## AN ACT

AMENDING SECTIONS 15-154 AND 15-155, ARIZONA REVISED STATUTES; RELATING TO SCHOOL SAFETY REQUIREMENTS.

1 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Arizona: 2 Section 1. Section 15-154, Arizona Revised Statutes, is amended to 3 read: 4 15-154. <u>School safety program; purpose; program proposals;</u> 5 requirements; annual report; definitions 6 A. The school safety program is established within the department 7 of education to support, promote and enhance safe and effective learning 8 environments for all students by supporting the costs of placing school 9 resource officers, juvenile probation officers, school counselors and school social workers AND SCHOOL MENTAL HEALTH PROFESSIONALS on school 10 11 campuses. A school district or charter school may apply to participate in 12 the school safety program as provided in this section for up to three 13 fiscal years by submitting, <del>by April</del> ON OR BEFORE FEBRUARY 15, a program proposal to the department of education. A school district or charter 14 15 school that receives approval for a three-year program under this 16 subsection may annually submit a modified spending plan for its approved 17 program. 18 B. A program proposal submitted by a school district or charter 19 school for supporting the costs of placing school resource officers or 20 juvenile probation officers, or both, on a school campus shall contain: 21 1. A detailed description of the school safety needs of the charter 22 school or school district. 23 2. A plan for implementing a law-related education program or a 24 plan that demonstrates the existence of a law-related education program as a school safety prevention strategy. 25 26 3. A plan to use trained school resource officers or juvenile 27 probation officers in the school, or both. 28 4. If the school district or charter school already has 29 participated in the school safety program, information on the success, compliance and implementation of the most recent grant. 30 31 C. A program proposal submitted by a school district or charter 32 school for supporting the costs of placing school counselors or school 33 social workers, or both, MENTAL HEALTH PROFESSIONALS on a school campus 34 shall contain: 35 1. A detailed description of the school safety needs of the charter 36 school or school district. 37 2. A plan for implementing a school guidance and counseling program 38 that includes the following: (a) A detailed description of the relationship between the school 39 40 counselor or the social worker, or both, MENTAL HEALTH PROFESSIONAL and 41 local community resources. (b) A plan for using school counselor and school social worker 42 43 MENTAL HEALTH PROFESSIONAL services in the school, or both.

1 (c) A detailed description of the methods for evaluating the 2 effectiveness of the school <del>guidance and counseling</del> MENTAL HEALTH 3 PROFESSIONAL SERVICES plan.

4 (d) Policies on confidentiality under the school <del>guidance and</del> 5 <del>counseling</del> MENTAL HEALTH PROFESSIONAL SERVICES plan.

6 (e) Policies on notifying parents and other family members of 7 issues or concerns as identified in the school <del>guidance and counseling</del> 8 MENTAL HEALTH PROFESSIONAL SERVICES plan.

9 (f) A detailed description of the school's, school district's or 10 charter school's referral procedures to the appropriate community entities 11 and state agencies.

12 3. If the school district or charter school has already 13 participated in the school safety program, information on the success, 14 compliance and implementation of the most recent approved program 15 proposal.

16 D. The department of education shall review and administer the 17 school resource officers and juvenile probation officers program proposals 18 in cooperation with the courts, law enforcement agencies and law-related education providers awarded a contract pursuant to section 41-2534, 19 20 subject to review and approval by the state board of education. The 21 department of education shall use relevant crime statistics to assess the 22 needs of each program proposal and shall visit school districts and charter schools that submit program proposals in order to verify the 23 24 information contained in the program proposals. The department of 25 education shall contract to provide guidelines, curricula and support 26 resources for school resource officers and juvenile probation officers to 27 use in implementing a law-related education program.

E. The department of education shall review and administer the 28 29 school counselors and school social workers MENTAL HEALTH PROFESSIONALS program proposals in cooperation with school administrators, principals, 30 31 teachers, parents and community mental health professionals. The department of education shall use relevant school-level academic, social 32 and emotional statistics to assess the needs of each program proposal and 33 34 shall visit school districts and charter schools that submit program proposals in order to verify the information contained in the program 35 36 proposals.

F. The department of education, subject to the review and approval of the state board of education, shall distribute monies to the school districts and charter schools that are in compliance with program requirements and whose program proposals have been approved by the state board of education.

42 G. The department of education shall review program proposals 43 submitted by school districts and charter schools for participation in the 44 school safety program and shall select school sites that are eligible to 45 receive funding based on school safety needs pursuant to this section. The department of education may prioritize program proposals for school resource officer and juvenile probation officer grants to school districts and charter schools that have agreements to share the cost of the school resource officer or juvenile probation officer with a law enforcement agency or the courts.

6 H. The department of education shall evaluate the effectiveness of 7 all the approved program proposals submitted pursuant to subsections B and 8 C of this section within the school safety program and report on the 9 activities of the program and the participants in the school safety program to the president of the senate, the speaker of the house of 10 11 representatives and the governor on or before November 1 of each year and 12 shall provide a copy of this report to the secretary of state. The 13 evaluation and report shall include survey results from participating 14 schools and data from participating schools on the impact of participating in the school safety program. The department shall establish data 15 16 guidelines for school safety program participants to follow in reporting 17 pursuant to this subsection.

I. The school safety program established by this section shall include a school safety program guidance manual adopted by the department of education that requires a dispute resolution process to be included in the service agreement between a school district or charter school that submitted a program proposal and received a school resource officer grant from the school safety program and the law enforcement agency that provides services to the school district or charter school.

J. Any appropriations that are made to the department of education for the approved program proposals within the school safety program are exempt from the provisions of section 35-190 relating to lapsing of appropriations. All monies that are not used for an approved program proposal within the school safety program during the fiscal year for which the monies were appropriated revert to the department of education for distribution to the program in the following fiscal year.

32 K. Monies received by a school district or charter school under the 33 program shall be spent to implement the approved program proposals.

L. The auditor general shall include the school safety program as part of its ongoing sunset review of agencies and programs.

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M. For the purposes of this section:

"Law-related education" means interactive education to equip
children and youth with knowledge and skills pertaining to the law, school
safety and effective citizenship.

2. "Law-related education program" means a program designed to provide children and youth with knowledge, skills and activities pertaining to the law and legal process and to promote law-abiding behavior with the purpose of preventing children and youth from engaging in delinquency or violence and enabling them to become productive citizens.

1 "School counselor" means a professional educator who holds a 3. 2 valid school counselor certificate issued by the department of education. 3 "SCHOOL MENTAL HEALTH PROFESSIONAL" MEANS ANY OF THE FOLLOWING: 3. (a) A PROFESSIONAL EDUCATOR WHO HOLDS A VALID SCHOOL COUNSELOR 4 5 CERTIFICATE ISSUED BY THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION. 6 (b) A PROFESSIONAL EDUCATOR WHO HOLDS A VALID SCHOOL SOCIAL WORKER 7 CERTIFICATE ISSUED BY THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION. 8 (c) AN INDIVIDUAL WHO HOLDS A VALID SCHOOL PSYCHOLOGIST CERTIFICATE 9 ISSUED BY THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION. 10 (d) AN INDIVIDUAL WHO MEETS ALL OF THE FOLLOWING REQUIREMENTS: 11 (i) IS A BEHAVIORAL HEALTH PROFESSIONAL WHO IS LICENSED PURSUANT TO 12 TITLE 32. CHAPTER 33. 13 (ii) PROVIDES CHILDREN'S BEHAVIORAL HEATH SERVICES PURSUANT TO 14 SECTION 36-3436. 15 (iii) PROVIDES OR WILL PROVIDE SCHOOL-BASED MENTAL HEALTH SERVICES 16 PURSUANT TO A CONTRACT WITH THE SCHOOL DISTRICT OR CHARTER SCHOOL 17 4. "School guidance and counseling MENTAL HEALTH PROFESSIONALS 18 program" means a counseling program that supports, promotes and enhances 19 the academic, personal, social, emotional and career development of all 20 students. 21 5. "School resource officer" means а peace officer or а 22 full-authority reserve peace officer who is certified by the Arizona peace 23 officer standards and training board. 24 6. "School social worker" means a professional educator who holds a 25 valid school social worker certificate issued by the department σf 26 education. 27 Sec. 2. Section 15-155, Arizona Revised Statutes, is amended to 28 read: 29 15-155. <u>School safety program; funding</u> A. The department of education shall cooperate with the county 30 31 school superintendent, the county sheriff and the local chief of police to allow a law enforcement agency, with the consent of the school, to assign 32 33 a peace officer or a full authority Arizona peace officer standards and training board certified reserve peace officer to participate in the 34 35 school safety program in each school in the county. The cost of the peace 36 officer is a state charge that is funded by the department of education, 37 except for agreements to share the cost of the school resource officer pursuant to section 15-154, subsection G. 38 39 B. In cooperation with the department of education and the county 40 school superintendent and with the consent of the school, the presiding 41 judge of the juvenile court may assign juvenile probation officers to 42 participate in the school safety program in each school in the county. 43 The cost of juvenile probation officers is a state charge that is funded 44 by the department of education, except for agreements to share the cost of 45 the juvenile probation officer pursuant to section 15-154, subsection G.
