<u>SB 1024</u>: public rights-of-way; unlawful acts Sponsor: Senator Kavanagh, LD 3 Transmitted to Governor

Overview

Prohibits the erection of a habitation in a public street, highway, alley, lane, parkway, sidewalk or other right-of-way (public right-of-way).

<u>History</u>

Statute defines a *right-of-way*, when used within the context of the real property on which transportation facilities are constructed or maintained, as the land or interest in land within the right-of-way boundary. Rights-of-way are most notably used and purchased by government for the purpose of roads, highways, sidewalks and other transportation corridors (A.R.S. §§ <u>28-101</u>; <u>28-363</u>).

Provisions

- 1. Prohibits a person from erecting or maintaining a habitation in a public right-of-way. (Sec. 1)
- 2. Specifies that *habitation* includes tents, tarps, boxes or similar objects. (Sec. 1)
- 3. Provides that this prohibition does not apply to commercial motor vehicles. (Sec. 1)
