AMENDING LAWS 2021, CHAPTER 406, SECTION 33, AS AMENDED BY LAWS 2022, CHAPTER 33, SECTION 1; AMENDING LAWS 2022, CHAPTER 309, SECTIONS 5, 8, 9 AND 12; REPEALING LAWS 2022, CHAPTER 309, SECTION 13; MAKING CAPITAL OUTLAY APPROPRIATIONS FOR THE DIFFERENT DEPARTMENTS OF THE STATE AND FOR STATE INSTITUTIONS.

1 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Arizona:

23 A. The following amounts are appropriated from the state general
 24 fund in fiscal year 2022-2023 to the department of administration to
 25 distribute as follows:

29 B. Within thirty days after the last day of each calendar quarter,
30 the department of transportation shall report to the joint legislative
31 budget committee staff the projected cost and status of the projects for
32 the appropriations made in subsection A of this section.

33 C. Before transferring monies between the projects described in
34 subsection A of this section, the department of transportation shall
35 submit a report for review by the joint committee on capital review.

36 D. Notwithstanding section 41-1252, Arizona Revised Statutes, the
37 appropriations made in subsection A of this section are not subject to
38 review by the joint committee on capital review.

39 Sec. 11. Appropriation; department of transportation;
40 Interstate 10; widening; exemption

41 A. The sum of \$89,000,000 is appropriated from the state general
42 fund in fiscal year 2023-2024 to the department of transportation to widen
43 Interstate 10 between Chandler and Casa Grande. The department shall use
44 the monies for construction-related activities, including drawing down
45 federal matching monies for the project.

1 B. Notwithstanding section 41-1252, Arizona Revised Statutes, the
2 appropriation made in subsection A of this section is not subject to
3 review by the joint committee on capital review.

4 Sec. 12. Appropriation; department of transportation;
5 Interstate 17; expansion; exemption

6 A. The sum of \$76,200,000 is appropriated from the state general
7 fund in fiscal year 2023-2024 to the department of transportation to
8 expand Interstate 17 between Anthem and Black Canyon City. The department
9 shall use the monies for construction-related activities, including
10 drawing down federal matching monies for the project.

11 B. Notwithstanding section 41-1252, Arizona Revised Statutes, the
12 appropriation made in subsection A of this section is not subject to
13 review by the joint committee on capital review.

14 Sec. 13. Appropriation; department of transportation;
15 pavement rehabilitation projects; exemption

16 A. The sum of \$54,300,000 is appropriated from the state general
17 fund in fiscal year 2023-2024 to the department of transportation for
18 pavement rehabilitation projects. The department shall select pavement
19 rehabilitation projects that are all of the following:

- 20 1. Not located in Maricopa or Pima county.
- 21 2. On roads that are graded as being in fair or poor condition by
22 the department.
- 23 3. Not contained in the department's 2023-2027 five-year
24 transportation facilities construction program.

25 B. Notwithstanding section 41-1252, Arizona Revised Statutes, the
26 appropriation made in subsection A of this section is not subject to
27 review by the joint committee on capital review.

28 Sec. 14. Appropriation; department of transportation; State
29 Route 347; improvements; exemption; lapsing

30 A. Of the \$19,000,000 appropriation made by Laws 2022, chapter 309,
31 section 8, subsection A, paragraph 19 for the design to widen lanes along
32 State Route 347 between Interstate 10 and city of Maricopa, the sum of
33 \$13,000,000 is reallocated as follows:

- 34 1. \$10,300,000 to the department of transportation to distribute to
35 the city of Maricopa to design and construct improvements to State Route
36 238 or State Route 347, or both.
- 37 2. \$2,000,000 to the department of transportation to distribute to
38 the Gila River Indian Community for transportation infrastructure.
- 39 3. \$700,000 to the department of transportation for engineering and
40 design costs associated with improvements along State Route 87 near the
41 city of Coolidge.

42 B. Notwithstanding section 41-1252, Arizona Revised Statutes, the
43 appropriations made in subsection A of this section are not subject to
44 review by the joint committee on capital review.

1 C. The appropriations made in subsection A of this section do not
2 lapse until the purpose for which the appropriations were made has been
3 accomplished or abandoned, or the appropriations stand for a full fiscal
4 year without an expenditure or encumbrance.

5 Sec. 15. Appropriation; state match advantage for rural
6 transportation fund

7 The sum of \$12,500,000 is appropriated from the state general fund
8 in fiscal year 2023-2024 to the state match advantage for rural
9 transportation fund established by section 28-339, Arizona Revised
10 Statutes.

11 Sec. 16. Appropriation; department of transportation;
12 statewide highway construction; reports;
13 exemption; lapsing

14 A. The amount appropriated in this section is appropriated for
15 fiscal year 2023-2024 to plan and construct state highways, including the
16 national system of interstate highways within this state, the state
17 primary or secondary system, the county primary or secondary system and
18 urban rural routes, to acquire rights-of-way and to provide for the cost
19 of contracted field administration and field engineering on construction
20 projects and debt service payments on bonds issued for highway
21 construction.

22 B. DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION \$444,243,000

23 Fund source:

24 State highway fund \$444,243,000

25 Any balances and collections in the state highway fund that exceed
26 the specific amounts appropriated in the general appropriations act and in
27 this act are appropriated to the department of transportation for the
28 purposes provided in this section.

29 C. On or before November 1, 2023, the department of transportation
30 shall report to the directors of the joint legislative budget committee
31 and the governor's office of strategic planning and budgeting on its
32 actual prior year, estimated current year and upcoming budget year highway
33 construction expenses from all fund sources, including appropriated
34 monies, federal monies, local agency monies, state highway monies, bond
35 proceeds and regional area road monies. The report shall be in the same
36 format as in the prior year unless the directors of the joint legislative
37 budget committee and the governor's office of strategic planning and
38 budgeting have approved modifications to the format.

39 D. On or before November 1, 2023, the department of transportation
40 shall report capital outlay information for fiscal years 2022-2023,
41 2023-2024 and 2024-2025 to the directors of the joint legislative budget
42 committee and the governor's office of strategic planning and budgeting.
43 This information shall appear in the same format as tables two, three and
44 six, as found in the fiscal year 2022-2023 appropriations report.

1 E. On or before November 1, 2023, the department of transportation
2 shall report the department's estimated outstanding debt principal balance
3 at the end of fiscal year 2024-2025 and the estimated debt service payment
4 amount for each of fiscal years 2024-2025, 2025-2026, 2026-2027 and
5 2027-2028 to the directors of the joint legislative budget committee and
6 the governor's office of strategic planning and budgeting. This report
7 shall include state highway fund statewide construction bonds, Arizona
8 highway user revenue fund bonds, Maricopa association of governments and
9 Pima association of governments controlled access bonds, Maricopa regional
10 area road fund bonds and grant anticipation notes and is intended to be

21 by Laws 2021, chapter 406, section 39, subsection E to construct new
22 maintenance facilities in Wickenburg is exempt from the provisions of
23 section 35-190, Arizona Revised Statutes, relating to lapsing of
24 appropriations, until June 30, 2023.

25 Sec. 22. Use of appropriations; limit

26 A. The department of administration may spend up to five percent of
27 the amounts appropriated to the department in this act, excluding amounts
28 to be distributed to nonstate agencies, for expenditures for project
29 management of building renewal and capital projects. All other monies
30 appropriated to the department in this act may not be spent for personal
31 services or employee-related expenditures or for maintenance contracts on
32 building components and equipment without review by the joint committee on
33 capital review.

34 B. Except as provided in subsection A of this section, the monies
35 appropriated in this act may not be spent for personal services or
36 employee-related expenditures of state employees, excluding any services
37 provided as part of the inmate construction program for correctional
38 facilities.
