Bill Number: **HB 2810**

Livingston Floor Amendment

The Floor amendment to HB 2810 in Rep. Livingston's name, dated May 10, 2023, at 2:51 AM:

- Appropriates \$300,000 from the state General Fund (GF) to the Arizona Department of Administration (ADOA) for a distribution to the Kirkland School District.
- Appropriates \$250,000 from the GF to ADOA for an Early Literacy program that places young adult role models in high-need preschool classrooms.
- Extends the lapsing date of the Enduring Freedom Memorial Repair from the fiscal year (FY) 2022 budget to June 30, 2024.
- Increases the Traditional Medicaid Services line item under the Arizona Health Care Cost Containment System (AHCCCS) by \$486,500 for pilot coverage of Rapid Whole Genome Sequencing and exempts the appropriation from lapsing until June 30, 2026.
- Adds a \$250,000 appropriation to the Children's Behavioral Services Fund under AHCCCS.
- Removes the population threshold for the On-call Obstetrics and Gynecological Services line item and limits the program to community health centers.
- Allows AHCCCS to use up to 5% of the On-call Obstetrics and Gynecological Services line item for administrative costs.
- Adds 13 full-time equivalent positions (FTEs) to the Attorney General.
- Increases the appropriation to the Barbering and Cosmetology Board from the Barbering and Cosmetology Fund by \$200,000.
- Reduces the GF appropriation to the Rural Accelerated Broadband Match Fund by \$1,400,000.
- Adds a \$2,000,000 appropriation from the GF for operating state aid at Pima Community College.
- Expands the Arizona Western College Nursing Program line item at \$7,500,000, to an Arizona Western College CTE Workforce line item at \$15,000,000.
- Reduces the GF appropriation to the Department of Corrections for inmate dog training by \$100,000 and exempts the line item from lapsing through FY 2025.

- Appropriates \$5,000,000 from the GF for Area Agencies on Aging Housing Assistance under the Department of Economic Security and adds a footnote specifying that the program is for housing assistance for people at least 60 years old.
- Adds a \$1,000,000 appropriation from the GF to the Arizona Department of Education (ADE) for the Center for High School Success.
- Allows ADE to use its appropriation for Accountability and Achievement Testing in FY 2024 for costs of English language proficiency assessments.
- Exempts the FY 2023 appropriation to the Department of Emergency and Military Affairs for onetime maintenance backfill from lapsing.
- Increases the operating lump sum appropriation of the Arizona Department of Environmental Quality by \$3,000,000 from the Recycling Fund.
- Appropriates \$5,000,000 from the GF to the Department of Forestry and Fire Management for fire district grants with outlined permissible uses, including capital equipment and fire station construction.
- Renames the Event Wagering Operator License Fee Refund line item under the Department of Gaming to the Event Wagering Application License Fee Refund line item, and adds \$100,000 to the line.
- Appropriates \$1,000,000 from the GF to the Department of Gaming for Racetrack Capital Projects and Maintenance and Operation Funding for a commercial live racing permittee in Maricopa County.
- Increases the Dementia Awareness Campaign line item under the Department of Health Services (DHS) by \$250,000.
- Adds a \$2,500,000 GF appropriation for Nurse-Family Partnership Programs under DHS.
- Adds a footnote for the Arizona Department of Housing that allows a portion of the Housing Trust Fund to invest in a long-term lease at a nonprofit-operated facility.
- Removes the 2 FTEs and \$225,900 appropriation to the Judiciary for fiduciary and judicial conduct investigations.
- Removes a footnote governing future probation officer salary increases approved by a county board of supervisors.
- Increases the GF appropriation to the Board of Nursing for the Student Registered Nurse Anesthetist Clinical Rotation Program from \$200,000 to \$450,000.
- Increases the Department of Public Safety (DPS) operating lump sum appropriation by \$1,200,000 and eliminates the appropriation and footnote for the sexual assault kit tracking portal.
- Modifies the DPS footnote on law enforcement retention.
- Exempts the FY 2023 appropriation to DPS for onetime K-9 support from lapsing.
- Directs \$1,500,000 of the DPS operating lump sum for rapid DNA testing and analysis.
- Increases the GF deposit into the Tourism Fund by \$500,000, for distribution to 501(c)(6) organizations that represent various industries.
- Removes the report from the Arizona Board of Regents (ABOR) on the Spouses and Dependents of Law enforcement Officers Tuition Scholarships.

- Modifies allowable uses of the ABOR Washington, DC internships footnote to include learning opportunities less than a full semester.
- Reduces the On-Farm Irrigation Efficiency Fund deposit to the University of Arizona by \$1,000,000.
- Adds a \$1,000,000 GF appropriation to the University of Arizona Health Sciences Center for fall prevention studies.
- Directs 100% of land earnings trust and interest from the School of Mines Land Fund to be distributed to the University of Arizona School of Mining and Mineral Resources.
- Adds a \$1,500,000 GF appropriation to the Arizona Department of Veterans' Services for a Tribal Connectivity Project line item for telecommunications and internet capabilities to tribal chapter houses.
- Moves various water-related projects from the Treasurer local distribution to a distribution from the Water Infrastructure Finance Authority (WIFA) for local distributions.
- Outlines uses for water projects assistance grants.
- Allows FY 2023 Border Security Fund deposits to be used for other purposes consistent with the Border Security Fund.
- Increases the reduction of the FY 2024 WIFA Long-Term Water Augmentation Fund from \$138,800,000 to \$143,800,000.
- Appropriates a non-lapsing \$1,000,000 from the GF to the Arizona Power Authority for resource planning and a needs assessment.
- Transfers a firearm training simulator appropriation from Flagstaff Police Department to Phoenix Police Department.
- Makes technical revenue estimate adjustments.

5 The water infrastructure finance authority of Arizona shall
6 distribute the monies in the Gilbert wells project line item to the town of
7 Gilbert for the rehabilitation and drilling of new water wells.

8 The water infrastructure finance authority of Arizona shall
9 distribute the monies in the Glendale irrigation and xeriscaping line item
10 to the city of Glendale for irrigation system and xeriscaping.
