AMENDING LAWS 2018, CHAPTER 278, SECTION 17, AS AMENDED BY LAWS 2021,
CHAPTER 403, SECTION 24; RELATING TO COURTS.

1 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Arizona:

2 Section 1. Laws 2018, chapter 278, section 17, as amended by Laws
3 2021, chapter 403, section 24, is amended to read:

4 Sec. 17. Supreme court; juvenile probation services fund;
5 alternative dispute resolution fund; drug
6 treatment and education fund; Arizona lengthy
7 trial and digital evidence fund; fiscal years
8 2018-2019, 2019-2020, 2020-2021, 2021-2022 and
9 2022-2023

10 Notwithstanding sections 8-322, 12-135, 13-901.02 and 21-222,
11 Arizona Revised Statutes, in fiscal years 2018-2019, 2019-2020, 2020-2021,
12 ~~and~~ 2021-2022 **AND 2022-2023**, the supreme court may use up to \$2,600,000
13 over the combined fiscal years to design, implement and upgrade a new
14 appellate case management system. The total monies allocated by this
15 section may not exceed \$2,600,000. The supreme court may use monies in
16 any of the following funds for the purposes of the new appellate case
17 management system:

18 1. The juvenile probation services fund established by section
19 8-322, Arizona Revised Statutes.

20 2. The alternative dispute resolution fund established by section
21 12-135, Arizona Revised Statutes.

22 3. The drug treatment and education fund established by section
23 13-901.02, Arizona Revised Statutes.

24 4. The Arizona lengthy trial **AND DIGITAL EVIDENCE** fund established
25 by section 21-222, Arizona Revised Statutes.
