THE DATA SHALL BE RETAINED IN THE ONLINE PORTAL FOR AT 24 LEAST TEN FULL FISCAL YEARS.

29 C. H. The department of administration EDUCATION shall contract with a third party to develop the ONLINE TRANSPARENCY portal prescribed in 30 31 subsection A of this section. The third party selected by the department 32 must meet all of the following:

1. Have experience in building education finance platforms to show 33 school financial information in a transparent and easily understandable 34 35 format.

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Be incorporated for at least five years. 2.

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3. Have an exclusive focus on K-12 education finance technology.

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4. Have at least five years of experience building cloud-hosted education finance software.

40 5. Have experience integrating with the uniform system of financial 41 records.

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15-903. Budget format; prohibited expenditures; annual report

A. The superintendent of public instruction in conjunction with the auditor general shall prepare and prescribe a budget format to be utilized USED by all school districts.

7 B. The budget format shall be designed to allow all school 8 districts to plan and provide in detail for the use of USING available 9 funds MONIES. The budget format shall contain distinct sections for, but need not be limited to, maintenance and operation, debt service, special 10 11 projects, capital outlay, adjacent ways and classroom site fund. The 12 maintenance and operation section shall include, but need not be limited 13 to, separate subsections for regular education programs, special education programs and operational expenditures for pupil transportation. Each 14 subsection shall clearly distinguish classroom instruction expenditures. 15 16 The special education program subsection shall include a subtotal for the 17 disability classifications as defined in section 15-761 and programs for 18 gifted, vocational and technical education, remedial education and bilingual students. The total expenditures for each of these programs 19 20 shall be included on the budget form. The pupil transportation subsection 21 shall include all operational expenditures relating to the transportation 22 of TRANSPORTING pupils, including all operational expenditures within a contract if the school district contracts for pupil transportation. 23

C. The capital outlay section of the budget shall include a subsection for unrestricted capital outlay. The unrestricted capital outlay subsection shall include budgeted expenditures for acquisitions by purchase, lease-purchase or lease of capital items as defined in the uniform system of financial records and shall include:

Land, buildings and improvements to land and buildings,
 including labor and related employee benefits costs and material costs if
 work is performed by school district employees.

32 2. Furniture, furnishings, athletic equipment and other equipment,33 including computer software.

34 3. Pupil and nonpupil transportation vehicles and equipment, 35 including all capital expenditures within a contract if the school 36 district contracts for pupil transportation.

37 4. Textbooks and related printed subject matter materials adopted38 by the governing board.

- 39 5. Instructional aids.
- 40 6. Library books.

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7. Payment of principal and interest on bonds.

42 8. School district administration emergency needs that are directly43 related to pupils.

The budget format shall contain distinct subsections for the 2 following: 3 Special programs to improve academic achievement of pupils in 1. 4 kindergarten programs and grades one through three as provided in section 5 15-482. 6 2. School plant funds. 7 3. Capital outlay budget increases as provided in section 15-481. 8 4. Property taxation, including the following: 9 (a) The primary tax rates for the school district for the current year and the budget year. 10 11 (b) The secondary tax rates for maintenance and operation, K-3 and 12 capital overrides for the school district for the current year and the 13 budget year. 14 (c) The secondary tax rates for class A bonds for the school district for the current year and the budget year. 15 16 (d) The secondary tax rates for class B bonds for the school 17 district for the current year and the budget year. 18 5. A description of any corrections or adjustments made to the 19 budget pursuant to section 15-915. 20 E. The budget format shall also contain: 21 1. A statement identifying proposed pupil-teacher ratios and 22 pupil-staff ratios relating to the provision of special education services 23 for the budget year. 24 2. A statement identifying the number of full-time equivalent 25 certified employees. 26 3.  be submitted for each proposed, adopted and revised budget.

I. On or before November 30 of each year, the department of education shall electronically submit to the joint legislative budget committee and the governor's office of strategic planning and budgeting a report that compiles the information required by subsection E, paragraphs 3 through 6-8 of this section for all school districts statewide.

F. The legislature intends that the appropriation made in subsection A, paragraph 2 of this section be considered ongoing funding in future years.

Sec. 8. Conditional enactment
