SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION 1030

A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

PROCLAIMING FEBRUARY 7, 2020 AS WEAR RED DAY IN ARIZONA.

1 Whereas, cardiovascular diseases are the number one killer of women
2 in the United States; and
3 Whereas, cardiovascular diseases kill one woman almost every 80
4 seconds in the United States; and
5 Whereas, nearly eighty percent of cardiovascular diseases may be
6 preventable; and
7 Whereas, many risk factors for heart disease, such as blood
8 pressure, smoking and high cholesterol levels, can be controlled; and
9 Whereas, women are encouraged to commit to making physical activity
10 and healthy eating a priority to improve their health; and
11 Whereas, the American Heart Association's Go Red for Women movement
12 motivates women to learn their family history and to meet with a health
13 care provider to determine their risk for cardiovascular disease and
14 stroke; and
15 Whereas, Go Red for Women encourages women to take charge of their
16 heart health by knowing their total cholesterol, HDL (good) cholesterol,
17 blood pressure, blood sugar and body mass index; and
18 Whereas, events such as National Wear Red Day are vitally important
19 in the ongoing fight against heart disease and stroke through their
20 efforts to increase awareness and speak out about heart disease and to
21 empower women to reduce their risk for cardiovascular disease.
22 Therefore
23 Be it resolved by the Senate of the State of Arizona, the House of
24 Representatives concurring:
25 That the Members of the Legislature proclaim February 7, 2020 as
26 Wear Red Day in Arizona and encourage all citizens to show their support
27 for women and the fight against heart disease by wearing the color red on
28 this day.
