Bill Number: **SB 1346**

Shope _____ Floor Amendment

Repeals [A.R.S. § 15-716\(C\)](#).

Requires those school districts that deliver instruction on acquired immune deficiency syndrome and the human immunodeficiency virus to provide a description of the course curriculum for this instruction to all parents.

Changes the due date for community colleges to report to Joint Legislative Budget Committee exceptions to their class status requirements for dual enrollment students from October 1 to December 1.

Makes technical and conforming changes to [A.R.S. § 15-716](#) and technical changes to [A.R.S. § 15-1821.01](#).

1 Page 1, between lines 1 and 2, insert:

2 "Section 1. Section 15-716, Arizona Revised Statutes, is amended to
3 read:

4 15-716. Instruction on acquired immune deficiency syndrome:
5 department assistance

6 A. Each common, high and unified school district may provide
7 instruction to PUPILS IN kindergarten programs AND GRADES ONE through ~~the~~
8 ~~twelfth grade~~ TWELVE on acquired immune deficiency syndrome and the human
9 immunodeficiency virus.

10 B. Each SCHOOL district ~~is free to~~ MAY develop its own course of
11 study for each grade. At a minimum, instruction shall:

- 12 1. Be appropriate to the grade level in which it is offered.
13 2. Be medically accurate.
14 3. Promote abstinence.
15 4. Discourage drug abuse.
16 5. Dispel myths regarding transmission of the human immunodeficiency
17 virus.

1 ~~D.~~ C. At the request of a school district, the department of health
2 services or the department of education shall review instruction materials
3 to determine their medical accuracy.

4 ~~F.~~ D. At the request of a school district, the department of
5 education shall provide the following assistance:

- 6 1. A suggested course of study.
- 7 2. Teacher training.
- 8 3. A list of available films and other teaching aids.

9 ~~F.~~ E. At the request of a parent, a pupil shall be excused from
10 instruction on the acquired immune deficiency syndrome and the human
11 immunodeficiency virus as provided in subsection A of this section. The
12 school district shall **PROVIDE A DESCRIPTION OF THE COURSE CURRICULUM TO ALL**
13 **PARENTS AND** notify all parents of their ability to withdraw their child
14 from the instruction."

17 "Sec. 3. Section 15-1821.01, Arizona Revised Statutes, is amended to

19 15-1821.01. Dual enrollment information

20 On a determination by a community college district governing board
21 that it is in the best interest of the citizens of a district, the district
22 governing board may authorize district community colleges to offer college
23 courses that may be counted toward both high school and college graduation
24 requirements at the high school during the school day, subject to the
25 following:

- 26 1. The community college district governing board and the governing
27 board of the school district or organization of which the high school is a
28 part shall enter into an agreement or contract. These intergovernmental
29 agreements or contracts shall be based on a uniform format that has been
30 cooperatively developed by the community college districts in this state.
31 Each of these agreements or contracts shall clearly specify the following:

1 (a) The financial provisions of the agreement or contract and the
2 format for the billing of all services under the agreement or contract,
3 including the amount that the community college received in full-time
4 student equivalent funding pursuant to section 15-1466.01, the portion of
5 the funding that is distributed to the school district governing board or
6 charter school and any amount that is subsequently returned to the
7 community college district by the school district governing board or
8 charter school.

9 (b) Student tuition and financial aid policies, including whether
10 scholarships or grants are awarded to students in dual enrollment courses
11 from the community college.

12 (c) The accountability provisions for each party to the agreement or
13 contract.

14 (d) The responsibilities and services required of each party to the
15 agreement or contract.

16 (e) The type of instruction that will be provided under the
17 agreement or contract, including the titles of the courses to be offered.

18 (f) The quality of the instruction that will be provided under the
19 agreement or contract.

20 2. Students shall be admitted to the community college under the
21 policies adopted by each district, subject to the following:

22 (a) All students WHO ARE enrolled for college credit shall be high
23 school juniors or seniors. All students WHO ARE in the course, including
24 those not electing to enroll for college credit, shall satisfy the
25 prerequisites for the course as published in the college catalog and shall
26 comply with college policies regarding student placement in courses.

27 (b) A community college may waive the class status requirements
28 specified in subdivision (a) of this paragraph for up to twenty-five
29 percent of the students enrolled by a college in courses, ~~provided that~~ IF
30 the community college has established written criteria for waiving the
31 requirements for each course. These criteria shall include a
32 demonstration, by an examination of the specific purposes and requirements

1 of the course, that freshman and sophomore students who meet course
2 prerequisites are prepared to benefit from the college-level course. All
3 exceptions and the justification for the exceptions shall be reported
4 annually to the joint legislative budget committee on or before ~~October~~
5 **DECEMBER** 1.

6 3. The courses shall be previously evaluated and approved through
7 the curriculum approval process of the district, shall be at a higher level
8 than taught by the high school and shall be transferable to a university
9 under the jurisdiction of the Arizona board of regents or be applicable to
10 an established community college occupational degree or certificate
11 program. Physical education courses are not available for dual enrollment
12 purposes.

13 4. College-approved textbooks, syllabuses, course outlines and
14 grading standards that are applicable to the courses if taught at the
15 community college shall apply to these courses and to all students in the
16 courses offered pursuant to this section. The chief executive officer of
17 each community college shall establish an advisory committee of full-time
18 faculty who teach in the disciplines offered at the community college to
19 assist in course selection and implementation in the high schools and to
20 review and report at least annually to the chief executive officer whether
21 the course goals and standards are understood, the course guidelines are
22 followed and the same standards of expectation and assessment are applied
23 to these courses as though they were being offered at the community
24 college. The advisory committee of full-time faculty shall meet at least
25 three times each academic year.

26 5. Each faculty member shall meet the requirements established by
27 the governing board pursuant to section 15-1444. The chief executive
28 officer of each community college district shall establish an advisory
29 committee of full-time faculty who teach in the disciplines offered at the
30 community college district to assist in the selection, orientation, ongoing
31 professional development and evaluation of faculty **WHO ARE** teaching college

1 courses in conjunction with the high schools. The advisory committee of
2 full-time faculty shall meet at least two times each academic year.

3 6. A school district shall ensure that a pupil is a full-time
4 student as defined in section 15-901 and is enrolled in and attending a
5 full-time instructional program at a school in the school district before
6 that pupil is allowed to enroll in a college course pursuant to this
7 section, except that high school seniors who satisfy high school graduation
8 requirements with less than a full-time instructional program are exempt
9 from this paragraph.

10 7. Notwithstanding paragraph 6 of this section, homeschooled
11 students may fully participate in dual enrollment, including receipt of
12 college credit pursuant to this section."
