AMENDING SECTIONS 15-341.01, 15-393 AND 15-393.01, ARIZONA REVISED STATUTES; RELATING TO CAREER TECHNICAL EDUCATION DISTRICTS.

1 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Arizona: 2 Section 1. Section 15-341.01, Arizona Revised Statutes, is amended 3 to read: 4 15-341.01. One hundred eighty day school year; definition 5 Notwithstanding any other law AND EXCEPT AS PRESCRIBED IN Α. SECTION 15-393, SUBSECTION D, PARAGRAPH 5, school instruction shall be 6 7 conducted in each public school in this state for school sessions that 8 at least one hundred eighty days each school year. total The 9 superintendent of public instruction shall cause all relevant school funding formulas to be adjusted to reflect instruction on the one hundred 10 11 eighty days' equivalency. The department of education shall adjust the 12 amount of state aid distributed to school districts pursuant to section 13 15-971 to correspond to the increased number of school days prescribed by 14 this section. B. For the purposes of this section, "one hundred eighty days" 15 16 means one hundred eighty days of instruction or an equivalent number of minutes of instruction per school year based on a different number of days 17 18 of instruction approved by the school district governing board or charter 19 school governing body. 20 Sec. 2. Section 15-393, Arizona Revised Statutes, is amended to 21 read: 22 15-393. <u>Career technical education district governing board;</u> 23 report: definitions 24 Α. The management and control of a career technical education district are vested in the career technical education district governing 25 26 board, including the content and quality of the courses offered by the district, the quality of teachers who provide instruction on behalf of the 27 district, the salaries of teachers who provide instruction on behalf of 28 29 the district and the reimbursement of other entities for the facilities used by the district. This section does not restrict a school district 30 31 from offering any career and technical education course that does not 32 qualify for funding as a career technical education course or career technical education district program. Unless the governing boards of the 33 school districts participating in the formation of the career technical 34 education district vote to implement an alternative election system as 35 36 provided in subsection B of this section, the career technical education board shall consist CONSISTS of five members elected from five single 37 member districts formed within the career technical education district. 38 The single member district election system shall be submitted as part of 39 40 the plan for the career technical education district pursuant to section 41 15-392 and shall be established in the plan as follows:

42 1. The governing boards of the school districts participating in 43 the formation of the career technical education district shall define the 44 boundaries of the single member districts so that the single member 45 districts are as nearly equal in population as is practicable, except that 1 if the career technical education district lies in part in each of two or 2 more counties, at least one single member district may be entirely within 3 each of the counties comprising the career technical education district if 4 this district design is consistent with the obligation to equalize the 5 population among single member districts.

2. The boundaries of each single member district shall follow 6 7 election precinct boundary lines, as far as practicable, in order to avoid 8 further segmentation of the precincts.

9 3. A person who is a registered voter of this state and who is a resident of the single member district is eligible for election to the 10 11 office of career technical education board member from the single member 12 district. The terms of office of the members of the career technical 13 education board shall be as prescribed in section 15-427, subsection B. An employee of a career technical education district or the spouse of an 14 employee shall not hold membership on a governing board of a career 15 16 technical education district by which the employee is employed. A member 17 of one school district governing board or career technical education 18 district governing board is ineligible to be a candidate for nomination or election to or serve simultaneously as a member of any other governing 19 20 board, except that a member of a governing board may be a candidate for 21 nomination or election for any other governing board if the member is 22 serving in the last year of a term of office. A member of a governing board shall resign the member's seat on the governing board before 23 24 becoming a candidate for nomination or election to the governing board of any other school district or career technical education district, unless 25 26 the member of the governing board is serving in the last year of a term of 27 office. Members of a career technical education district governing board 28 are subject to the conflict of interest requirements prescribed in section 29 38-503.

30 Nominating petitions shall be signed by the number of qualified 4. 31 electors of the single member district as provided in section 16-322.

32 B. The governing boards of the school districts participating in 33 the formation of the career technical education district may vote to 34 implement any other alternative election system for the election of career 35 technical education district board members. If an alternative election 36 system is selected, it shall be submitted as part of the plan for the 37 career technical education district pursuant to section 15-392, and the 38 implementation of the system shall be as approved by the United States 39 justice department.

Notwithstanding subsection C of this section, the following 14 apply to a career technical education district: 1. A career technical education district may issue bonds for the 15 16 purposes specified in section 15-1021 and in chapter 4, article 5 of this 17 title to an amount in the aggregate, including the existing indebtedness, 18 not exceeding one percent of the net assessed value of the full cash value of the property within the career technical education district. For the 19 20 purposes of this paragraph, "full cash value" and "net assessed value" 21 have the same meanings prescribed in section 42-11001. 22 2. The number of governing board members for a career technical 23 education district shall be as prescribed in subsection A of this section. 24 3. The student count for the first year of operation of a career 25 technical education district as provided in this article shall be 26 determined as follows: 27 (a) Determine the estimated student count for career technical education district classes that will operate in the first year of 28 29 operation. This estimate shall be based on actual registration of pupils as of March 30 scheduled to attend classes that will be operated by the 30 31 career technical education district. The student count for the school district of residence of the pupils registered at the career technical 32 33 education district shall be adjusted. The adjustment shall cause the school district of residence to reduce the student count for the pupil to 34 reflect the courses to be taken at the career technical education 35 36 district. The school district of residence shall review and approve the 37 adjustment of its own student count as provided in this subdivision before the pupils from the school district can be added to the student count of 38 39 the career technical education district. 40 (b) The student count for the new career technical education 41 district shall be the student count as determined in subdivision (a) of 42 this paragraph.

43 (c) For the first year of operation, the career technical education 44 district shall revise the student count to the actual average daily 45 membership as prescribed in section 15-901, subsection A, paragraph 1 for 1 students attending classes in the career technical education district. A 2 career technical education district shall revise its student count, the 3 base support level as provided in section 15-943.02, the revenue control 4 limit as provided in section 15-944.01 and the district additional 5 assistance as provided in section 15-962.01 before May 15. A career 6 technical education district that overestimated its student count shall 7 revise its budget before May 15. A career technical education district 8 that underestimated its student count may revise its budget before May 15.

9 (d) After March 15 of the first year of operation, the school district of residence shall adjust its student count by reducing it to 10 11 reflect the courses actually taken at the career technical education 12 district. The school district of residence shall revise its student 13 count, the base support level as provided in section 15-943, the revenue control limit as provided in section 15-944 and the district additional 14 assistance as provided in section 15-962.01 prior to May 15. A district 15 16 that underestimated the student count for students attending the career 17 technical education district shall revise its budget before May 15. A 18 district that overestimated the student count for students attending the 19 career technical education district may revise its budget before May 15.

20 (e) The procedures for implementing this paragraph shall be as 21 prescribed in the uniform system of financial records.

22 (f) Pupils in an approved career technical education district centralized program may generate an average daily membership of 1.0 during 23 24 any day of the week and at any time between July 1 and June 30 of each 25 fiscal year. For the purposes of this paragraph, "school district of 26 residence" means the school district that included the pupil in its 27 average daily membership for the year before the first year of operation of the career technical education district and that would have included 28 29 the pupil in its student count for the purposes of computing its base 30 support level for the fiscal year of the first year of operation of the 31 career technical education district if the pupil had not enrolled in the 32 career technical education district.

4. A student includes any person enrolled in the career technical
 education district without regard to the person's age or high school
 graduation status, except that:

36 (a) A student in a kindergarten program or in any of grades one 37 through nine who enrolls in courses offered by the career technical 38 education district shall not be included in the career technical education 39 district's student count or average daily membership.

40 (b) A student in a kindergarten program or in any of grades one 41 through nine who is enrolled in career and technical education courses 42 shall not be funded in whole or in part with monies provided by a career 43 technical education district, except that a pupil in grade eight or nine 44 may be funded with monies generated by the five cent \$.05 qualifying tax 45 rate authorized in subsection F of this section. 1 (c) A student who has graduated from high school or received a 2 general equivalency diploma or who is over twenty-one years of age shall 3 not be included in the student count of the career technical education 4 district for the purposes of chapter 9, articles 3, 4 and 5 of this title.

5 (d) A student who is enrolled in any internship course as part of a 6 career technical education district program shall not be included in the 7 student count of the career technical education district for that 8 internship course for the purposes of chapter 9, articles 3, 4 and 5 of 9 this title.

5. A career technical education district may operate for more than
 one hundred eighty days per year, OR LESS, with expanded hours of service
 THE EQUIVALENT NUMBER OF HOURS OF INSTRUCTION.

6. A career technical education district may use the carryforwardprovisions of section 15-943.01.

15 7. A school district that is part of a career technical education 16 district shall use any monies received pursuant to this article to 17 supplement and not supplant base year career and technical education 18 courses, and directly related equipment and facilities, except that a 19 school district that is part of a career technical education district and 20 that has used monies received pursuant to this article to supplant career 21 and technical education courses that were offered before the first year 22 that the school district participated in the career technical education district or the first year that the school district used monies received 23 24 pursuant to this article or that used the monies for purposes other than 25 for career and technical education courses shall use one hundred percent 26 of the monies received pursuant to this article to supplement and not 27 supplant base year career and technical education courses. Each applicable school district shall provide a report to the career technical 28 29 education board and the department of education outlining the required 30 maintenance of effort and how monies were used to supplement and not 31 supplant base year career and technical education courses and directly 32 related equipment and facilities.

8. A career technical education district shall use any monies
 received pursuant to this article to enhance and not supplant career and
 technical education courses and directly related equipment and facilities.

36 9. A career technical education district or a school district that 37 is part of a career technical education district or a charter school shall only include pupils in grades ten through twelve in the calculation of 38 39 student count or average daily membership if the pupils are enrolled in 40 courses that are approved jointly by the governing board of the career 41 technical education district and each participating school district or charter school for satellite courses taught within the participating 42 43 school district or charter school, or approved solely by the career technical education district for centrally located courses. Student count 44 45 and average daily membership from courses that are not part of an approved 1 program for career and technical education shall not be included in 2 student count and average daily membership of a career technical education 3 district.

4 E. The career technical education board shall appoint a 5 superintendent as the executive officer of the career technical education 6 district.

7 F. Taxes may be levied for the support of the career technical 8 education district as prescribed in chapter 9, article 6 of this title, 9 except that a career technical education district shall not levy a property tax pursuant to law that exceeds five cents \$.05 per one hundred 10 11 dollars \$100 assessed valuation except for bond monies pursuant to 12 subsection D, paragraph 1 of this section. Except for the taxes levied 13 pursuant to section 15-994, such taxes shall be obtained from a levy of 14 taxes on the taxable property used for secondary tax purposes.

G. The schools in the career technical education district are available to all persons who reside in the career technical education district and to pupils whose school district of residence within this state is paying tuition on behalf of the pupils to a district of attendance that is a member of the career technical education district, subject to the rules for admission prescribed by the career technical education board.

H. The career technical education board may collect tuition for adult students and the attendance of pupils who are residents of school districts that are not participating in the career technical education district pursuant to arrangements made between the governing board of the school district and the career technical education board.

I. The career technical education board may accept gifts, grants, federal monies, tuition and other allocations of monies to erect, repair and equip buildings and for the cost of operation of OPERATING the schools of the career technical education district.

J. One member of the career technical education board shall be selected chairman. The chairman shall be selected annually on a rotation basis from among the participating school districts. The chairman of the career technical education board shall be a voting member.

35 K. A career technical education board and a community college 36 district may enter into agreements for the provision of TO PROVIDE 37 administrative, operational and educational services and facilities.

L. Any agreement between the governing board of a career technical 38 education district and another career technical education district, a 39 school district, a charter school or a community college district shall be 40 41 in the form of an intergovernmental agreement or other written 42 contract. The auditor general shall modify the uniform system of 43 financial records and budget forms in accordance with this subsection. The intergovernmental agreement or other written contract shall completely 44 45 and accurately specify each of the following:

1 1. The financial provisions of the intergovernmental agreement or 2 other written contract and the format for the billing of all services.

3 2. The accountability provisions of the intergovernmental agreement 4 or other written contract.

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3. The responsibilities of each career technical education district, each school district, each charter school and each community 6 7 college district that is a party to the intergovernmental agreement or 8 other written contract.

9 4. The type of instruction that will be provided under the 10 agreement or other written contract. intergovernmental including 11 individualized education programs pursuant to section 15-763.

12 5. The quality of the instruction that will be provided under the 13 intergovernmental agreement or other written contract.

14 The transportation services that will be provided under the 6. intergovernmental agreement or other written contract and the manner in 15 16 which transportation costs will be paid.

17 7. The amount that the career technical education district will 18 contribute to a course and the amount of support required by the school 19 district, THE CHARTER SCHOOL or the community college.

20 8. That the services provided by the career technical education 21 district, the school district, the charter school or the community college 22 district be proportionally calculated in the cost of delivering the 23 service.

24 9. That the payment for services shall not exceed the cost of the 25 services provided.

26 10. That the career technical education district will provide the 27 following minimum services for all member districts:

(a) Professional development of career and technical teachers in 28 29 the career technical education district who are teaching programs or 30 courses at a satellite campus.

31 (b) Ongoing evaluation and support of satellite campus programs and 32 courses to ensure quality and compliance.

33 11. An itemized listing of other goods and services that are provided to the member district and that are paid for by the retention of 34 35 satellite campus student funding.

36 M. A member school district or charter school may not submit 37 requests for the approval TO APPROVE or addition of ADD satellite campus career technical education district programs or courses directly to the 38 career and technical education division of the department of education, 39 40 but shall submit all appropriate application documentation and materials 41 for programs or courses to the career technical education district. On approval from the career technical education board, a career technical 42 43 education district shall only submit requests for the approval TO APPROVE or addition of ADD satellite campus career technical education district 44 45 programs or courses directly to the career and technical education division of the department of education, which shall determine whether the criteria prescribed in section 15-391, paragraphs 2 and 4 have been met. If the career and technical education division of the department of education determines that a course does not meet the criteria for approval as a career technical education course, the governing board of the career technical education district may appeal this decision to the state board of education acting as the state board of vocational education.

8 N. Notwithstanding any other law, the average daily membership for 9 a pupil who is enrolled in a career technical education course and who 10 does not meet the criteria specified in subsection P or Q of this section 11 shall be 0.25 for each course, except the sum of the average daily 12 membership shall not exceed the limits prescribed by subsection D, P or Q 13 of this section, as applicable.

14 0. If a career and technical education course or program is provided on a satellite campus, the sum of the average daily membership, 15 16 as provided in section 15-901, subsection A, paragraph 1, for that pupil 17 in the school district or charter school and career technical education 18 district shall not exceed 1.25. The school district or charter school and the career technical education district shall determine the apportionment 19 20 of the average daily membership for that pupil between the school district 21 or charter school and the career technical education district. A pupil 22 who attends a course or program at a satellite campus and who is not 23 enrolled in the school district or charter school where the satellite 24 campus is located may generate the average daily membership UP TO 0.25 FOR ONE HUNDRED FIFTY HOURS OF INSTRUCTION RECEIVED DURING ANY HOUR OF THE 25 26 DAY, DURING ANY DAY OF THE WEEK AND AT ANY TIME BETWEEN JULY 1 AND JUNE 30 27 OF EACH FISCAL YEAR pursuant to this subsection if the pupil is enrolled 28 in a school district that is a member district in the same career 29 technical education district.

P. The sum of the average daily membership of a pupil who is 30 31 enrolled in both the school district and career technical education course 32 or career technical education program provided at BY a community college 33 pursuant to subsection K of this section or at a centralized campus shall not exceed 1.75. THE AVERAGE DAILY MEMBERSHIP FOR A PUPIL WHO IS ENROLLED 34 35 IN A CAREER TECHNICAL EDUCATION COURSE OR CAREER TECHNICAL EDUCATION 36 PROGRAM PROVIDED BY A COMMUNITY COLLEGE SHALL BE 0.25 FOR THE ACCUMULATION OF EVERY THREE COMMUNITY COLLEGE CREDITS FOR WHICH A STUDENT IS ENROLLED 37 IN CAREER TECHNICAL EDUCATION COURSES. The member school district and the 38 career technical education district shall determine the apportionment of 39 40 the average daily membership and student enrollment for that pupil between 41 the member school district and the career technical education district, 42 except that the amount apportioned shall not exceed 1.0 for either entity. 43 Notwithstanding any other law, the average daily membership for a pupil in 44 grade ten, eleven or twelve who is enrolled in a course that meets for at 45 least one hundred fifty minutes per class period at a centralized campus

1 shall be 0.75. To qualify for funding pursuant to this subsection, a 2 centralized campus shall offer programs and courses to all eligible 3 students in each member district of the career technical education 4 district. STUDENTS IN AN APPROVED CAREER TECHNICAL EDUCATION PROGRAM MAY 5 GENERATE AN AVERAGE DAILY MEMBERSHIP OF UP TO 1.75 FOR INSTRUCTION 6 RECEIVED DURING ANY HOUR OF THE DAY, DURING ANY DAY OF THE WEEK AND AT ANY 7 TIME BETWEEN JULY 1 AND JUNE 30 OF EACH FISCAL YEAR. AVERAGE DAILY 8 MEMBERSHIP SHALL NOT BE CALCULATED ON THE ONE HUNDREDTH DAY OF INSTRUCTION 9 FOR THE PURPOSES OF THIS SECTION. AVERAGE DAILY MEMBERSHIP SHALL BE 10 CALCULATED BY DIVIDING THE INSTRUCTIONAL HOURS OF ENROLLMENT BY SIX 11 HUNDRED HOURS, EXCEPT THAT:

12 1. AT LEAST ONE HUNDRED FIFTY HOURS AND LESS THAN THREE HUNDRED 13 HOURS EQUALS 0.25 AVERAGE DAILY MEMBERSHIP.

14 2. AT LEAST THREE HUNDRED HOURS AND LESS THAN FOUR HUNDRED FIFTY15 HOURS EQUALS 0.5 AVERAGE DAILY MEMBERSHIP.

16 3. AT LEAST FOUR HUNDRED FIFTY HOURS AND LESS THAN SIX HUNDRED 17 HOURS EQUALS 0.75 AVERAGE DAILY MEMBERSHIP.

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4. AT LEAST SIX HUNDRED HOURS EQUALS 1.0 AVERAGE DAILY MEMBERSHIP.

19 Q. The average daily membership for a pupil in grade ten, eleven or 20 twelve who is enrolled in a course that meets for at least one hundred 21 fifty minutes per class period at a leased centralized campus shall not 22 exceed 0.75. STUDENTS IN AN APPROVED CAREER TECHNICAL EDUCATION PROGRAM PROVIDED BY A LEASED CENTRALIZED CAMPUS MAY GENERATE AN AVERAGE DAILY 23 24 MEMBERSHIP FOR INSTRUCTION RECEIVED DURING ANY HOUR OF THE DAY, DURING ANY DAY OF THE WEEK AND AT ANY TIME BETWEEN JULY 1 AND JUNE 30 OF EACH FISCAL 25 26 YEAR. AVERAGE DAILY MEMBERSHIP SHALL BE CALCULATED BY DIVIDING THE 27 INSTRUCTIONAL HOURS OF ENROLLMENT BY SIX HUNDRED HOURS, EXCEPT THAT:

28 1. AT LEAST ONE HUNDRED FIFTY HOURS AND LESS THAN THREE HUNDRED29 HOURS EQUALS 0.25 AVERAGE DAILY MEMBERSHIP.

30 2. AT LEAST THREE HUNDRED HOURS AND LESS THAN FOUR HUNDRED FIFTY31 HOURS EQUALS 0.5 AVERAGE DAILY MEMBERSHIP.

32 3. AT LEAST FOUR HUNDRED FIFTY HOURS AND LESS THAN SIX HUNDRED 33 HOURS EQUALS 0.75 AVERAGE DAILY MEMBERSHIP.

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4. AT LEAST SIX HUNDRED HOURS EQUALS 1.0 AVERAGE DAILY MEMBERSHIP.

R. The sum of the average daily membership, as provided in section section A, paragraph 1, of a pupil who is enrolled in both the school district and in career technical education courses provided at a leased centralized campus shall not exceed 1.75 if all of the following conditions are met:

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1. The course qualifies as a career technical education course.

41 2. The course is offered to all eligible students in each member
42 district of the career technical education district and enrolls students
43 from multiple high schools.

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3. The career technical education district program in which the course is included addresses a specific industry need and has been developed in cooperation with that industry, or the leased facility is a state or federal asset that would otherwise be unused or underutilized.

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5 4. The lease is established at fair market value if the lease is 6 executed for a facility located on the site of a member district and was 7 approved by the joint committee on capital review, except that a lease 8 that was executed or renewed before December 31, 2012 is not subject to 9 approval by the joint committee on capital review.

10 \mathbf{R} . S. A student who is enrolled in an accommodation school may be 11 treated as a student of the school district in which the student physically resides for the purposes of enrollment in a career technical 12 13 education district and shall be included in the calculation of average 14 daily membership for either the career technical education district or the 15 accommodation school, or both.

16 5. T. Notwithstanding any other law, the student count for a 17 career technical education district shall be equivalent to the career 18 technical education district's average daily membership. STUDENTS IN AN 19 APPROVED CAREER TECHNICAL EDUCATION PROGRAM PROVIDED BY A SATELLITE 20 CAMPUS, CENTRALIZED CAMPUS OR LEASED CENTRALIZED CAMPUS MAY GENERATE AN 21 AVERAGE DAILY MEMBERSHIP OF UP TO 1.75 FOR INSTRUCTION RECEIVED DURING ANY 22 HOUR OF THE DAY, DURING ANY DAY OF THE WEEK AND AT ANY TIME BETWEEN JULY 1 AND JUNE 30 OF EACH FISCAL YEAR. AVERAGE DAILY MEMBERSHIP SHALL NOT BE 23 24 CALCULATED ON THE ONE HUNDREDTH DAY OF INSTRUCTION FOR THE PURPOSES OF 25 THIS SECTION. THE DEPARTMENT MAY NOT RESTRICT THE INSTRUCTIONAL TIME BY 26 LIMITING THE PARTICULAR DAYS OF THE WEEK OR TIME OF THE FISCAL YEAR FOR 27 INSTRUCTION TO OCCUR.

 \overline{T} . U. A school district or charter school may not prohibit or 28 29 discourage students who are enrolled in that school district or charter school from attending courses offered by a career technical education 30 31 district, including requiring students to generate a full 1.0 average daily membership or to enroll in more courses than are needed to graduate 32 before enrolling in and attending programs or courses offered by a career 33 34 technical education district.

35 U. The governing board of the career technical education 36 district may contract with any charter school that is located within the boundaries of the career technical education district to allow that 37 charter school to offer career and technical education courses or programs 38 39 as a satellite campus.

40 \forall . W. Beginning in 2020 and every five years thereafter, the 41 career and technical education division of the department of education 42 shall review career technical education district programs and career 43 technical education courses to ensure compliance, quality and eligibility. Any program or course deemed to not meet the requirements 44 45 set forth by law shall not be funded for the current school year and shall

1 be removed from the approved program and course list for the purposes of 2 funding. The career and technical education division may establish a 3 staggered schedule for reviewing each career technical education district. 4

 $\frac{1}{100}$ X. For the purposes of this section:

5 1. "Base year" means the complete school year in which voters of a 6 school district elected to join a career technical education district.

7 2. "Centralized campus" means a facility that is owned and operated 8 by a career technical education district for the purpose of offering TO 9 OFFER career technical education district programs or career technical 10 education courses.

11 3. "Lease" means a written agreement in which the right of 12 occupancy TO OCCUPY or use of real property is conveyed from one person or 13 entity to another person or entity for a specified period of time.

14 4. "Leased centralized campus" means a facility that is leased and operated by a career technical education district for the purpose of 15 16 offering career technical education district programs or career technical 17 education courses.

18 5. "Satellite campus" means a facility that is owned or operated by 19 a school district or charter school for the purpose of offering TO OFFER 20 career technical education district programs or career technical education 21 courses.

22 Sec. 3. Section 15-393.01, Arizona Revised Statutes, is amended to 23 read:

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15-393.01. Career technical education districts; annual report; performance and accountability

A. The department of education shall include each career technical 26 27 education district in the department's annual achievement profiles required by section 15-241. Subject to approval by the state board of 28 29 education, the department of education shall develop specific criteria applicable to career technical education districts that may not be based 30 31 solely on the criteria prescribed in the Carl D. Perkins vocational education act, as amended by the Carl D. Perkins vocational and applied 32 technology education act amendments of 1990, as amended by the Carl D. 33 34 Perkins vocational and technical education act of 1998, and shall include career technical education districts in the letter grade classification 35 36 system prescribed in section 15-241. The department shall include all of 37 the following performance indicators in the annual achievement profiles and letter grade classification and provide a copy of the information to 38 39 each career technical education district governing board:

40 1. The graduation rate of all students enrolled in a career and 41 technical education program or course.

2. The completion rate for each program offered by the career 42 43 technical education district.

3. Performance on assessments required pursuant to section 15-391, 44 45 paragraph 4, subdivision (b).

1 4. Postgraduation employment rates, postsecondary enrollment rates 2 and military service rates for students who complete a career and 3 technical education program.

B. A career technical education district is subject to the performance audits pursuant to section 41-1279.03, subsection A, paragraph 9. The auditor general shall consider the differences and applicable laws for a career technical education district when conducting a performance audit for a career technical education district.

9 C. On or before December 31 of each year, the career and technical education division of the department of education shall submit a career 10 11 technical education district annual report to the governor, the president of the senate and the speaker of the house of representatives and shall 12 13 submit a copy of this report to the secretary of state. The career and technical education division of the department of education shall submit a 14 copy of this report to the joint legislative budget committee for review. 15 16 The annual report shall include the following:

17 1. The average daily membership of each career technical education 18 district, including the average daily membership of each centralized 19 campus, satellite campus and leased centralized campus as defined in 20 section 15-393.

2. The actual student count of each career technical education
 district, including the student count of each centralized campus,
 satellite campus and leased centralized campus as defined in section
 15-393.

25 3. The programs and corresponding courses offered by each career 26 technical education district, including the location of each program and 27 course.

28 4. For each career technical education district based on program or 29 course location:

30 (a) The student enrollment of each program and corresponding 31 course.

32 (b) The percentage of students who enrolled in the second year of 33 each program and corresponding course relative to the number of students 34 in the same cohort who enrolled in the first year of each program and 35 corresponding course.

36 (c) The percentage of students who completed each program relative 37 to the number of students in the same cohort who began the program.

38 5. The costs associated with each program offered by the career39 technical education district.

6. A listing of any programs or courses that were discontinued by
review of the career and technical education division pursuant to section
15-393, subsection ∀ W.

7. A listing of any programs or courses that were continued by
review of the career and technical education division pursuant to section
15-393, subsection ∀ W.

1 8. A listing of any programs or courses that were added by the 2 career and technical education division.

9. For applicable school districts, the required maintenance of effort and how monies were used to supplement and not supplant base year career and technical education courses, including expenditures related to personnel, equipment and facilities.

7 10. Any other data or information deemed necessary by the 8 department of education.

9 D. The office of the auditor general, in consultation with the 10 department of education, shall develop and establish uniform cost 11 reporting guidelines, policies and procedures for career technical 12 education district programs. Any guideline, policy or procedure shall 13 allow for the effective comparison of cost between career technical 14 education district programs.

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Sec. 4. Legislative findings and intent

16 A. The legislature finds that the unique nature of many career 17 technical education courses and programs require maximum flexibility in 18 scheduling to provide access to students. Career technical education instruction delivery commonly requires block scheduling with longer hours 19 20 over a shorter period of time, so instruction may occur over a few months rather than an entire semester. In an effort to provide efficient 21 22 scheduling, career technical education courses may meet on Saturdays in order to offer the full-day instruction appropriate for a particular 23 24 program. This flexibility also gives students more opportunities to 25 fulfill the hourly obligations required for industry certification by 26 regulators or a particular trade.

B. The intent of section 15-393, Arizona Revised Statutes, as amended by this act, is to establish clear statutory authority for career technical education districts to deliver career technical education instruction any day of the week at any time between July 1 and June 30 of each fiscal year. The legislature's intent is to offer maximum scheduling flexibility for career technical education programs to be delivered in ways that best serve the students.
