# **HB 2084**

## AN ACT

AMENDING SECTION 8-509, ARIZONA REVISED STATUTES; AMENDING SECTION 8-514.03, ARIZONA REVISED STATUTES, AS AMENDED BY LAWS 2018, CHAPTER 110, SECTION 2; REPEALING SECTION 8-514.03, ARIZONA REVISED STATUTES, AS AMENDED BY LAWS 2018, CHAPTER 153, SECTION 3; RELATING TO CHILD WELFARE AND PLACEMENT.

1 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Arizona:  
2 Section 1. Section 8-509, Arizona Revised Statutes, is amended to  
3 read:

4       8-509. Licensing of foster homes; fingerprint waiver;  
5       restricted license; renewal of license; provisional  
6       license; exemption from licensure; immunization  
7       requirements

8       A. The department shall license and certify foster homes. Licenses  
9 are valid for a period of two years.

10      B. The department shall not issue a license without satisfactory  
11 proof that the foster parent or parents have completed six actual hours of  
12 approved initial foster parent training as set forth in section 8-503 and  
13 that each foster parent and each other adult member of the household has a  
14 valid fingerprint clearance card issued pursuant to section 41-1758.07.  
15 The foster parent and each other adult member of the household must  
16 certify on forms that are provided by the department and that are  
17 notarized whether the foster parent or other adult member of the household  
18 is awaiting trial on or has ever been convicted of any of the criminal  
19 offenses listed in section 41-1758.07, subsections B and C in this state  
20 or similar offenses in another state or jurisdiction.

21      C. IN ITS DISCRETION AND FOR GOOD CAUSE, THE DEPARTMENT MAY WAIVE  
22 THE REQUIREMENT FOR A KINSHIP FOSTER CARE PARENT TO OBTAIN A FINGERPRINT  
23 CLEARANCE CARD ISSUED PURSUANT TO SECTION 41-1758.07. IF THE DEPARTMENT  
24 WAIVES THE FINGERPRINT REQUIREMENT, THE DEPARTMENT MAY ISSUE TO THE  
25 KINSHIP FOSTER CARE PARENT A RESTRICTED LICENSE THAT APPLIES ONLY TO THE  
26 CHILDREN PLACED WITH THE KINSHIP FOSTER CARE PARENT FOR KINSHIP FOSTER  
27 CARE.

28      ~~C.~~ D. The department shall not renew a license without  
29 satisfactory proof that the foster parent or parents have completed twelve  
30 actual hours of approved ongoing foster parent training during the  
31 two-year period of licensure as set forth in section 8-503.

32      ~~D.~~ E. If the department determines that completing the training  
33 required in subsections B and ~~C~~ D of this section would be a hardship to  
34 the foster parent or parents, the department may issue a provisional  
35 license for a period not to exceed six months. A provisional license may  
36 not be renewed.

37      ~~E.~~ F. Child welfare agencies that submit foster homes for  
38 licensing shall conduct an investigation of the foster home pursuant to  
39 licensing rules of the department. The department shall conduct  
40 investigations of all other foster homes. If the foster home meets all  
41 requirements set by the department, the agency shall submit an application  
42 stating the foster home's qualifications to the department. The agency  
43 may also recommend the types of licensing and certification to be granted  
44 to the foster home.

1        ~~F.~~ G. The department shall accept an adoptive home certification  
2 study as a licensing home study if the study has been updated within the  
3 past three months to include the information necessary to determine  
4 whether the home meets foster care licensing standards.

5        ~~G.~~ H. This section does not apply if the child is placed in a home  
6 by a means other than by court order and if the home does not receive  
7 compensation from this state or any political subdivision of this state.

8        ~~H.~~ I. The department may not prohibit a person operating a  
9 licensed foster home from applying for or receiving compensation as a  
10 foster home parent due to employment with this state.

11        ~~I.~~ J. The department shall not require a foster parent to immunize  
12 the foster parent's natural or adoptive children as a condition of foster  
13 home licensure.

14        ~~J.~~ K. A licensee may modify the renewal date of a license issued  
15 pursuant to this section by submitting an application for modification of  
16 renewal date with the department on a form prescribed by the department.  
17 The licensee must specify the new month of renewal on the  
18 application. The modified renewal date must be before, but not more than  
19 six months earlier than, the existing renewal date.

20        ~~K.~~ L. The foster care review board shall review the cases of  
21 children placed by the department in foster homes licensed pursuant to  
22 this section as required by section 8-515.03.

23        Sec. 2. Section 8-514.03, Arizona Revised Statutes, as amended by  
24 Laws 2018, chapter 110, section 2, is amended to read:

25        **8-514.03. *Kinship foster care; requirements; investigation***

26        A. The department shall establish kinship foster care services for  
27 a child who has been removed from the child's home and **WHO** is in the  
28 custody of the department. The program shall promote the placement of the  
29 child with the child's relative or a person with a significant  
30 relationship with the child for kinship foster care.

31        B. A kinship foster care parent applicant who is not a licensed  
32 foster care parent shall be at least eighteen years of age. The applicant  
33 and each member of the applicant's household who is at least eighteen  
34 years of age shall submit a full set of fingerprints to the department of  
35 child safety for the purpose of obtaining a state and federal criminal  
36 records check pursuant to section 41-1750 and Public Law 92-544. The  
37 department of public safety may exchange this fingerprint data with the  
38 federal bureau of investigation. The department of child safety shall  
39 determine if the applicant is able to meet the child's health and safety  
40 needs by conducting one or more home visits and interviewing the  
41 applicant. The department of child safety may interview other household  
42 members, review the applicant's personal and professional references and  
43 conduct department of child safety central registry checks.

44        C. If the department determines that a kinship foster care  
45 placement is not in the best interest of the child, the department shall

1 provide written notification to the applicant within fifteen business  
2 days. The notice shall include the specific reason for denial, the  
3 applicant's right to appeal and the process for reviewing the decision.

4 D. A kinship foster care parent may be eligible to receive the  
5 following financial services for the child:

6 1. Full foster care benefits, including payment if the kinship  
7 foster care parent becomes a licensed foster care home **OR IF THE KINSHIP**  
**FOSTER CARE PARENT OBTAINS A RESTRICTED LICENSE PURSUANT TO SECTION 8-509.**

8 2. Temporary assistance for needy families cash assistance payments  
9 for a child only case and supplemental financial support.

10 E. The department shall establish procedures for child welfare  
11 workers to inform kinship foster care families about available financial  
12 and nonfinancial services and eligibility requirements and shall assist  
13 the families in completing the necessary application.

14 F. If a family declines to apply for financial services, the family  
15 shall sign a statement indicating that the family declined services. The  
16 statement does not prevent the family from making application in the  
17 future. The worker shall provide a copy of the statement to the family.

18 G. The department shall provide nonfinancial services for a kinship  
19 foster care parent through existing means or referral. Nonfinancial  
20 services may include:

21 1. Family assessment.  
22 2. Case management.  
23 3. Child day care.  
24 4. Housing search and relocation.  
25 5. Parenting skills training.  
26 6. Supportive intervention and guidance counseling.  
27 7. Transportation.  
28 8. Emergency services.  
29 9. Parent aid services.  
30 10. Respite services.  
31 11. Additional services that the department determines are necessary  
32 to meet the needs of the child and family.
