SENATE BILL 1159

AN ACT

AMENDING SECTIONS 15-501.01, 15-533 AND 15-553, ARIZONA REVISED STATUTES; AMENDING TITLE 15, CHAPTER 5, ARTICLE 3, ARIZONA REVISED STATUTES, BY ADDING SECTION 15-554; RELATING TO SCHOOL EMPLOYEES.

1 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Arizona: 2 Section 1. Section 15-501.01, Arizona Revised Statutes, is amended 3 to read: 4 15-501.01. <u>Requirements for teachers; teaching certificates;</u> 5 rules; reciprocity; placement; posting 6 Α. Notwithstanding any other law, all teachers who are certificated 7 pursuant to this section must have a baccalaureate degree and a valid 8 fingerprint clearance card. 9 B. The state board of education shall adopt rules for the issuance 10 of the following types of certificates for teachers to reflect the source 11 of the training the teacher obtains: 12 1. Standard teaching certificate. 13 2. Alternative teaching certificate for persons who obtain training 14 pursuant to subsection C, paragraph 1 of this section. 3. Subject-matter expert standard teaching certificate for persons 15 16 who obtain training pursuant to subsection C, paragraph 8 of this section. 17 4. Classroom-based standard teaching certificate for persons 18 INDIVIDUALS who obtain training from a school district or charter school. 19 5. Career and technical education teaching certificate. 20 C. The state board of education shall adopt rules to carry out the 21 purposes of this section. The rules: 22 1. Shall provide for a variety of alternative teacher and administrator preparation programs that allow for variations in program 23 24 sequence and design to apply for program approval. The state board shall 25 adopt rules pursuant to this paragraph designed to allow for a variety of 26 formats and shall not require a prescribed answer or design from the 27 program provider in order to obtain approval from the state board. Any rules adopted by the state board pursuant to this paragraph shall be 28 29 substantially different from the rules adopted for the approval of traditional preparation programs and may not unnecessarily restrict a 30 31 variety of alternative preparation programs from operating and providing instruction in this state. The state board shall evaluate each program 32 provider based on the program's ability to prepare teachers and 33 34 administrators and to recruit teachers and administrators with a variety of experiences and talents. The state board shall allow universities 35 36 under the jurisdiction of the Arizona board of regents, community colleges 37 in this state, private postsecondary institutions licensed by this state, school districts, charter schools, professional organizations, nonprofit 38 organizations and private entities to apply for program approval and shall 39 40 create application procedures and certification criteria that are 41 substantially less restrictive than those for traditional preparation 42 programs. At the completion of an alternative preparation program, 43 graduates shall:

44 (a) Hold a bachelor's degree from an accredited postsecondary45 education institution.

1 (b) If applicable, demonstrate professional knowledge and subject 2 knowledge proficiency pursuant to section 15–533.

3 (c) Obtain a valid fingerprint clearance card pursuant to section
4 15-534.

5 6 (d) If applicable, complete training in structured English immersion as prescribed by the state board pursuant to section 15–756.09.

7 (e) If applicable, complete training in research-based systematic8 phonics instruction as prescribed in paragraph 2 of this subsection.

9 (f) Demonstrate the required proficiency in the Constitutions of 10 the United States and Arizona as prescribed in section 15-532.

11 2. Shall require that, within three years after a certificate for 12 elementary education or early childhood education is issued, the 13 certificate holder complete, from a public or private provider, at least 14 forty-five classroom hours or three college-level credit hours, or the 15 equivalent, in both research-based:

16 (a) Science of reading instruction, including systematic phonics17 instruction.

18 (b) Reading instruction, including training on assessments, 19 instructional practices and interventions to improve student reading 20 proficiency. Beginning July 1, 2021, instruction provided pursuant to 21 this subdivision must meet the requirements for dyslexia training 22 prescribed in section 15-219.

Beginning August 1, 2025, shall establish a literacy endorsement 23 3. 24 as a requirement for all certificated teachers who provide literacy 25 instruction in kindergarten programs or in any of grades one through grade 26 five as determined by the board. The rules shall require that a 27 certificated teacher who receives a certificate after August 1, 2025 and who provides literacy instruction in kindergarten programs or in any of 28 29 grades one through grade five must obtain a literacy endorsement within three years after the teacher's certificate is issued. The rules shall 30 31 require that a certificated teacher who received a certificate before August 1, 2025 and who provides literacy instruction in kindergarten 32 33 programs or in any of grades one through grade five must obtain a literacy endorsement on or before August 1, 2028. The literacy endorsement shall 34 require the teacher to complete evidence-based science of reading training 35 36 or coursework as determined by the board and to pass a literacy 37 instruction assessment to show that the teacher is capable of doing all of 38 the following:

39 (a) Effectively teaching foundational reading skills, phonemic
 40 awareness, phonics, fluency, vocabulary and comprehension.

41 (b) Implementing reading instruction using high-quality 42 instructional materials.

43 (c) Providing effective instruction and interventions for students 44 with reading deficiencies, including students with characteristics of 45 dyslexia. 4. Beginning August 1, 2022, shall require all approved educator preparation programs in elementary education and early childhood education to require the courses that are necessary to obtain a literacy endorsement pursuant to paragraph 3 of this subsection.

5 5. Shall establish a process to allow a local education agency, at 6 the request of a teacher, to verify to the department of education that 7 the teacher possesses the instructional knowledge and skills prescribed in this 8 of subsection, demonstrated paragraph 3 through classroom 9 and student achievement data observations across subgroups using 10 evidence-based measures. A certificated teacher who has had a local 11 education agency verify the teacher's knowledge and skills in the science 12 of reading pursuant to this paragraph is not required to complete the 13 coursework, training or assessment requirements prescribed in paragraph 3 14 of this subsection to obtain the literacy endorsement.

15 6. Shall not require a teacher to obtain a master's degree or to 16 take any additional graduate courses as a condition of certification or 17 recertification.

7. Shall allow but shall not require the superintendent of a school
 district to obtain certification from the state board of education.

20 Shall provide for the issuance of a subject-matter expert 8. 21 standard teaching certificate to persons who have expertise in a content 22 area or A subject matter. Persons who are certified pursuant to this paragraph shall complete training, if applicable, in structured English 23 24 immersion as prescribed by the state board pursuant to section 15-756.09. 25 Persons who are certified pursuant to this paragraph are exempt from the 26 subject knowledge proficiency requirements prescribed in section 15-533 27 and from the proficiency requirements prescribed in section 15-532 on the 28 Constitutions of the United States and Arizona. Persons who are subject 29 to subdivision (a) of this paragraph are also exempt from the professional 30 knowledge proficiency requirements pursuant to section 15-533. A person 31 who obtains a subject-matter expert standard teaching certificate pursuant 32 to this paragraph may provide instruction in the person's field of expertise in grades six through twelve at any public school in this state. 33 34 Issuance of the subject-matter expert standard teaching certificate may 35 not be conditioned on the person's employment with a local education 36 agency. A person who meets the requirements of this paragraph shall be 37 issued a subject-matter expert standard teaching certificate without 38 having to demonstrate professional knowledge proficiency pursuant to section 15-533, except that the person shall have at least two years to 39 40 demonstrate professional knowledge proficiency pursuant to section 15-533. 41 School districts shall evaluate and provide support pursuant to section 15-537 to teachers who are certified pursuant to this paragraph. If a 42 43 person fails to meet the professional knowledge requirements of this section within two years, the department of education or state board of 44 45 education may temporarily suspend the subject-matter expert standard

1 teaching certificate. A certificate that is temporarily suspended 2 pursuant to this paragraph is not considered a disciplinary action, and a 3 person shall be allowed to correct the deficiency within the remaining 4 time of the subject-matter expert standard teaching certification. This 5 paragraph does not require a person who has obtained another type of 6 teaching certificate from the state board to obtain a subject-matter 7 expert standard teaching certificate pursuant to this paragraph in order 8 to provide instruction in grades six through twelve. PERSONS WHO ARE 9 CERTIFICATED PURSUANT TO THIS PARAGRAPH SHALL REVIEW AND ATTEST TO 10 REVIEWING THE BEST PRACTICES FOR SOCIAL MEDIA AND CELLULAR TELEPHONE USE BETWEEN STUDENTS AND SCHOOL PERSONNEL ADOPTED BY THE STATE BOARD OF 11 12 EDUCATION PURSUANT TO SECTION 15-203, SUBSECTION A, PARAGRAPH 44 BEFORE 13 RECEIVING A CERTIFICATE AND, WITHIN TWO YEARS AFTER RECEIVING A 14 CERTIFICATE, COMPLETE TRAINING IN PROFESSIONALISM AND ETHICS FROM A PUBLIC OR PRIVATE PROVIDER APPROVED BY THE STATE BOARD OF EDUCATION, WHICH MAY 15 16 INCLUDE A NO-COST OPTION TO THE PERSON PROVIDED BY THE STATE BOARD. A 17 person is eligible for a subject-matter expert standard teaching 18 certificate pursuant to this paragraph if the person has a baccalaureate 19 degree and meets any of the following requirements:

(a) Has taught courses relevant to a content area or subject matter for the last two consecutive years and for a total of at least three years at one or more regionally or nationally accredited public or private postsecondary institutions. A person demonstrates compliance with this requirement by providing the state board with written proof of employment for specific durations from one or more qualifying postsecondary institutions.

(b) Has either a baccalaureate degree, a master's degree or a
 doctoral degree in a specific subject area that is relevant to a content
 area or subject matter taught in public schools.

30 (c) Demonstrates expertise through relevant work experience of at 31 least five years in a field that is relevant to a content area or subject 32 matter taught in public schools. A person demonstrates compliance with 33 this requirement by providing the state board with written proof of 34 employment.

9. Notwithstanding section 15-533, shall exempt persons applying for a secondary education certificate from the subject knowledge portion of the proficiency examination if the state board determines that the person has work experience in science, technology, engineering or mathematics and can demonstrate adequate knowledge of a particular subject through a postsecondary education degree or twenty-four credit hours of relevant coursework.

42 10. Shall allow for a certificate issued to a person pursuant to 43 subsection B, paragraph 1, 3, 4 or 5 of this section or section 15-203 or 44 15-782.01, as applicable, to be both issued and renewed for at least 45 twelve years and may not require more than fifteen hours of continuing education credits each year in order to renew that certificate pursuant to this paragraph.

3 11. Shall allow for a certificate issued to a person pursuant to subsection B of this section or section 15-132, 15-203 or 15-782.01, as 4 5 applicable, and any endorsement or approved area related to that certificate, to be renewed at least two years but not more than ten years 6 7 after that certificate expires without any other requirements adopted by 8 the state board of education or the department of education if the person 9 is in good standing, has at least ten years of verified full-time 10 experience in this state in the area in which the person is seeking 11 renewed certification and possesses a valid fingerprint clearance card 12 issued pursuant to section 15-534. A certificate renewed pursuant to this 13 paragraph shall be identical to the expired certificate.

D. The rules for certification reciprocity shall 14 include а requirement that the applicant possess a comparable valid certification 15 16 from another state and be in good standing with that other state. An 17 applicant who possesses a valid certification from another state and a 18 fingerprint clearance card pursuant to section 15-534 and who is in good 19 standing with that other state shall be issued a comparable standard 20 certificate or a comparable certificate issued pursuant to section 15-132, 21 15-203 or 15-782.01, as applicable, without any other requirements from 22 the state board of education or the department of education. A person who 23 is issued a certificate pursuant to this subsection is not required to 24 meet any requirement prescribed in section 15-533.

25 E. Placement decisions of teaching intern certificate holders 26 issued pursuant to subsection C, paragraph 1 of this section and section 15-552 shall be based on agreements between the teacher preparation 27 provider, the provider's partner organizations and the local education 28 29 agency. The practices of the department of education and the rules and 30 policies of the state board of education may not restrict placement of 31 teaching intern certification holders based on local education agency 32 instructional models and may only consider the academic quality of the school, the effectiveness of the teaching intern certification holder's 33 34 on-site mentor and the opportunity for a wide variety of schools and 35 school models to access teaching intern certification holders.

36 F. Notwithstanding subsection A of this section, the following 37 persons are not required to have a baccalaureate degree:

38 1. A teacher who is otherwise exempt by law from obtaining a 39 baccalaureate degree and who provides instruction in STEM or career and 40 technical education pursuant to section 15-782.01.

F. The state board of education may grant a standard teaching certificate OR ANY OTHER CERTIFICATE ISSUED BY THE BOARD for at least three years to a teacher who has not met the requirements of this section at the time of application.

G. A person is not required to pass the proficiency examination or the equivalent examination more than once. The state board of education may adopt rules to modify the requirements of subsection B or C of this section for persons who have taught, obtained certification or obtained a master's degree in another country.

H. A person who is not required to pass the proficiency examination developed and administered in this state by the state board of education pursuant to this section shall only be granted reciprocity for those proficiency examinations required in this state that pertain to the grade levels and content areas that the person is certified to teach in another state.

15-553. <u>School districts and charter schools; classroom-based</u> preparation program providers; teacher certification; rules

A. In addition to any alternative preparation program provider path approved by the state board of education, a school district or charter school may apply to the state board of education for authority to approve the certification of teachers as a classroom-based preparation program provider. 1 B. The state board of education shall adopt rules, policies and procedures to be administered by the department of education. The rules 2 3 may not be more restrictive or require more than is prescribed in this 4 subsection. The rules shall facilitate the approval and certification 5 process pursuant to this section and provide for all of the following:

6 1. The superintendent of a school district or the principal of a 7 charter school must verify that the applicant for certification has made 8 satisfactory progress and achievement with students. A teacher who is 9 teaching courses or subjects that are tested by the statewide assessment 10 pursuant to section 15-741 may not receive a certificate pursuant to this 11 section until the teacher has been in the classroom for at least two years 12 and student data has been submitted by the school district or charter 13 school confirming that the teacher's students, at the end of the school 14 year, either are performing at grade level or have achieved at least one year of academic growth at a rate equivalent to the state average for the 15 16 students' associated peer groups.

17 2. For informational purposes only, allow A school district or 18 charter school to MUST submit a program sequence or training schedule 19 along with any information regarding mentoring and coaching of teacher 20 candidates. THE STATE BOARD OF EDUCATION SHALL PROVIDE FOR A VARIETY OF 21 OPTIONS IN PROGRAM SEQUENCE, CONTENT AND DESIGN AND MAY NOT REQUIRE A 22 PRESCRIBED PROGRAM SEQUENCE, CONTENT OR DESIGN FROM THE SCHOOL DISTRICT OR 23 CHARTER SCHOOL IN ORDER TO OBTAIN APPROVAL FROM THE STATE BOARD.

24 3. A school district or charter school must submit data supporting 25 the efficacy of the school district's or charter school's teacher 26 preparation program. A school district or charter school may contract 27 with a third-party provider to provide the teacher preparation program and 28 may use that program's efficacy data to meet the requirements of this 29 paragraph.

30 4. A school district or charter school may adopt PROFESSIONAL 31 EXPECTATIONS. PROFESSIONAL REQUIREMENTS OR student achievement 32 requirements that exceed the student achievement EXPECTATIONS AND 33 requirements prescribed by this section, INCLUDING REQUIRING CANDIDATES TO 34 COMPLETE SPECIFIED COURSEWORK OR TRAININGS.

IN ORDER TO RECEIVE A CLASSROOM-BASED STANDARD TEACHING 36 CERTIFICATE AFTER SUCCESSFULLY COMPLETING THE PROGRAM, an applicant for 37 certification pursuant to this section must hold at least a bachelor's degree from an accredited public or private postsecondary institution and 38 39 meet background and fingerprint clearance card requirements pursuant to 40 section 15-534.

41 6. An applicant pursuing certification pursuant to this section must demonstrate subject knowledge and professional knowledge through any 42 43 available option pursuant to section 15-533.

10 C. On the submission of verification from a school district or 11 charter school that the requirements prescribed in this section have been 12 met, the state board shall issue a classroom-based standard teaching 13 certificate to the teacher pursuant to section 15-203.

D. A school district or charter school may employ and enroll emergency teacher certification holders with a bachelor's degree into its classroom-based preparation program. Notwithstanding any other law and beginning in school year 2020-2021, a school district may hire and enroll into its classroom-based preparation program any teaching candidate who meets the requirements of subsection B, paragraph 5 of this section.

D. NOTWITHSTANDING ANY OTHER LAW, A SCHOOL DISTRICT OR CHARTER 20 21 SCHOOL MAY EMPLOY AND ENROLL ANY CANDIDATE INTO ITS CLASSROOM-BASED PREPARATION PROGRAM WHO MEETS THE BACKGROUND AND FINGERPRINT CLEARANCE 22 CARD REQUIREMENTS PURSUANT TO SECTION 15-534 AND WHO HOLDS AT LEAST A 23 24 BACHELOR'S DEGREE FROM AN ACCREDITED PUBLIC OR PRIVATE POSTSECONDARY INSTITUTION, EXCEPT THAT A SCHOOL DISTRICT OR CHARTER SCHOOL THAT OPERATES 25 26 A CLASSROOM-BASED PREPARATION PROGRAM MAY ENROLL A CANDIDATE WHO DOES NOT 27 CURRENTLY HOLD A BACHELOR'S DEGREE FROM AN ACCREDITED PUBLIC OR PRIVATE POSTSECONDARY INSTITUTION INTO THE PROGRAM IF THE CANDIDATE MEETS ALL OF 28 29 THE FOLLOWING:

32 2. IS CURRENTLY ENROLLED IN AN ACCREDITED PUBLIC OR PRIVATE33 POSTSECONDARY INSTITUTION BACHELOR'S DEGREE PROGRAM.

34 3. IS NOT A CONTRACTED OR PERMANENT FULL-TIME TEACHER OR THE
 35 TEACHER OF RECORD FOR ANY CLASSROOM OF STUDENTS, EXCEPT THAT THE CANDIDATE
 36 MAY BE EMPLOYED BY THE SCHOOL DISTRICT OR CHARTER SCHOOL.

37 4. DOES NOT REGULARLY INSTRUCT STUDENTS WITHOUT THE PRESENCE OF A CERTIFICATED TEACHER, INSTRUCTIONAL 38 FULL-TIME TEACHER. 445. AN APPLICANT FOR CERTIFICATION PURSUANT TO THIS SECTION MUST45HOLD AT LEAST A BACHELOR'S DEGREE FROM AN ACCREDITED PUBLIC OR PRIVATE

POSTSECONDARY INSTITUTION AND MEET BACKGROUND AND FINGERPRINT CLEARANCE
 CARD REQUIREMENTS PURSUANT TO SECTION 15-534.

6. AN APPLICANT PURSUING CERTIFICATION PURSUANT TO THIS SECTION
MUST DEMONSTRATE SUBJECT KNOWLEDGE AND PROFESSIONAL KNOWLEDGE THROUGH ANY
AVAILABLE OPTION PURSUANT TO SECTION 15-533.

6 7. THE APPLICATION FOR A SCHOOL DISTRICT OR CHARTER SCHOOL TO BE A 7 LOCALLY BASED SCHOOL LEADERSHIP PROGRAM PROVIDER MUST INCLUDE THE 8 FOLLOWING:

ON THE SUBMISSION OF VERIFICATION FROM A SCHOOL DISTRICT OR 16 CHARTER SCHOOL THAT THE REQUIREMENTS PRESCRIBED IN THIS SECTION HAVE BEEN 17 MET, THE STATE BOARD SHALL ISSUE A STANDARD PRINCIPAL, ASSISTANT 18 PRINCIPAL, SUPERVISOR OR OTHER SCHOOL-LEVEL LEADERSHIP POSITION 19 CERTIFICATE TO THE INDIVIDUAL.

20D. NOTWITHSTANDING ANY OTHER LAW, A SCHOOL DISTRICT OR CHARTER21SCHOOL MAY HIRE AND ENROLL INTO ITS PREPARATION PROGRAM ANY CANDIDATE WHO22MEETS THE REQUIREMENTS OF SUBSECTION B, PARAGRAPH 5 OF THIS SECTION.

E. IF A SCHOOL DISTRICT OR CHARTER SCHOOL IS APPROVED AS A LOCALLY 23 24 BASED SCHOOL LEADERSHIP PROGRAM PROVIDER PURSUANT TO THIS SECTION, THE APPROVAL IS VALID FOR SIX YEARS AFTER THE DATE OF APPROVAL. TO CONTINUE 25 26 AS A LOCALLY BASED SCHOOL LEADERSHIP PROGRAM PROVIDER, THE SCHOOL DISTRICT OR CHARTER SCHOOL MUST APPLY FOR RENEWAL BEFORE THE EXPIRATION OF ITS 27 CURRENT APPROVAL. IF THE APPLICATION FOR RENEWAL IS APPROVED BY THE STATE 28 29 BOARD OF EDUCATION, THE RENEWAL IS VALID FOR SIX YEARS AFTER THE DATE OF THE APPROVAL. 30
