AMENDING SECTION 36-401, ARIZONA REVISED STATUTES; AMENDING TITLE 36, CHAPTER 4, ARTICLE 2, ARIZONA REVISED STATUTES, BY ADDING SECTION 36-425.07; AMENDING SECTIONS 36-551, 36-557, 36-568, 36-591 AND 36-595.01, ARIZONA REVISED STATUTES; RELATING TO HEALTH CARE INSTITUTIONS.

1 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Arizona:

2 Section 1. Section 36-401, Arizona Revised Statutes, is amended to
3 read:

4 **36-401. Definitions: adult foster care**

5 A. In this chapter, unless the context otherwise requires:

6 1. "Accredited health care institution" means a health care
7 institution, other than a hospital, that is currently accredited by a
8 nationally recognized accreditation organization.

9 2. "Accredited hospital" means a hospital that is currently
10 accredited by a nationally recognized organization on hospital
11 accreditation.

12 3. "Adult behavioral health therapeutic home" means a residence for
13 individuals who are at least eighteen years of age, have behavioral health
14 issues and need behavioral health services that does all of the following
15 for those individuals:

16 (a) Provides room and board.

17 (b) Assists in acquiring daily living skills.

18 (c) Coordinates transportation to scheduled appointments.

19 (d) Monitors behaviors.

20 (e) Assists in the self-administration of medication.

21 (f) Provides feedback to case managers related to behavior.

22 4. "Adult day health care facility" means a facility that provides
23 adult day health services during a portion of a continuous
24 twenty-four-hour period for compensation on a regular basis for five or
25 more adults who are not related to the proprietor.

26 5. "Adult day health services" means a program that provides
27 planned care supervision and activities, personal care, personal living
28 skills training, meals and health monitoring in a group setting during a
29 portion of a continuous twenty-four-hour period. Adult day health
30 services may also include preventive, therapeutic and restorative
31 health-related services that do not include behavioral health services.

32 6. "Adult foster care home" means a residential setting that
33 provides room and board and adult foster care services for at least one
34 and no more than four adults who are participants in the Arizona long-term
35 care system pursuant to chapter 29, article 2 of this title or contracts
36 for services with the United States department of veterans affairs and in
37 which the sponsor or the manager resides with the residents and integrates
38 the residents who are receiving adult foster care into that person's
39 family.

40 7. "Adult foster care services" means supervision, assistance with
41 eating, bathing, toileting, dressing, self-medication and other routines
42 of daily living or services authorized by rules adopted pursuant to
43 section 36-405 and section 36-2939, subsection C.

44 8. "Assisted living center" means an assisted living facility that
45 provides resident rooms or residential units to eleven or more residents.

1 9. "Assisted living facility" means a residential care institution,
2 including an adult foster care home, that provides or contracts to provide
3 supervisory care services, personal care services or directed care
4 services on a continuous basis.

5 10. "Assisted living home" means an assisted living facility that
6 provides resident rooms to ten or fewer residents.

7 11. "Behavioral health services" means services that pertain to
8 mental health and substance use disorders and that are either:

9 (a) Performed by or under the supervision of a professional who is
10 licensed pursuant to title 32 and whose scope of practice allows for the
11 provision of these services.

12 (b) Performed on behalf of patients by behavioral health staff as
13 prescribed by rule.

14 12. "Construction" means the building, erection, fabrication or
15 installation of a health care institution.

16 13. "Continuous" means available at all times without cessation,
17 break or interruption.

18 14. "Controlling person" means a person who:

19 (a) Through ownership, has the power to vote at least ten percent
20 of the outstanding voting securities.

21 (b) If the applicant or licensee is a partnership, is the general
22 partner or a limited partner who holds at least ten percent of the voting
23 rights of the partnership.

24 (c) If the applicant or licensee is a corporation, an association
25 or a limited liability company, is the president, the chief executive
26 officer, the incorporator or any person who owns or controls at least ten
27 percent of the voting securities. For the purposes of this subdivision,
28 corporation does not include nonprofit corporations.

29 (d) Holds a beneficial interest in ten percent or more of the
30 liabilities of the applicant or the licensee.

31 15. "Department" means the department of health services.

32 16. "Directed care services" means programs and services, including
33 supervisory and personal care services, that are provided to persons who
34 are incapable of recognizing danger, summoning assistance, expressing need
35 or making basic care decisions.

36 17. "Direction" means authoritative policy or procedural guidance
37 for the accomplishment of a function or activity.

38 18. "Director" means the director of the department of health
39 services.

40 19. "Facilities" means buildings that are used by a health care
41 institution for providing any of the types of services as defined in this
42 chapter.

43 20. "Freestanding urgent care center":

44 (a) Means an outpatient treatment center that, regardless of its
45 posted or advertised name, meets any of the following requirements:

(i) Is open twenty-four hours a day, excluding at its option weekends or certain holidays, but is not licensed as a hospital.

(ii) Claims to provide unscheduled medical services not otherwise routinely available in primary care physician offices.

(iii) By its posted or advertised name, gives the impression to the public that it provides medical care for urgent, immediate or emergency conditions.

(iv) Routinely provides ongoing unscheduled medical services for more than eight consecutive hours for an individual patient.

(b) Does not include the following:

(i) A medical facility that is licensed under a hospital's license and that uses the hospital's medical provider number.

(ii) A qualifying community health center pursuant to section 36-2907.06.

(iii) Any other health care institution licensed pursuant to this chapter.

(iv) A physician's office that offers extended hours or same-day appointments to existing and new patients and that does not meet the requirements of subdivision (a), item (i), (iii) or (iv) of this paragraph.

21. "Governing authority" means the individual, agency, partners, group or corporation, appointed, elected or otherwise designated, in which the ultimate responsibility and authority for the conduct of the health care institution are vested.

22. "Health care institution" means every place, institution, building or agency, whether organized for profit or not, that provides facilities with medical services, nursing services, behavioral health services, health screening services, other health-related services, supervisory care services, personal care services or directed care services and includes home health agencies as defined in section 36-151, outdoor behavioral health care programs and hospice service agencies. Health care institution does not include a community residential setting as defined in section 36-551.

23. "Health-related services" means services, other than medical, that pertain to general supervision, protective, preventive and personal care services, supervisory care services or directed care services.

24. "Health screening services" means the acquisition, analysis and delivery of health-related data of individuals to aid in the determination of the need for medical services.

25. "Hospice" means a hospice service agency or the provision of hospice services in an inpatient facility.

26. "Hospice service" means a program of palliative and supportive care for terminally ill persons and their families or caregivers.

1 27. "Hospice service agency" means an agency or organization, or a
2 subdivision of that agency or organization, that is engaged in providing
3 hospice services at the place of residence of its clients.

4 28. "Inpatient beds" or "resident beds" means accommodations with
5 supporting services, such as food, laundry and housekeeping, for patients
6 or residents who generally stay in excess of twenty-four hours.

7 29. "Intermediate care facility for individuals with intellectual
8 disabilities" has the same meaning prescribed in section 36-551.

9 30. "Licensed capacity" means the total number of persons for whom
10 the health care institution is authorized by the department to provide
11 services as required pursuant to this chapter if the person is expected to
12 stay in the health care institution for more than twenty-four hours. For
13 a hospital, licensed capacity means only those beds specified on the
14 hospital license.

15 31. "Medical services" means the services that pertain to medical
16 care and that are performed at the direction of a physician on behalf of
17 patients by physicians, dentists, nurses and other professional and
18 technical personnel.

19 32. "Modification" means the substantial improvement, enlargement,
20 reduction or alteration of or other change in a health care institution.

21 33. "Nonproprietary institution" means any health care institution
22 that is organized and operated exclusively for charitable purposes, no
23 part of the net earnings of which inures to the benefit of any private
24 shareholder or individual, or that is operated by the state or any
25 political subdivision of the state.

26 34. "Nursing care institution" means a health care institution that
27 provides inpatient beds or resident beds and nursing services to persons
28 who need continuous nursing services but who do not require hospital care
29 or direct daily care from a physician.

30 35. "Nursing services" means those services that pertain to the
31 curative, restorative and preventive aspects of nursing care and that are
32 performed at the direction of a physician by or under the supervision of a
33 registered nurse licensed in this state.

34 36. **"NURSING SUPPORTED GROUP HOME" MEANS A HEALTH CARE INSTITUTION
35 IN A COMMUNITY RESIDENTIAL SETTING FOR NOT MORE THAN SIX PERSONS WITH
36 DEVELOPMENTAL DISABILITIES THAT IS OPERATED BY A SERVICE PROVIDER UNDER
37 CONTRACT WITH THE DEPARTMENT OF ECONOMIC SECURITY AND THAT PROVIDES ROOM
38 AND BOARD, DAILY HABILITATION AND CONTINUOUS NURSING SUPPORT AND
39 INTERVENTION.**

40 37. "Organized medical staff" means a formal organization of
41 physicians, and dentists where appropriate, with the delegated authority
42 and responsibility to maintain proper standards of medical care and to
43 plan for continued betterment of that care.

44 38. "Outdoor behavioral health care program" means an agency
45 that provides behavioral health services in an outdoor environment as an

1 alternative to behavioral health services that are provided in a health
2 care institution with facilities. Outdoor behavioral health care programs
3 do not include:

4 (a) Programs, facilities or activities that are operated by a
5 government entity or that are licensed by the department as a child care
6 program pursuant to chapter 7.1 of this title.

7 (b) Outdoor activities for youth that are designated to be
8 primarily recreational and that are organized by church groups, scouting
9 organizations or similar groups.

10 (c) Outdoor youth programs licensed by the department of economic
11 security.

12 **39.** **39.** "Personal care services" means assistance with activities
13 of daily living that can be performed by persons without professional
14 skills or professional training and includes the coordination or provision
15 of intermittent nursing services and the administration of medications and
16 treatments by a nurse who is licensed pursuant to title 32, chapter 15 or
17 as otherwise provided by law.

18 **39.** **40.** "Physician" means any person who is licensed pursuant to
19 title 32, chapter 13 or 17.

20 **40.** **41.** "Recidivism reduction services" means services that are
21 delivered by an adult residential care institution to its residents to
22 encourage lawful behavior and to discourage or prevent residents who are
23 suspected of, charged with or convicted of one or more criminal offenses,
24 or whose mental health and substance use can be reasonably expected to
25 place them at risk for the future threat of prosecution, diversion or
26 incarceration, from engaging in future unlawful behavior.

27 **41.** **42.** "Recidivism reduction staff" means a person who provides
28 recidivism reduction services.

29 **42.** **43.** "Residential care institution" means a health care
30 institution other than a hospital or a nursing care institution that
31 provides resident beds or residential units, supervisory care services,
32 personal care services, behavioral health services, directed care services
33 or health-related services for persons who do not need continuous nursing
34 services.

35 **43.** **44.** "Residential unit" means a private apartment, unless
36 otherwise requested by a resident, that includes a living and sleeping
37 space, kitchen area, private bathroom and storage area.

38 **44.** **45.** "Respite care services" means services that are provided
39 by a licensed health care institution to persons otherwise cared for in
40 foster homes and in private homes to provide an interval of rest or relief
41 of not more than thirty days to operators of foster homes or to family
42 members.

43 **45.** **46.** "Substantial compliance" means that the nature or number
44 of violations revealed by any type of inspection or investigation of a

1 health care institution does not pose a direct risk to the life, health or
2 safety of patients or residents.

3 ~~46.~~ 47. "Supervision" means direct overseeing and inspection of
4 the act of accomplishing a function or activity.

5 ~~47.~~ 48. "Supervisory care services" means general supervision,
6 including daily awareness of resident functioning and continuing needs,
7 the ability to intervene in a crisis and assistance in the
8 self-administration of prescribed medications.

9 ~~48.~~ 49. "Temporary license" means a license that is issued by the
10 department to operate a class or subclass of a health care institution at
11 a specific location and that is valid until an initial licensing
12 inspection.

13 ~~49.~~ 50. "Unscheduled medical services" means medically necessary
14 periodic health care services that are unanticipated or cannot reasonably
15 be anticipated and that require medical evaluation or treatment before the
16 next business day.

17 B. If there are fewer than four Arizona long-term care system
18 participants receiving adult foster care in an adult foster care home,
19 nonparticipating adults may receive other types of services that are
20 authorized by law to be provided in the adult foster care home as long as
21 the number of adults served, including the Arizona long-term care system
22 participants, does not exceed four.

23 C. Nursing care services may be provided by the adult foster care
24 licensee if the licensee is a nurse who is licensed pursuant to title 32,
25 chapter 15 and the services are limited to those allowed pursuant to law.
26 The licensee shall keep a record of nursing services rendered.

27 Sec. 2. Title 36, chapter 4, article 2, Arizona Revised Statutes,
28 is amended by adding section 36-425.07, to read:

29 36-425.07. Nursing supported group homes: licensure

30 ON OR BEFORE JULY 1, 2021, A NURSING SUPPORTED GROUP HOME THAT IS
31 OPERATED IN THIS STATE BY THE DEPARTMENT OF ECONOMIC SECURITY OR A PRIVATE
32 ENTITY SHALL BE LICENSED PURSUANT TO THIS CHAPTER.

33 Sec. 3. Section 36-551, Arizona Revised Statutes, is amended to
34 read:

35 36-551. Definitions

36 In this chapter, unless the context otherwise requires:

37 1. "Adaptive behavior" means the effectiveness or degree to which
38 the individual meets the standards of personal independence and social
39 responsibility expected of the person's age and cultural group.

40 2. "Adult developmental home" means a residential setting in a
41 family home in which the care, physical custody and supervision of the
42 adult client are the responsibility, under a twenty-four-hour care model,
43 of the licensee who, in that capacity, is not an employee of the division
44 or of a service provider and the home provides the following services for
45 a group of siblings or up to three adults with developmental disabilities:

- (a) Room and board.
- (b) Habilitation.
- (c) Appropriate personal care.
- (d) Appropriate supervision.

3. "Adult household member":

- (a) Means a person who is at least eighteen years of age and who resides in an adult developmental home, child developmental home or other home and community based service setting for at least thirty days or who resides in the household throughout the year for more than a cumulative total of thirty days.
- (b) Does not include a person who is receiving developmental disabilities services from the department.

4. "Advisory council" means the developmental disabilities advisory council.

5. "Arizona training program facility" means a state-operated institution for clients of the department with developmental disabilities.

6. "Attributable to cognitive disability, epilepsy, cerebral palsy or autism" means that there is a causal relationship between the presence of an impairing condition and the developmental disability.

7. "Autism" means a condition characterized by severe disorders in communication and behavior resulting in limited ability to communicate, understand, learn and participate in social relationships.

8. "Case management" means coordinating the assistance needed by persons with developmental disabilities and their families in order to ensure that persons with developmental disabilities attain their maximum potential for independence, productivity and integration into the community.

9. "Case manager" means a person who coordinates the implementation of the individual program plan of goals, objectives and appropriate services for persons with developmental disabilities.

10. "Cerebral palsy" means a permanently disabling condition resulting from damage to the developing brain that may occur before, after or during birth and that results in loss or impairment of control over voluntary muscles.

11. "Child developmental certified home" means a regular foster home as defined in section 8-501 that is licensed pursuant to section 8-509 and that is certified by the department pursuant to section 36-593.01.

12. "Child developmental home" means a residential setting in a family home in which the care and supervision of the child are the responsibility, under a twenty-four-hour care model, of the licensee who serves as the developmental home provider of the child in the home setting and who, in that capacity, is not an employee of the division or of a service provider and the home provides the following services for a group of siblings or up to three children with developmental disabilities:

- (a) Room and board.
- (b) Habilitation.
- (c) Appropriate personal care.
- (d) Appropriate supervision.

13. "Client" means a person receiving developmental disabilities services from the department.

14. "Cognitive disability" means a condition that involves subaverage general intellectual functioning, that exists concurrently with deficits in adaptive behavior manifested before the age of eighteen and that is sometimes referred to as intellectual disability.

15. "Community residential setting" means a residential setting in which persons with developmental disabilities live and are provided with appropriate supervision by the service provider responsible for the operation of the residential setting. Community residential setting includes a child developmental home or an adult developmental home operated or contracted by the department or the department's contracted vendor or a group home **OR NURSING SUPPORTED GROUP HOME** operated or contracted by the department.

16. "Consent" means voluntary informed consent. Consent is voluntary if not given as the result of coercion or undue influence. Consent is informed if the person giving the consent has been informed of and comprehends the nature, purpose, consequences, risks and benefits of the alternatives to the procedure, and has been informed and comprehends that withholding or withdrawal of consent will not prejudice the future provision of care and services to the client. In cases of unusual or hazardous treatment procedures performed pursuant to section 36-561, subsection A, experimental research, organ transplantation and nontherapeutic surgery, consent is informed if, in addition to the foregoing, the person giving the consent has been informed of and comprehends the method to be used in the proposed procedure.

17. "Daily habilitation" means habilitation as defined in this section except that the method of payment is for one unit per residential day.

18. "Department" means the department of economic security.

19. "Developmental disability" means either a strongly demonstrated potential that a child under six years of age has a developmental disability or will develop a developmental disability, as determined by a test performed pursuant to section 36-694 or by other appropriate tests, or a severe, chronic disability that:

- (a) Is attributable to cognitive disability, cerebral palsy, epilepsy or autism.
- (b) Is manifested before the age of eighteen.
- (c) Is likely to continue indefinitely.
- (d) Results in substantial functional limitations in three or more of the following areas of major life activity:

- (i) Self-care.
- (ii) Receptive and expressive language.
- (iii) Learning.
- (iv) Mobility.
- (v) Self-direction.
- (vi) Capacity for independent living.
- (vii) Economic self-sufficiency.

(e) Reflects the need for a combination and sequence of individually planned or coordinated special, interdisciplinary or generic care, treatment or other services that are of lifelong or extended duration.

20. "Director" means the director of the department of economic security.

21. "Division" means the division of developmental disabilities in the department of economic security.

22. "Epilepsy" means a neurological condition characterized by abnormal electrical-chemical discharge in the brain. This discharge is manifested in various forms of physical activities called seizures.

23. "Group home" means a community residential setting for not more than six persons with developmental disabilities that is operated by a service provider under contract with the department and that provides room and board and daily habilitation and other assessed medically necessary services and supports to meet the needs of each person. Group home does not include an adult developmental home, a child developmental home or an intermediate care facility for individuals with intellectual disabilities.

24. "Guardian" means the person who, under court order, is appointed to fulfill the powers and duties prescribed in section 14-5312. Guardian does not include a guardian pursuant to section 14-5312.01.

25. "Habilitation" means the process by which a person is assisted to acquire and maintain those life skills that enable the person to cope more effectively with personal and environmental demands and to raise the level of the person's physical, mental and social efficiency.

26. "Indigent" means a person with a developmental disability whose estate or parent is unable to bear the full cost of maintaining or providing services for that person in a developmental disabilities program.

27. "Individual program plan" means a written statement of services to be provided to a person with developmental disabilities, including habilitation goals and objectives, that is developed following initial placement evaluation and revised after periodic evaluations.

28. "Intermediate care facility for individuals with intellectual disabilities" means a facility that primarily provides health and rehabilitative services to persons with developmental disabilities that are above the service level of room and board or supervisory care services or personal care services as defined in section 36-401.

1 29. "Large group setting" means a setting that in addition to
2 residential care provides support services such as therapy, recreation and
3 transportation to seven or more persons with developmental disabilities
4 who require intensive supervision.

5 30. "Least restrictive alternative" means an available program or
6 facility that fosters independent living, that is the least confining for
7 the client's condition and where service and treatment are provided in the
8 least intrusive manner reasonably and humanely appropriate to the
9 individual's needs.

10 31. "Likely to continue indefinitely" means that the developmental
11 disability has a reasonable likelihood of continuing for a protracted
12 period of time or for life.

13 32. "Manifested before the age of eighteen" means that the
14 disability must be apparent and have a substantially limiting effect on a
15 person's functioning before the age of eighteen.

16 33. "NURSING SUPPORTED GROUP HOME" HAS THE SAME MEANING PRESCRIBED
17 IN SECTION 36-401.

18 ~~33.~~ 34. "Physician" means a person who is licensed to practice
19 pursuant to title 32, chapter 13 or 17.

20 ~~34.~~ 35. "Placement evaluation" means an interview and evaluation
21 of a person with a developmental disability and a review of the person's
22 prior medical and program histories to determine the appropriate
23 developmental disability programs and services for the person and
24 recommendations for specific program placements for the person.

25 ~~35.~~ 36. "Psychologist" means a person who is licensed pursuant to
26 title 32, chapter 19.1.

27 ~~36.~~ 37. "Respite services" means services that provide a
28 short-term or long-term interval of rest or relief to the care provider of
29 a person with a developmental disability.

30 ~~37.~~ 38. "Responsible person" means the parent or guardian of a
31 minor with a developmental disability, the guardian of an adult with a
32 developmental disability or an adult with a developmental disability who
33 is a client or an applicant for whom no guardian has been appointed.

34 ~~38.~~ 39. "Service provider" means a person or agency that provides
35 services to clients pursuant to a contract, service agreement or qualified
36 vendor agreement with the division.

37 ~~39.~~ 40. "State operated service center" means a state owned or
38 leased facility that is operated by the department and that provides
39 temporary residential care and space for child and adult services that
40 include respite care, crisis intervention and diagnostic evaluation.

41 ~~40.~~ 41. "Subaverage general intellectual functioning" means
42 measured intelligence on standardized psychometric instruments of two or
43 more standard deviations below the mean for the tests used.

44 ~~41.~~ 42. "Substantial functional limitation" means a limitation so
45 severe that extraordinary assistance from other people, programs, services

1 or mechanical devices is required to assist the person in performing
2 appropriate major life activities.

3 ~~42.~~ 43. "Supervision" means the process by which the activities of
4 an individual with developmental disabilities are directed, influenced or
5 monitored.

6 Sec. 4. Section 36-557, Arizona Revised Statutes, is amended to
7 read:

8 36-557. *Community developmental disability services: service*
9 *providers*

10 A. The department may use state and federal monies appropriated or
11 otherwise available to it for this purpose to assist in the establishment
12 and maintenance of local developmental disability services by public or
13 private nonprofit or profit agencies. The monies may be expended as
14 professional fees for service, in contracts for advancement or
15 reimbursement or in another appropriate manner and may be used for any
16 purpose necessary to the provision of local developmental disability
17 services. The monies may not be used for departmental salaries, care of
18 persons with developmental disabilities by the department or any other
19 purpose within the department, but may be used for consultation to the
20 department in the interest of local programs.

21 B. A local public or private nonprofit or profit agency providing
22 or intending to provide community developmental disability services and
23 desiring to contract with the department for the furnishing of these
24 services shall submit a program plan and budget to the department on the
25 forms and in the manner required by the department. If the program meets
26 departmental standards and is consistent with the state plan of the
27 department and the individualized service program plan of the client, the
28 department, notwithstanding the provisions of title 41, chapter 23,
29 relating to procurement and including services pursuant to section
30 36-2943, may contract with that agency for required services on terms the
31 department requires. The contracts shall provide that the provider of
32 services is subject to a continuing program evaluation by the department
33 through progress reports, expenditure reports, program audits or other
34 appropriate evaluation techniques to assure that the provider of service
35 is in continued compliance with the terms of the contract and the
36 department's community developmental disability service standards and
37 requirements.

38 C. Contracts between the department and a school district or
39 districts are subject to approval by the department of education.

40 D. This article does not make the department or the state
41 responsible for funding programs beyond the limits of legislative
42 appropriation for the programs. This article does not require a provider
43 of services to provide unreimbursed services to the department or its
44 clients.

1 E. Contracts to provide community developmental disability services
2 shall require that:

3 1. The contractor is obligated to operate a program or service in
4 strict accordance with the standards adopted for that program or service
5 by the department.

6 2. If state funding is provided for a particular program the
7 contractor, to the extent of positions available that are being purchased
8 by the department, shall provide services to a client with a developmental
9 disability who has been evaluated and placed by the department.

10 3. All contractors must carry liability insurance in amounts
11 approved by the risk management division of the department of
12 administration and file proof of insurance with the risk management
13 division. The director may waive that requirement on a case by case basis
14 on a finding that insurance for the program or service is not practicably
15 available at affordable rates and that it is necessary that the program or
16 service be provided by the contractor.

17 4. All clients enrolled in programs have all the same specified
18 rights as they would have if enrolled in a program operated directly by
19 the state.

20 5. Except for emergency placement pursuant to section 36-560,
21 subsection N, payment shall not be made based on program services provided
22 to a client if a placement evaluation has not been made, and no individual
23 program has been prepared and when, based on that placement evaluation, no
24 recommendation has been made to enroll the client in the particular
25 program service.

26 F. This article does not require a contracted agency to provide
27 unreimbursed services to the department or a client of the department.

28 G. Contracts for the purchase of residential care services other
29 than those community residential settings licensed pursuant to this
30 chapter, in addition to other general requirements applicable to purchase
31 of care contractors, shall:

32 1. Provide for mandatory inspection by the department every two
33 years for facilities other than group homes.

34 2. Provide for mandatory monitoring by the department for health,
35 safety, contractual and programmatic standards at least every six months,
36 unless the department has granted deemed status to the service provider or
37 the service provider received a score of at least ninety-five percent on
38 the most recent monitoring visit. If the department has granted deemed
39 status or awarded the service provider with a score of at least
40 ninety-five percent on the most recent monitoring visit, it shall monitor
41 that provider once each year. On determination by the department that
42 there is reasonable cause to believe a service provider is not adhering to
43 the department's programmatic or contractual requirements, the department
44 and any duly designated employee or agent of the department may enter on
45 and into the premises at any reasonable time for the purpose of

1 determining the state of compliance with the programmatic or contractual
2 requirements of the department.

3 3. Provide for mandatory investigation by the department in
4 response to complaints within ten working days, except that in those
5 instances that pose a danger to the client, the department shall conduct
6 the investigation immediately. Health and safety complaints related to
7 group homes shall be referred to the department of health services on
8 receipt. The department of health services shall share all incident
9 reports related to health and safety with the division of developmental
10 disabilities.

11 4. Except for group homes licensed by the department of health
12 services, specify the health and safety and sanitation codes and other
13 codes or standards applicable to the facility or to the operation of the
14 facility by the contractor other than group homes.

15 5. Provide for mandatory periodic reports to be filed by the
16 provider contractor with the department with respect to the operation of
17 the facility.

18 6. Provide that the facility and the books and records of the
19 facility and of the provider are subject to inspection at any time by
20 employees of the department or designees of the department.

21 7. Provide that parents and guardians of persons with developmental
22 disabilities residing at the facility, members of the developmental
23 disabilities advisory council, and members of other recognized and ongoing
24 advocacy groups for persons with developmental disabilities may inspect
25 the facility at reasonable times.

26 H. Contracts for the purchase of residential care services shall
27 require a community residential setting to be licensed pursuant to this
28 chapter other than group homes **AND NURSING SUPPORTED GROUP HOMES** licensed
29 by the department of health services.

30 I. Contracts for the purchase of day program or employment
31 services, in addition to the other general requirements applicable to the
32 purchase of client services, must provide for mandatory monitoring by the
33 department for health, safety, contractual, programmatic and quality
34 assurance standards at least once every six months, unless the department
35 has granted deemed status to the service provider. If the department has
36 granted deemed status to the service provider, the department shall
37 monitor that provider once each year. The department and any duly
38 designated employee or agent of the department may enter on or into the
39 service provider's premises at any reasonable time for the purpose of
40 determining the state of compliance with the department's programmatic,
41 contractual and quality assurance requirements.

42 J. The division shall ensure that all contracted developmental
43 disabilities service providers rendering services pursuant to this chapter
44 are reimbursed in accordance with title XIX of the social security act.

1 K. Contracts for client services issued by the department shall
2 include language outlining the provisions for a grievance and appeal
3 procedure. The director shall provide notice to providers not less than
4 thirty days before the issuance of an amendment to a qualified vendor
5 agreement. The decision of the director regarding qualified vendor
6 agreement amendments may be appealed pursuant to title 41, chapter 6,
7 article 10. The grievance process applicable to these contracts shall
8 comply with title XIX requirements.

9 L. As a condition of contracts with any developmental disabilities
10 service provider, the director shall require terms that conform with state
11 and federal laws, title XIX statutes and regulations and quality
12 standards. The director shall further require contract terms that ensure
13 performance by the provider of the provisions of each contract executed
14 pursuant to this article.

15 M. The division shall establish a rate structure that ensures an
16 equitable funding basis for private nonprofit or for profit agencies for
17 services pursuant to subsection B of this section and section 36-2943. In
18 each fiscal year, the division shall review and adjust the rate structure
19 based on section 36-2959. A rate book shall be published and updated by
20 the division to announce the rate structure that shall be incorporated by
21 reference in contracts for client services.

22 N. The division shall disclose to a service provider in the
23 individual program plan, and in all meetings resulting from a response to
24 a vendor call, any historical and behavioral information necessary for the
25 provider to be able to anticipate the client's future behaviors and needs,
26 including summary information from the program review committee, unusual
27 incident reports reviewed by the independent oversight committee and
28 behavioral treatment plans. The division shall redact the client's
29 identification from this information.

30 O. Service providers are authorized to engage in the following
31 activities in accordance with a client's individual program plan:

32 1. Administer medications, including assisting with the client's
33 self-administration of medications.

34 2. Log, store, remove and dispose of medications.

35 3. Maintain medications and protocols for direct care.

36 4. Serve as the client's representative payee if requested by the
37 client or the client's guardian and approved by the payer.

38 P. The department may adopt rules establishing procedures for
39 engaging in the activities listed in subsection O of this section.

40 Q. To protect the health and safety of a client, a provider must
41 notify the division within twenty-four hours if an emergency situation
42 exists in which the provider is unable to meet the health or safety needs
43 of the client.

44 R. On notification of an emergency situation, the department shall
45 hold an individual program plan meeting within fifteen days after

1 notification to recommend any changes, including whether there is a need
2 for temporary additional staffing to provide appropriate care for a
3 client, and develop a plan within thirty days after notification to
4 resolve the situation.

9 A. A service provider that operates a group home, **A NURSING**
10 **SUPPORTED GROUP HOME** or an intermediate care facility for persons with ~~an~~
11 intellectual ~~disability~~ **DISABILITIES** may install, oversee and monitor
12 electronic monitoring devices in common areas, including hallways, of the
13 group home, **NURSING SUPPORTED GROUP HOME** or intermediate care facility.
14 The service provider may contract with a third party to install, oversee
15 and monitor the electronic monitoring device.

16 B. The director shall adopt rules regarding the use of electronic
17 monitoring in group homes and intermediate care facilities that include at
18 a minimum:

19 1. Consent requirements consistent with section 13-3019.

20 2. Public disclosure that an electronic monitoring device is in use
21 on the property.

22 3. The maintenance, storage and retention schedule of the
23 electronic record.

24 4. Who may access the electronic record and under what
25 circumstances.

26 5. How confidentiality and privacy are maintained.

27 6. How often the electronic monitoring device is monitored or
28 reviewed by the service provider or the service provider's designee.

29 7. Ensuring that all staff who have access to the electronic record
30 are properly trained in the facility policies and the protection of client
31 rights.

32 8. Ensuring that adherence to the facility policies is monitored
33 and the risks or breaches of the facility policies are promptly addressed.

34 C. The rules adopted pursuant to subsection B of this section may
35 not:

36 1. Prohibit accessing the electronic record from the service
37 provider, the member or the member's family or guardian unless the
38 electronic record contains evidence of a suspected criminal offense.

39 2. Require a service provider to be financially responsible for
40 purchasing, installing, maintaining or monitoring an electronic monitoring
41 device that is not voluntarily installed by the service provider in the
42 group home or intermediate care facility.

43 D. If a service provider has installed and uses an electronic
44 monitoring device before August 27, 2019, the service provider shall
45 establish policies consistent with rules adopted pursuant to subsection B

1 of this section and submit the policies to the department within ninety
2 days after the rules are adopted.

3 E. For the purposes of this section, "electronic monitoring
4 device":

5 1. Means a video surveillance camera or audio device that is
6 installed in a common area, including a hallway, of a group home or

10 electronic communications.

36 E. The division shall ensure that state-operated residential
37 settings that are owned or leased facilities operated by the division meet
38 the same standards as group homes unless they are required to be:

39 1. Licensed and certified as intermediate care facilities for
40 individuals with intellectual disabilities pursuant to 42 Code of Federal
41 Regulations part 483, subpart I. An intermediate care facility for
42 individuals with intellectual disabilities that is operated by the
43 division or a private entity is required to be licensed pursuant to
44 chapter 4 of this title and certified pursuant to 42 Code of Federal
45 Regulations part 483, subpart I.

1 2. LICENSED AS A NURSING SUPPORTED GROUP HOME AS REQUIRED BY
2 CHAPTER 4 OF THIS TITLE.

3 F. The department shall annually visit each adult developmental
4 home and child developmental home and inspect the premises used for the
5 care of children or vulnerable adults for sanitation, fire and other
6 actual and potential hazards. The department shall take any action it
7 deems necessary to carry out the duties imposed by this section, including
8 the denial of the application for licensure and the suspension or
9 revocation of the home's license.

10 Sec. 7. Section 36-595.01, Arizona Revised Statutes, is amended to

13 A group home, **NURSING SUPPORTED GROUP HOME**, adult developmental home

23 Sec. 8. Department of health services; rulemaking exemption

24 For the purposes of this act, the department of health services is
25 exempt from the rulemaking requirements of title 41, chapters 6 and 6.1,
26 Arizona Revised Statutes, for eighteen months after the general effective
27 date of the fifty-fourth legislature, second regular session.

29 This act, except for section 36-401, Arizona Revised Statutes, as
