CHAPTER 24
HOUSE BILL 2004

AN ACT

MAKING NUCLEAR EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT FUND ASSESSMENTS; APPROPRIATING
MONIES.

1 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Arizona:

2 Section 1. Appropriations; nuclear emergency management fund;
3 uses

4 Pursuant to sections 26-306.01 and 26-306.02, Arizona Revised
5 Statutes, the sum of \$2,549,792 in fiscal year 2019-2020 and the sum of
6 \$2,576,291 in fiscal year 2020-2021 are appropriated from the nuclear
7 emergency management fund to the following agencies and for the following
8 purposes:

9 1. The sum of \$719,000 and 5.5 FTE positions in fiscal year
10 2019-2020 and the sum of \$749,000 and 5.5 FTE positions in fiscal year
11 2020-2021 to the division of emergency management of the department of
12 emergency and military affairs to use as provided in section 26-306.02,
13 Arizona Revised Statutes.

14 2. The sum of \$789,663 and 5.5 FTE positions in fiscal year
15 2019-2020 and the sum of \$789,663 and 5.5 FTE positions in fiscal year
16 2020-2021 to the department of health services for programs relating to
17 off-site nuclear emergency response plans.

18 3. The sum of \$301,376 and 2.88 FTE positions in fiscal year
19 2019-2020 and the sum of \$280,512 and 2.88 FTE positions in fiscal year
20 2020-2021 to the Arizona department of agriculture for programs relating
21 to off-site nuclear emergency response plans.

22 4. The sum of \$669,753 in fiscal year 2019-2020 and the sum of
23 \$687,116 in fiscal year 2020-2021 to the division of emergency management
24 of the department of emergency and military affairs to disburse to
25 departments and agencies of Maricopa county that are assigned
26 responsibilities under the off-site nuclear emergency response plan.

27 5. The sum of \$70,000 in fiscal year 2019-2020 and the sum of
28 \$70,000 in fiscal year 2020-2021 to the division of emergency management
29 of the department of emergency and military affairs to disburse to
30 departments and agencies of the town of Buckeye that are assigned
31 responsibilities under the off-site nuclear emergency response plan.

32 Sec. 2. Assessments; purpose

33 Pursuant to section 26-306.01, Arizona Revised Statutes, the sum of
34 \$2,549,792 in fiscal year 2019-2020 and the sum of \$2,576,291 in fiscal
35 year 2020-2021, plus any applicable interest, are assessed against each
36 consortium of public service corporations and municipal corporations
37 engaged in constructing or operating a commercial nuclear generating
38 station in this state.

39 Sec. 3. Emergency

40 This act is an emergency measure that is necessary to preserve the
41 public peace, health or safety and is operative immediately as provided by
42 law.
