## AN ACT

AMENDING SECTIONS 15-901 AND 15-943, ARIZONA REVISED STATUTES; AMENDING TITLE 15, CHAPTER 9, ARTICLE 3, ARIZONA REVISED STATUTES, BY ADDING SECTION 15-943.05; RELATING TO EDUCATION FINANCE.

1 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Arizona: 2 Section 1. Section 15-901, Arizona Revised Statutes, is amended to 3 read: 4 15-901. Definitions 5 A. In this title, unless the context otherwise requires: 6 1. "Average daily membership" means the total enrollment of 7 fractional students and full-time students, minus withdrawals, of each 8 school day through the first one hundred days or two hundred days in 9

session, as applicable, for the current year. Withdrawals include students who are formally withdrawn from schools and students who are 10 11 absent for ten consecutive school days, except for excused absences identified by the department of education. For the purposes of this 12 13 section, school districts and charter schools shall report student absence data to the department of education at least once every sixty days in 14 session. For computation purposes, the effective date of withdrawal shall 15 16 be retroactive to the last day of actual attendance of the student or 17 excused absence.

(a) "Fractional student" means:

19 (i) For common schools, a preschool child who is enrolled in a 20 program for preschool children with disabilities of at least three hundred 21 sixty minutes each week that meets at least two hundred sixteen hours over 22 the minimum number of days or a kindergarten student who is at least five 23 years of age before January 1 of the school year and enrolled in a school 24 kindergarten program that meets at least three hundred fifty-six hours for one hundred eighty-day school year, or the instructional hours 25 а 26 prescribed in this section. In computing the average daily membership, preschool children with disabilities and kindergarten students shall be 27 counted as one-half of a full-time student. For common schools, a 28 29 part-time student is a student enrolled for less than the total time for a full-time student as defined in this section. A part-time common school 30 31 student shall be counted as one-fourth, one-half or three-fourths of a full-time student if the student is enrolled in an instructional program 32 that is at least one-fourth, one-half or three-fourths of the time a 33 full-time student is enrolled as defined in subdivision (b) of this 34 paragraph. The hours in which a student is scheduled to attend a common 35 36 school during the regular school day shall be included in the calculation 37 of the average daily membership for that student.

38 (ii) For high schools, a part-time student who is enrolled in less 39 than four subjects that count toward graduation as defined by the state board of education, each of which, if taught each school day for the 40 41 minimum number of days required in a school year, would meet a minimum of 42 one hundred twenty-three hours a year, or the equivalent, in a recognized 43 high school. The average daily membership of a part-time high school student shall be 0.75 if the student is enrolled in an instructional 44 45 program of three subjects that meet at least five hundred forty hours for

1 one hundred eighty-day school year, or the instructional hours а 2 prescribed in this section. The average daily membership of a part-time 3 high school student shall be 0.5 if the student is enrolled in an 4 instructional program of two subjects that meet at least three hundred 5 sixty hours for a one hundred eighty-day school year, or the instructional 6 hours prescribed in this section. The average daily membership of a 7 part-time high school student shall be 0.25 if the student is enrolled in 8 an instructional program of one subject that meets at least one hundred 9 one hundred eighty-day school eighty hours for а year, or the instructional hours prescribed in this section. The hours in which a 10 11 student is scheduled to attend a high school during the regular school day 12 shall be included in the calculation of the average daily membership for 13 that student.

(b) "Full-time student" means:

(i) For common schools, a student who is at least six years of age 15 16 before January 1 of a school year, who has not graduated from the highest grade taught in the school district and who is regularly enrolled in a 17 18 course of study required by the state board of education. First, second and third grade students or ungraded group B children with disabilities 19 20 who are at least five, but under six, years of age by September 1 must be 21 enrolled in an instructional program that meets for a total of at least 22 seven hundred twelve hours for a one hundred eighty-day school year, or 23 the instructional hours prescribed in this section. Fourth, fifth, sixth, 24 seventh and eighth grade students must be enrolled in an instructional program that meets for a total of at least eight hundred ninety hours for 25 26 one hundred eighty-day school year, or the instructional hours а 27 prescribed in this section, including the equivalent number of hundred 28 instructional hours for schools that operate on one а 29 forty-four-day school year. The hours in which a student is scheduled to attend a common school during the regular school day shall be included in 30 31 the calculation of the average daily membership for that student.

32 (ii) For high schools, a student who has not graduated from the 33 highest grade taught in the school district and who is enrolled in at least an instructional program of four or more subjects that count toward 34 35 graduation as defined by the state board of education, each of which, if 36 taught each school day for the minimum number of days required in a school 37 year, would meet a minimum of one hundred twenty-three hours a year, or the equivalent, that meets for a total of at least seven hundred twenty 38 39 hours for a one hundred eighty-day school year, or the instructional hours 40 prescribed in this section in a recognized high school. A full-time 41 student shall not be counted more than once for computation of average 42 daily membership. The average daily membership of a full-time high school 43 student shall be 1.0 if the student is enrolled in at least four subjects that meet at least seven hundred twenty hours for a one hundred eighty-day 44 45 school year, or the equivalent instructional hours prescribed in this 1 section. The hours in which a student is scheduled to attend a high 2 school during the regular school day shall be included in the calculation 3 of the average daily membership for that student.

4 (iii) If a child who has not reached five years of age before 5 September 1 of the current school year is admitted to kindergarten and 6 repeats kindergarten in the following school year, a school district or 7 charter school is not eligible to receive basic state aid on behalf of 8 that child during the child's second year of kindergarten. If a child who 9 has not reached five years of age before September 1 of the current school year is admitted to kindergarten but does not remain enrolled, a school 10 11 district or charter school may receive a portion of basic state aid on 12 behalf of that child in the subsequent year. A school district or charter 13 school may charge tuition for any child who is ineligible for basic state aid pursuant to this item. 14

15 (iv) Except as otherwise provided by law, for a full-time high 16 school student who is concurrently enrolled in two school districts or two 17 charter schools, the average daily membership shall not exceed 1.0.

18 (v) Except as otherwise provided by law, for any student who is 19 concurrently enrolled in a school district and a charter school, the 20 average daily membership shall be apportioned between the school district 21 and the charter school and shall not exceed 1.0. The apportionment shall 22 be based on the percentage of total time that the student is enrolled in 23 or in attendance at the school district and the charter school.

24 (vi) Except as otherwise provided by law, for any student who is 25 concurrently enrolled, pursuant to section 15-808, in a school district 26 and Arizona online instruction or a charter school and Arizona online 27 instruction, the average daily membership shall be apportioned between the 28 school district and Arizona online instruction or the charter school and 29 Arizona online instruction and shall not exceed 1.0. The apportionment shall be based on the percentage of total time that the student is 30 31 enrolled in or in attendance at the school district and Arizona online instruction or the charter school and Arizona online instruction. 32

33 (vii) For homebound or hospitalized, a student receiving at least 34 four hours of instruction per week.

35 (c) "Regular school day" means the regularly scheduled class 36 periods intended for instructional purposes. Instructional purposes may 37 include core subjects, elective subjects, lunch, study halls, music 38 instruction, and other classes that advance the academic instruction of 39 pupils, except that instructional purposes shall not include athletic 40 practices or extracurricular clubs and activities.

41 2. "Budget year" means the fiscal year for which the school
42 district is budgeting and that immediately follows the current year.

3. "Common school district" means a political subdivision of this
state offering instruction to students in programs for preschool children
with disabilities and kindergarten programs and either:

1 2 (a) Grades one through eight.

5. "Daily attendance" means:

(b) Grades one through nine pursuant to section 15-447.01.

3 4. "Current year" means the fiscal year in which a school district4 is operating.

5 6

(a) For common schools, days in which a pupil:

7 (i) Of a kindergarten program or ungraded, but not group B children 8 with disabilities, who is at least five, but under six, years of age by 9 September 1 attends at least three-quarters of the instructional time scheduled for the day. If the total instruction time scheduled for the 10 11 year is at least three hundred fifty-six hours but is less than seven 12 hundred twelve hours, such attendance shall be counted as one-half day of 13 attendance. If the instructional time scheduled for the year is at least six hundred ninety-two hours, "daily attendance" means days in which a 14 pupil attends at least one-half of the instructional time scheduled for 15 16 the day. Such attendance shall be counted as one-half day of attendance.

17 (ii) Of the first, second or third grades attends more than 18 three-quarters of the instructional time scheduled for the day.

19 (iii) Of the fourth, fifth or sixth grades attends more than 20 three-quarters of the instructional time scheduled for the day, except as 21 provided in section 15-797.

(iv) Of the seventh or eighth grades attends more than
three-quarters of the instructional time scheduled for the day, except as
provided in section 15-797.

(b) For common schools, the attendance of a pupil at three-quarters or less of the instructional time scheduled for the day shall be counted as follows, except as provided in section 15-797 and except that attendance for a fractional student shall not exceed the pupil's fractional membership:

(i) If attendance for all pupils in the school is based on quarter
 days, the attendance of a pupil shall be counted as one-fourth of a day's
 attendance for each one-fourth of full-time instructional time attended.

(ii) If attendance for all pupils in the school is based on half days, the attendance of at least three-quarters of the instructional time scheduled for the day shall be counted as a full day's attendance and attendance at a minimum of one-half but less than three-quarters of the instructional time scheduled for the day equals one-half day of attendance.

39 (c) For common schools, the attendance of a preschool child with 40 disabilities shall be counted as one-fourth day's attendance for each 41 thirty-six minutes of attendance, except as provided in paragraph 1, 42 subdivision (a), item (i) of this subsection for children with 43 disabilities up to a maximum of three hundred sixty minutes each week.

44 (d) For high schools, the attendance of a pupil shall not be 45 counted as a full day unless the pupil is actually and physically in attendance and enrolled in and carrying four subjects, each of which, if taught each school day for the minimum number of days required in a school year, would meet a minimum of one hundred twenty-three hours a year, or the equivalent, that count toward graduation in a recognized high school except as provided in section 15-797 and subdivision (e) of this paragraph. Attendance of a pupil carrying less than the load prescribed shall be prorated.

8 (e) For high schools, the attendance of a pupil may be counted as 9 one-fourth of a day's attendance for each sixty minutes of instructional 10 time in a subject that counts toward graduation, except that attendance 11 for a pupil shall not exceed the pupil's full or fractional membership.

12 (f) For homebound or hospitalized, a full day of attendance may be 13 counted for each day during a week in which the student receives at least 14 four hours of instruction.

(g) For school districts that maintain school for an approved year-round school year operation, attendance shall be based on a computation, as prescribed by the superintendent of public instruction, of the one hundred eighty days' equivalency or two hundred days' equivalency, as applicable, of instructional time as approved by the superintendent of public instruction during which each pupil is enrolled.

6. "Daily route mileage" means the sum of:

(a) The total number of miles driven daily by all buses of a school
 district while transporting eligible students from their residence to the
 school of attendance and from the school of attendance to their residence
 on scheduled routes approved by the superintendent of public instruction.

26 (b) The total number of miles driven daily on routes approved by 27 the superintendent of public instruction for which a private party, a political subdivision or a common or a contract carrier is reimbursed for 28 29 bringing an eligible student from the place of the student's residence to a school transportation pickup point or to the school of attendance and 30 31 from the school transportation scheduled return point or from the school of attendance to the student's residence. Daily route mileage includes 32 the total number of miles necessary to drive to transport eligible 33 34 students from and to their residence as provided in this paragraph.

35 7. "District support level" means the base support level plus the 36 transportation support level.

37

8. "Eligible students" means:

(a) Students who are transported by or for a school district and
 who qualify as full-time students or fractional students, except students
 for whom transportation is paid by another school district or a county
 school superintendent, and:

42 (i) For common school students, whose place of actual residence 43 within the school district is more than one mile from the school facility 44 of attendance or students who are admitted pursuant to section 15-816.01 45 and who meet the economic eligibility requirements established under the 1 national school lunch and child nutrition acts (42 United States Code 2 sections 1751 through 1793) for free or reduced-price lunches and whose 3 actual place of residence outside the school district boundaries is more 4 than one mile from the school facility of attendance.

5 (ii) For high school students, whose place of actual residence 6 within the school district is more than one and one-half miles from the 7 school facility of attendance or students who are admitted pursuant to 8 section 15-816.01 and who meet the economic eligibility requirements 9 established under the national school lunch and child nutrition acts (42 United States Code sections 1751 through 1793) for 10 free or 11 reduced-price lunches and whose actual place of residence outside the 12 school district boundaries is more than one and one-half miles from the 13 school facility of attendance.

(b) Kindergarten students, for purposes of computing the number of
eligible students under subdivision (a), item (i) of this paragraph, shall
be counted as full-time students, notwithstanding any other provision of
law.

18 (c) Children with disabilities, as defined by section 15-761, who 19 are transported by or for the school district or who are admitted pursuant 20 to chapter 8, article 1.1 of this title and who qualify as full-time 21 students or fractional students regardless of location or residence within 22 the school district or children with disabilities whose transportation is 23 required by the pupil's individualized education program.

(d) Students whose residence is outside the school district and who
are transported within the school district on the same basis as students
who reside in the school district.

9. "Enrolled" or "enrollment" means that a pupil is currentlyregistered in the school district.

10. "GDP price deflator" means the average of the four implicit
 price deflators for the gross domestic product reported by the United
 States department of commerce for the four quarters of the calendar year.

11. "High school district" means a political subdivision of this state offering instruction to students for grades nine through twelve or that portion of the budget of a common school district that is allocated to teaching high school subjects with permission of the state board of education.

37 12. "Revenue control limit" means the base revenue control limit 38 plus the transportation revenue control limit.

39 13. "Student count" means average daily membership as prescribed in 40 this subsection for the fiscal year before the current year, except that 41 for the purpose of budget preparation student count means average daily 42 membership as prescribed in this subsection for the current year.

43 14. "Submit electronically" means submitted in a format and in a 44 manner prescribed by the department of education.

1 15. "Total bus mileage" means the total number of miles driven by 2 all buses of a school district during the school year. 3 16. "Total students transported" means all eligible students 4 transported from their place of residence to a school transportation 5 pickup point or to the school of attendance and from the school of 6 attendance or from the school transportation scheduled return point to 7 their place of residence. 8 17. "Unified school district" means a political subdivision of this 9 state offering instruction to students in programs for preschool children with disabilities and kindergarten programs and grades one through twelve. 10 11 B. In this title, unless the context otherwise requires: 12 1. "Base" means the revenue level per student count specified by the legislature. 13 2. "Base level" means the following amounts plus the percentage 14 increases to the base level as provided in sections 15-902.04 and 15-952, 15 16 except that if a school district or charter school is eligible for an 17 increase in the base level as provided in two or more of these sections, 18 the base level amount shall be calculated by compounding rather than 19 adding the sum of one plus the percentage of the increase from those 20 different sections: 21 (a) For fiscal year 2018-2019, \$3,960.07. 22 (b) For fiscal year 2019-2020, \$4,150.43. 23 (c) For fiscal year 2020-2021, \$4,305.73. 24 3. "Base revenue control limit" means the base revenue control 25 limit computed as provided in section 15-944. 26 4. "Base support level" means the base support level as provided in 27 section 15-943. 5. "Certified teacher" means a person who is certified as a teacher 28 29 pursuant to the rules adopted by the state board of education, who renders direct and personal services to schoolchildren in the form of instruction 30 31 related to the school district's educational course of study and who is paid from the maintenance and operation section of the budget. 32 33 6. "DD" means programs for children with developmental delays who are at least three years of age but under ten years of age. A preschool 34 35 child who is categorized under this paragraph is not eligible to receive 36 funding pursuant to section 15-943, paragraph 2, subdivision (b). 37 "ED, MIID, SLD, SLI and OHI" means programs for children with 7. disabilities, mild intellectual disabilities, 38 emotional a specific 39 learning disability, a speech/language impairment and other health 40 impairments. A preschool child who is categorized as SLI under this 41 paragraph is not eligible to receive funding pursuant to section 15-943, 42 paragraph 2, subdivision (b).

43 8. "ED-P" means programs for children with emotional disabilities 44 who are enrolled in private special education programs as prescribed in section 15-765, subsection D, paragraph 1 or in an intensive school
 district program as provided in section 15-765, subsection D, paragraph 2.

9. "ELL" means English learners who do not speak English or whose native language is not English, who are not currently able to perform ordinary classroom work in English and who are enrolled in an English language education program pursuant to sections 15-751, 15-752 and 15-753.

7 10. "FRPL" MEANS STUDENTS WHO MEET THE ECONOMIC ELIGIBILITY 8 REQUIREMENTS ESTABLISHED UNDER THE NATIONAL SCHOOL LUNCH AND CHILD 9 NUTRITION ACTS (42 UNITED STATES CODE SECTIONS 1751 THROUGH 1793) FOR FREE 10 OR REDUCED-PRICE LUNCHES.

11 10. 11. "Full-time equivalent certified teacher" or "FTE certified 12 teacher" means for a certified teacher the following:

(a) If employed full time as defined in section 15-501, 1.00.

(b) If employed less than full time, multiply 1.00 by the percentage of a full school day, or its equivalent, or a full class load, or its equivalent, for which the teacher is employed as determined by the governing board.

37 "Homebound" or "hospitalized" means a pupil who is capable <del>14.</del> 15. 38 of profiting from academic instruction but is unable to attend school due 39 to illness, disease, accident or other health conditions, who has been 40 examined by a competent medical doctor and who is certified by that doctor 41 as being unable to attend regular classes for a period of not less than 42 three school months or a pupil who is capable of profiting from academic 43 instruction but is unable to attend school regularly due to chronic or acute health problems, who has been examined by a competent medical doctor 44 45 and who is certified by that doctor as being unable to attend regular

1 classes for intermittent periods of time totaling three school months during a school year. The medical certification shall state the general 2 medical condition, such as illness, disease or chronic health condition, 3 4 that is the reason that the pupil is unable to attend school. Homebound 5 or hospitalized includes a student who is unable to attend school for a 6 period of less than three months due to a pregnancy if a competent medical 7 doctor, after an examination, certifies that the student is unable to 8 attend regular classes due to risk to the pregnancy or to the student's 9 health.

16 18. 19. "MD-SC, A-SC and SID-SC" means self-contained programs for pupils with multiple disabilities, autism and severe intellectual disability.

19 19. 20. "MD-SSI" means a program for pupils with multiple 20 disabilities with severe sensory impairment.

21 20. 21. "MOID" means programs for pupils with moderate 22 intellectual disability.

23 21. 22. "OI-R" means a resource program for pupils with orthopedic impairments.

25 22. 23. "OI-SC" means a self-contained program for pupils with 26 orthopedic impairments.

27 23. 24. "PSD" means preschool programs for children with
 28 disabilities as provided in section 15-771.
