FACT SHEET FOR H.B. 2757

traffic survival school; online prohibited

Purpose

Requires traffic survival school courses to be completed in person unless a state of emergency has been declared by the Governor and the Arizona Department of Transportation (ADOT) determines that the emergency prevents courses from being offered safely in person.

Background

Current statute states that rules adopted by the Director of ADOT (Director) shall state the requirements for a school license, including requirements concerning location, equipment, courses of instruction, instructors, previous records of the school and instructors, character and reputation of the operators and instructors, insurance in an amount that the Director deems necessary to adequately protect the interests of the public and other matters prescribed by the Director ([A.R.S. § 28-3413](#)).

There is no anticipated fiscal impact to the state General Fund associated with this legislation.

Provisions

1. Prohibits traffic survival school courses of instruction from being offered online unless:
 - a) a state of emergency has been declared by the Governor; and
 - b) ADOT determines that the emergency prevents courses from being offered safely in person.
2. Makes technical changes.
3. Becomes effective on the general effective date.
