pursuant to 19 20 item (i) of this subdivision are also exempt from the professional knowledge proficiency requirements pursuant to section 15-533. A person 21 who obtains a subject matter expert standard teaching certificate pursuant 22 to this subdivision may provide instruction in the person's field of 23 24 expertise in grades six through twelve at any public school in this state. Issuance of the subject matter expert standard teaching certificate may 25 not be conditioned on the person's employment with a local education 26 27 agency. A person who meets the requirements of this subdivision shall be 28 issued a subject matter expert standard teaching certificate without 29 having to demonstrate professional knowledge proficiency pursuant to 30 section 15-533, except that the person shall have at least two years to 31 demonstrate professional knowledge proficiency pursuant to section 15-533. 32 School districts shall evaluate and provide support pursuant to section 33 15-537 to teachers certified pursuant to this subdivision. If a person 34 fails to meet the professional knowledge requirements of this section 35 within two years, the department of education or state board of education 36 may temporarily suspend the subject matter expert standard teaching certificate. A certificate that is temporarily suspended pursuant to this 37 38 subdivision is not considered a disciplinary action and a person shall be 39 allowed to correct the deficiency within the remaining time of the subject 40 matter expert standard teaching certification. This subdivision does not 41 require a person who has obtained another type of teaching certificate 42 from the state board to obtain a subject matter expert standard teaching 43 certificate pursuant to this subdivision in order to provide instruction 44 in grades six through twelve. A person is eligible for a subject matter 45 expert standard teaching certificate pursuant to this subdivision if the

person obtains a valid fingerprint clearance card that is issued pursuant to title 41, chapter 12, article 3.1 and meets any of the following requirements:

4 (i) Has taught courses relevant to a content area or subject matter 5 for the last two consecutive years and for a total of at least three years 6 at one or more regionally or nationally accredited public or private 7 postsecondary institutions. A person shall demonstrate compliance with 8 this requirement by providing the state board with written proof of 9 employment for specific durations from one or more qualifying 10 postsecondary institutions.

11 (ii) Has either a baccalaureate degree, a master's degree or a 12 doctoral degree in a specific subject area that is directly relevant to a 13 content area or subject matter taught in public schools.

14 (iii) Demonstrates expertise through relevant work experience of at 15 least five years in a field that is relevant to a content area or subject 16 matter taught in public schools. A person shall demonstrate compliance 17 with this requirement by providing the state board with written proof of 18 employment.

19 (g) Notwithstanding section 15-533, shall exempt persons applying 20 for a secondary education certificate from the subject knowledge portion 21 of the proficiency examination if the state board determines that the 22 person has work experience in science, technology, engineering or 23 mathematics and can demonstrate adequate knowledge of a particular subject 24 through a postsecondary education degree or twenty-four credit hours of 25 relevant coursework.

(h) Shall allow for all standard certificates issued to a person pursuant to this section to be both issued and renewed for at least twelve years and may not require more than fifteen hours of continuing education credits each year in order to renew any certificate issued pursuant to this section.

31 (i) Shall allow a certificate, and any endorsement or approved area 32 related to that certificate, to be renewed at least two years but not more 33 than ten years after that certificate expires without any other 34 requirements adopted by the state board of education or the department of 35 education if the person is in good standing, has at least ten years of 36 verified full-time experience in this state in the area the person is 37 seeking renewed certification and possesses a valid fingerprint clearance 38 card issued pursuant to section 15-534. A certificate renewed pursuant to 39 this subdivision shall be identical to the expired certificate.

40 15. Adopt a list of approved tests for determining special 41 education assistance to gifted pupils as defined in and as provided in 42 chapter 7, article 4.1 of this title. The adopted tests shall provide 43 separate scores for quantitative reasoning, verbal reasoning and nonverbal 44 reasoning and shall be capable of providing reliable and valid scores at 45 the highest ranges of the score distribution. 1 16. Adopt rules governing the methods for the administration of all 2 proficiency examinations.

3 17. Adopt proficiency examinations for its use. The state board of 4 education shall determine the passing score for the proficiency 5 examinations.

6 18. Include within its budget the cost of contracting for the 7 purchase, distribution and scoring of the examinations as provided in 8 paragraphs 16 and 17 of this subsection.

9 19. Supervise and control the qualifications of professional 10 nonteaching school personnel and prescribe standards relating to 11 qualifications. The standards shall not require the business manager of a 12 school district to obtain certification from the state board of education.

13 20. Impose such disciplinary action, including the issuance of a 14 letter of censure, suspension, suspension with conditions or revocation of 15 a certificate, on a finding of immoral or unprofessional conduct.

16 21. Establish an assessment, data gathering and reporting system 17 for pupil performance as prescribed in chapter 7, article 3 of this title 18 INCLUDING QUALIFYING EXAMINATIONS FOR THE COLLEGE CREDIT BY EXAMINATION 19 INCENTIVE PROGRAM PURSUANT TO SECTION 15-249.06.

20 22. Adopt a rule to promote braille literacy pursuant to section 21 15-214.

22 23. Adopt rules prescribing procedures for the investigation by the 23 department of education of every written complaint alleging that a 24 certificated person has engaged in immoral conduct.

25 24. For purposes of federal law, serve as the state board for 26 vocational and technological education and meet at least four times each 27 year solely to execute the powers and duties of the state board for 28 vocational and technological education.

29 Develop and maintain a handbook for use in the schools of this 25. 30 state that provides guidance for the teaching of moral, civic and ethical education. The handbook shall promote existing curriculum frameworks and 31 32 shall encourage school districts to recognize moral, civic and ethical 33 values within instructional and programmatic educational development 34 programs for the general purpose of instilling character and ethical 35 principles in pupils in kindergarten programs and grades one through 36 twelve.

26. Require pupils to recite the following passage from the declaration of independence for pupils in grades four through six at the commencement of the first class of the day in the schools, except that a pupil shall not be required to participate if the pupil or the pupil's parent or guardian objects:

42 We hold these truths to be self-evident, that all men 43 are created equal, that they are endowed by their creator with 44 certain unalienable rights, that among these are life, liberty 45 and the pursuit of happiness. That to secure these rights, 1 2 governments are instituted among men, deriving their just powers from the consent of the governed. . . .

3 27. Adopt rules that provide for certification reciprocity for 4 certificates issued pursuant to this section. The rules for certification 5 reciprocity shall include a requirement that the applicant possess a 6 comparable valid certification from another state and be in good standing 7 with that other state. An applicant who possesses a valid certification 8 from another state and a fingerprint clearance card pursuant to section 9 15-534 and who is in good standing with that other state shall be issued a 10 comparable standard certificate without any other requirements from the state board of education or the department of education. A person who is 11 12 issued a certificate pursuant to this paragraph is not required to meet any requirement prescribed in section 15-533 PURSUANT TO SECTION 13 14 15-501.01.

15 28. Adopt rules that provide for the presentation of an honorary 16 high school diploma to a person who has never obtained a high school 17 diploma and who meets both of the following requirements:

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(a) Currently resides in this state.

19 (b) Provides documented evidence from the department of veterans' 20 services that the person enlisted in the armed forces of the United States 21 and served in World War I, World War II, the Korean conflict or the 22 Vietnam conflict.

23 29. Cooperate with the Arizona-Mexico commission in the governor's office and with researchers at universities in this state to collect data 24 25 and conduct projects in the United States and Mexico on issues that are 26 within the scope of the duties of the department of education and that 27 relate to quality of life, trade and economic development in this state in 28 a manner that will help the Arizona-Mexico commission to assess and 29 enhance the economic competitiveness of this state and of the 30 Arizona-Mexico region.

31 30. Adopt rules to define and provide guidance to schools as to the 32 activities that would constitute immoral or unprofessional conduct of 33 certificated persons.

34 31. Adopt guidelines to encourage pupils in grades nine, ten, 35 eleven and twelve to volunteer for twenty hours of community service 36 before graduation from high school. A school district that complies with 37 the guidelines adopted pursuant to this paragraph is not liable for 38 damages resulting from a pupil's participation in community service unless 39 the school district is found to have demonstrated wanton or reckless 40 disregard for the safety of the pupil and other participants in community service. For the purposes of this paragraph, "community service" may 41 42 include service learning. The guidelines shall include the following:

43 (a) A list of the general categories in which community service may 44 be performed.

1 (b) A description of the methods by which community service will be 2 monitored.

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(c) A consideration of risk assessment for community service projects.

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5 (d) Orientation and notification procedures of community service 6 opportunities for pupils entering grade nine, including the development of 7 a notification form. The notification form shall be signed by the pupil 8 and the pupil's parent or guardian, except that a pupil shall not be 9 required to participate in community service if the parent or guardian 10 notifies the principal of the pupil's school in writing that the parent or 11 guardian does not wish the pupil to participate in community service.

12 (e) Procedures for a pupil in grade nine to prepare a written proposal that outlines the type of community service that the pupil would 13 14 like to perform and the goals that the pupil hopes to achieve as a result 15 of community service. The pupil's written proposal shall be reviewed by a 16 faculty advisor, a guidance counselor or any other school employee who is 17 designated as the community service program coordinator for that school. 18 The pupil may alter the written proposal at any time before performing 19 community service.

20 (f) Procedures for a faculty advisor, a guidance counselor or any 21 other school employee who is designated as the community service program 22 coordinator to evaluate and certify the completion of community service 23 performed by pupils.

32. To facilitate the transfer of military personnel and their dependents to and from the public schools of this state, pursue, in cooperation with the Arizona board of regents, reciprocity agreements with other states concerning the transfer credits for military personnel and their dependents. A reciprocity agreement entered into pursuant to this paragraph shall:

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(a) Address procedures for each of the following:(i) The transfer of student records.

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(ii) Awarding credit for completed coursework.

(iii) Permitting a student to satisfy the graduation requirements prescribed in section 15-701.01 through the successful performance on comparable exit-level assessment instruments administered in another state.

37 (b) Include appropriate criteria developed by the state board of38 education and the Arizona board of regents.

39 33. Adopt guidelines that school district governing boards shall 40 use in identifying pupils who are eligible for gifted programs and in 41 providing gifted education programs and services. The state board of 42 education shall adopt any other guidelines and rules that it deems 43 necessary in order to carry out the purposes of chapter 7, article 4.1 of 44 this title. 1 34. For each of the alternative textbook formats of human-voiced audio, large-print and braille, designate alternative media producers to 2 3 adapt existing standard print textbooks or to provide specialized 4 textbooks, or both, for pupils with disabilities in this state. Each 5 alternative media producer shall be capable of producing alternative 6 textbooks in all relevant subjects in at least one of the alternative 7 textbook formats. The board shall post the designated list of alternative 8 media producers on its website.

9 35. Adopt a list of approved professional development training 10 providers for use by school districts as provided in section 15-107, subsection J. The professional development training providers shall meet 11 12 the training curriculum requirements determined by the state board of 13 education in at least the areas of school finance, governance, employment, 14 staffing, inventory and human resources, internal controls and 15 procurement.

16 36. Adopt rules to prohibit a person who violates the notification 17 requirements prescribed in section 15-183, subsection C, paragraph 8 or 18 section 15-550, subsection C from certification pursuant to this title 19 until the person is no longer charged or is acquitted of any offenses 20 listed in section 41-1758.03, subsection B. The STATE board shall also 21 rules to prohibit a person who violates the adopt notification 22 requirements. certification surrender requirements fingerprint or 23 clearance card surrender requirements prescribed in section 15-183, 24 subsection C. paragraph 9 or section 15–550. subsection D from 25 certification pursuant to this title for at least ten years after the date 26 of the violation.

27 37. Adopt rules for the alternative certification of teachers of 28 nontraditional foreign languages that allow for the passing of a 29 nationally accredited test to substitute for the education coursework 30 required for certification.

31 38. Adopt and maintain a model framework for a teacher and 32 principal evaluation instrument that includes quantitative data on student 33 academic progress that accounts for between thirty-three percent and fifty 34 percent of the evaluation outcomes. The framework shall include four 35 performance classifications, designated as highly effective, effective, 36 developing and ineffective, and guidelines for school districts and 37 charter schools to use in their evaluation instruments. The state board 38 of education shall adopt best practices for professional development and 39 evaluator training. The state board of education may periodically make 40 adjustments to align the model framework for teacher and principal 41 evaluations with assessment or data changes at the state level. School 42 districts and charter schools shall use an instrument that meets the data requirements established by the state board of education to annually 43 44 evaluate individual teachers and principals. School districts and charter 45 schools shall adopt definitions for the performance classifications

1 adopted by the state board of education in a public meeting and apply the performance classifications to their evaluation instruments in a manner 2 3 designed to improve principal and teacher performance. For charter 4 holders, the principal evaluation instrument applies to each charter 5 school's instructional leader whose primary responsibility is to oversee 6 the academic performance of the charter school. This paragraph does not 7 apply to an officer, director, member or partner of the charter 8 holder. The school district governing board shall discuss at a public 9 meeting at least annually its aggregate performance classifications of 10 principals and teachers.

11 39. Adopt rules to define competency-based educational pathways for 12 college and career readiness that may be used by schools. The rules shall 13 include the following components:

14 (a) The establishment of learning outcomes that will be expected15 for students in a particular subject.

16 (b) A process and criteria by which assessments may be identified 17 or established to determine if students have reached the desired 18 competencies in a particular subject.

(c) A mechanism to allow pupils in grades seven through twelve who have demonstrated competency in a subject to immediately obtain credit for the mastery of that subject. The rules shall include a list of applicable subjects, including the level of competency required for each subject.

40. In consultation with the department of health services, the 23 24 education. medical professionals, department of school health professionals, school administrators and an organization that represents 25 school nurses in this state, adopt rules that prescribe the following for 26 27 school districts and charter schools:

28 (a) Annual training in the administration of auto-injectable 29 epinephrine, as directed on the prescription protocol, for designated 30 medical and nonmedical school personnel. The annual training prescribed 31 in this subdivision is optional during any fiscal year in which sufficient 32 monies are not appropriated by the legislature during that fiscal year to provide for the purchase of two juvenile doses and two adult doses of 33 34 epinephrine auto-injectors at each public school in this state and if the 35 school does not stock two juvenile doses and two adult doses of 36 epinephrine auto-injectors at the school during that fiscal year.

37 (b) Annual training for all school site personnel on the 38 recognition of anaphylactic shock symptoms and the procedures to follow 39 when anaphylactic shock occurs, following the national guidelines of the 40 American academy of pediatrics. The annual training prescribed in this 41 subdivision is optional during any fiscal year in which sufficient monies are not appropriated by the legislature during that fiscal year to provide 42 for the purchase of two juvenile doses and two adult doses of epinephrine 43 44 auto-injectors at each public school in this state and if the school does

1 not stock two juvenile doses and two adult doses of epinephrine 2 auto-injectors at the school during that fiscal year.

3 (c) Procedures for the administration of epinephrine auto-injectors 4 in emergency situations, as directed on the prescription protocol.

5 (d) Procedures for annually requesting a standing order for 6 epinephrine auto-injectors pursuant to section 15-157 from the chief 7 medical officer of the department of health services, the chief medical 8 officer of a county health department, a doctor of medicine licensed 9 pursuant to title 32, chapter 13 or a doctor of osteopathic medicine 10 licensed pursuant to title 32, chapter 17.

11 (e) Procedures for reporting the use of epinephrine auto-injectors 12 to the department of health services.

13 41. In consultation with the department of education, medical 14 professionals, school health professionals, school administrators and an 15 organization that represents school nurses in this state, adopt rules that 16 prescribe the following for school districts and charter schools that 17 elect to administer inhalers:

18 (a) Annual training in the recognition of respiratory distress 19 symptoms and the procedures to follow when respiratory distress occurs, in 20 accordance with good clinical practice, and the administration of 21 inhalers, as directed on the prescription protocol, by designated medical 22 and nonmedical school personnel.

(b) Requirements for school districts and charter schools that elect to administer inhalers to designate at least two employees at each school to be trained in the recognition of respiratory distress symptoms and the procedures to follow when respiratory distress occurs, in accordance with good clinical practice, and at least two employees at each school to be trained in the administration of inhalers, as directed on the prescription protocol.

30 (c) Procedures for the administration of inhalers in emergency 31 situations, as directed on the prescription protocol.

32 (d) Procedures for annually requesting a standing order for 33 inhalers and spacers or holding chambers pursuant to section 15-158 from 34 the chief medical officer of a county health department, a physician 35 licensed pursuant to title 32, chapter 13 or 17 or a nurse practitioner 36 licensed pursuant to title 32, chapter 15.

37 (e) Procedures for notifying a parent once an inhaler has been38 administered.

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B. The state board of education may:

40 1. Contract.

41 2. Sue and be sued.

42 3. Distribute and score the tests prescribed in chapter 7, article43 3 of this title.

44 4. Provide for an advisory committee to conduct hearings and 45 screenings to determine whether grounds exist to impose disciplinary action against a certificated person, whether grounds exist to reinstate a revoked or surrendered certificate and whether grounds exist to approve or deny an initial application for certification or a request for renewal of a certificate. The board may delegate its responsibility to conduct hearings and screenings to its advisory committee. Hearings shall be conducted pursuant to title 41, chapter 6, article 6.

5. Proceed with the disposal of any complaint requesting
disciplinary action or with any disciplinary action against a person
holding a certificate as prescribed in subsection A, paragraph 14 of this
section after the suspension or expiration of the certificate or surrender
of the certificate by the holder.

6. Assess costs and reasonable attorney fees against a person who files a frivolous complaint or who files a complaint in bad faith. Costs assessed pursuant to this paragraph shall not exceed the expenses incurred by the department of education in the investigation of the complaint.

16 C. Placement decisions of teaching intern certificate holders issued pursuant to subsection A, paragraph 14, subdivision (a) of this 17 18 section and section 15-552 shall be based on agreements between the 19 teacher preparation provider, the provider's partner organizations and the local education agency. The practices of the department of education and the rules and policies of the state board of education may not restrict 20 21 22 placement of teaching intern certification holders based on local 23 education agency instructional models and may only consider the academic 24 quality of the school, the effectiveness of the teaching intern certification holder's on-site mentor and the opportunity for a wide 25 26 variety of schools and school models to access teaching intern 27 certification holders.

28 Sec. 2. Title 15, chapter 5, article 1, Arizona Revised Statutes, 29 is amended by adding section 15-501.01, to read:

30 31 15-501.01. <u>Requirements for teachers; teaching certificates;</u> <u>rules; reciprocity; placement</u>

A. NOTWITHSTANDING ANY OTHER LAW, ALL TEACHERS WHO ARE CERTIFICATED
 PURSUANT TO THIS SECTION MUST HAVE A BACCALAUREATE DEGREE AND A VALID
 FINGERPRINT CLEARANCE CARD.

B. THE STATE BOARD OF EDUCATION SHALL ADOPT RULES FOR THE ISSUANCE
OF THE FOLLOWING TYPES OF CERTIFICATES FOR TEACHERS TO REFLECT THE SOURCE

# Sec. 4. <u>College credit by examination incentive program; menu</u> <u>of assessments</u>

If the department of education determines that the amount of monies 3 required to fulfill each incentive bonus required pursuant to section 4 15-249.06, Arizona Revised Statutes, for fiscal year 2017-2018 is less 5 6 than the total amount of monies appropriated for the college credit by 7 examination incentive program in fiscal year 2017-2018, the department of 8 education shall use any surplus monies appropriated for the college credit 9 by examination incentive program to reimburse local education agencies for 10 the transition to menu of assessments pursuant to Laws 2018, chapter 262, 11 section 6.
