HOUSE BILL 2584

AN ACT

AMENDING TITLE 18, CHAPTER 1, ARIZONA REVISED STATUTES, BY ADDING ARTICLE 4; APPROPRIATING MONIES; RELATING TO GOVERNMENT INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY.

1 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Arizona:

2 Section 1. Title 18, chapter 1, Arizona Revised Statutes, is
3 amended by adding article 4, to read:

4 ARTICLE 4. CYBERSECURITY SOFTWARE

5 18-141. Cybersecurity software bids; Arizona department of
6 homeland security

7 THE ARIZONA DEPARTMENT OF HOMELAND SECURITY SHALL SECURE THROUGH A
8 COMPETITIVE BIDDING PROCESS AN ENTERPRISE LICENSE FOR USE BY AGENCIES OF
9 THIS STATE FOR SECURITY SOFTWARE THAT WILL INTEGRATE SECURITY INTO THE
10 DEVELOPMENT PROCESS AND SCAN SOFTWARE CODE IN DEVELOPMENT, PRODUCTION AND
11 POSTPRODUCTION TO DETECT AND IMPROVE SECURITY THREATS BY USING AT LEAST
12 TWO OF THE FOLLOWING TESTING MECHANISMS:

- 13 1. STATIC ANALYSIS SECURITY TESTING.
- 14 2. DYNAMIC TESTING.
- 15 3. PENETRATION TESTING.
- 16 4. SOFTWARE COMPOSITION ANALYSIS.

17 Sec. 2. Appropriation; Arizona department of homeland
18 security; cybersecurity; exemption

19 A. The sum of \$2,000,000 is appropriated from the state general
20 fund in fiscal year 2022-2023 to the Arizona department of homeland
21 security for the purposes prescribed in section 18-141, Arizona Revised
22 Statutes, as added by this act.

23 B. The appropriation made in subsection A of this section is exempt
24 from the provisions of section 35-190, Arizona Revised Statutes, relating
25 to lapsing of appropriations.
