## AN ACT

AMENDING SECTIONS 15-154 AND 15-155, ARIZONA REVISED STATUTES; AMENDING TITLE 41, CHAPTER 56, ARTICLE 1, ARIZONA REVISED STATUTES, BY ADDING SECTION 41-5706; RELATING TO SCHOOL SAFETY REQUIREMENTS.

1 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Arizona: 2 Section 1. Section 15-154, Arizona Revised Statutes, is amended to 3 read: 4 15-154. <u>School safety program; purpose; program proposals;</u> 5 requirements; annual report; definitions 6 A. The school safety program is established within the department 7 of education to support, promote and enhance safe and effective learning 8 environments for all students by supporting the costs of placing school 9 resource officers, juvenile probation officers, SCHOOL SAFETY OFFICERS, school counselors, and school social workers AND SCHOOL PSYCHOLOGISTS on 10 11 school campuses. THE SCHOOL SAFETY PROGRAM MAY ALSO SUPPORT THE COSTS OF 12 SAFETY TRAINING PURCHASING SAFETY TECHNOLOGY. AND INFRASTRUCTURE 13 IMPROVEMENTS FOR SCHOOL CAMPUSES AS PROVIDED IN SUBSECTION D OF THIS SECTION. A school district or charter school may apply to participate in 14 the school safety program as provided in this section for up to three 15 16 fiscal years by submitting by April 15 a program proposal to the 17 department of education. A school district or charter school that 18 receives approval for a three-year program under this subsection may 19 annually submit a modified spending plan for its approved program. 20 B. A program proposal submitted by a school district or charter 21 school for supporting the costs of placing school resource officers, or 22 juvenile probation officers OR SCHOOL SAFETY OFFICERS, or <del>both</del> ANY 23 COMBINATION OF THESE OFFICERS, on a school campus shall contain: 24 1. A detailed description of the school safety needs of the charter 25 school or school district. 26 2. A plan for implementing a law-related education program or a 27 plan that demonstrates the existence of a law-related education program as 28 a school safety prevention strategy. 29 3. A plan to use trained school resource officers, or juvenile 30 probation officers OR SCHOOL SAFETY OFFICERS, OR ANY COMBINATION OF THESE 31 OFFICERS, in the school, or both. 4. A PLAN TO TRAIN SCHOOL RESOURCE OFFICERS, JUVENILE PROBATION 32 33 OFFICERS OR SCHOOL SAFETY OFFICERS, OR ANY COMBINATION OF THESE OFFICERS, 34 ON THE FAMILY EDUCATIONAL RIGHTS AND PRIVACY ACT, CIVIL RIGHTS AND 35 ADOLESCENT MENTAL HEALTH ISSUES. 36 4. 5. If the school district or charter school has already 37 participated in the school safety program, information on the success, 38 compliance and implementation of the most recent grant. 39 C. A program proposal submitted by a school district or charter 40 school for supporting the costs of placing school counselors, or school 41 social workers OR SCHOOL PSYCHOLOGISTS, or both ANY COMBINATION OF SCHOOL 42 COUNSELORS, SCHOOL SOCIAL WORKERS OR SCHOOL PSYCHOLOGISTS, on a school 43 campus shall contain: 1. A detailed description of the school safety needs of the charter 44 45 school or school district.

1 2. A plan for implementing a school guidance and counseling program 2 that includes the following: 3 (a) A detailed description of the relationship between the school counselor, or the SCHOOL social worker OR SCHOOL PSYCHOLOGIST, or both ANY 4 5 COMBINATION OF SCHOOL COUNSELORS, SCHOOL SOCIAL WORKERS OR SCHOOL 6 PSYCHOLOGISTS, and local community resources. 7 (b) A plan for using school counselor, and school social worker OR SCHOOL PSYCHOLOGIST SERVICES, OR ANY COMBINATION OF SCHOOL COUNSELOR, 8 9 SCHOOL SOCIAL WORKER OR SCHOOL PSYCHOLOGIST services, in the school, or 10 both. 11 (c) A detailed description of the methods for evaluating the 12 effectiveness of the school guidance and counseling plan. 13 (d) Policies on confidentiality under the school guidance and 14 counseling plan. (e) Policies on notifying parents and other family members of 15 16 issues or concerns as identified in the school guidance and counseling 17 plan. 18 (f) A detailed description of the school's, school district's or 19 charter school's referral procedures to the appropriate community entities 20 and state agencies. 21 3. If the school district or charter school has already 22 participated in the school safety program, information on the success, 23 compliance and implementation of the most recent approved program 24 proposal. D. IF A SCHOOL DISTRICT OR CHARTER SCHOOL WHOSE PROGRAM PROPOSAL 25 26 PURSUANT TO SUBSECTION B OF THIS SECTION WAS APPROVED BY THE STATE BOARD OF EDUCATION CANNOT PLACE ONE OR MORE OF THE SCHOOL RESOURCE OFFICER. 27 JUVENILE PROBATION OFFICER OR SCHOOL SAFETY OFFICER OR COMBINATION OF 28 THESE OFFICERS INCLUDED IN THE APPROVED PROGRAM PROPOSAL, THE SCHOOL 29 DISTRICT OR CHARTER SCHOOL MAY SUBMIT AN ALTERNATIVE PROGRAM PROPOSAL FOR 30 31 SUPPORTING THE COSTS OF PURCHASING SAFETY TECHNOLOGY, SAFETY TRAINING AND INFRASTRUCTURE IMPROVEMENTS FOR SCHOOL CAMPUSES. AN ALTERNATIVE PROGRAM 32 33 PROPOSAL SUBMITTED PURSUANT TO THIS SUBSECTION SHALL CONTAIN: 34 1. A DETAILED DESCRIPTION OF THE SAFETY NEEDS OF THE CHARTER SCHOOL 35 OR SCHOOL DISTRICT. 36 2. A DETAILED DESCRIPTION OF THE PROPOSED EXPENDITURES AND CAPITAL 37 IMPROVEMENTS, INCLUDING: (a) THE SAFETY NEEDS THAT EACH PROPOSED EXPENDITURE WILL ADDRESS. 38 39 (b) THE SPECIFIC TECHNOLOGY OR TRAINING PROGRAM THAT THE SCHOOL 40 DISTRICT OR CHARTER SCHOOL SEEKS TO ACQUIRE. 41 (c) FOR INFRASTRUCTURE IMPROVEMENTS, ALL COSTS ASSOCIATED WITH THE 42 IMPROVEMENTS. INCLUDING ARCHITECTURAL AND ENGINEERING FEES, SAFETY 43 EVALUATIONS AND EQUIPMENT FOR SECURING ENTRANCES AND EXITS. 3. ANY OTHER INFORMATION REQUESTED BY THE DEPARTMENT. 44

1 D. E. The department of education shall review and administer the 2 school resource officers, and juvenile probation officers AND SCHOOL 3 SAFETY OFFICERS program proposals in cooperation with the courts, law 4 enforcement agencies and law-related education providers awarded a 5 contract pursuant to section 41-2534, subject to review and approval by 6 the state board of education. The department of education shall use 7 relevant crime statistics to assess the needs of each program proposal and 8 shall visit school districts and charter schools that submit program 9 proposals in order to verify the information contained in the program proposals. The department of education shall contract 10 to provide 11 guidelines, curricula and support resources for school resource officers 12 and juvenile probation officers AND SCHOOL SAFETY OFFICERS to use in 13 implementing a law-related education program.

14 E. F. The department of education shall review and administer the school counselors, and school social workers AND SCHOOL PSYCHOLOGISTS 15 16 program proposals in cooperation with school administrators, principals, 17 parents and community mental teachers. health professionals. The 18 department of education shall use relevant school-level academic, social 19 and emotional statistics to assess the needs of each program proposal and 20 shall visit school districts and charter schools that submit program 21 proposals in order to verify the information contained in the program 22 proposals.

G. THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION SHALL REVIEW AND ADMINISTER THE 23 24 SAFETY TECHNOLOGY, SAFETY TRAINING AND INFRASTRUCTURE IMPROVEMENTS PROGRAM PROPOSALS. THE DEPARTMENT SHALL USE RELEVANT CRIME STATISTICS TO ASSESS 25 26 THE NEEDS OF EACH PROGRAM PROPOSAL AND MAY VISIT SCHOOL DISTRICTS AND 27 CHARTER SCHOOLS THAT SUBMIT PROGRAM PROPOSALS IN ORDER TO VERIFY THE INFORMATION CONTAINED IN THE PROGRAM PROPOSALS. THE DEPARTMENT 28 MAY 29 APPROVE ALL OR PART OF A SAFETY TECHNOLOGY, SAFETY TRAINING 0R 30 INFRASTRUCTURE IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM PROPOSAL.

31 F. H. The department of education, subject to the review and 32 approval of the state board of education, shall distribute monies to the 33 school districts and charter schools that are in compliance with program 34 requirements and whose program proposals have been approved by the state 35 board of education.

36 G. I. The department of education shall review program proposals 37 submitted by school districts and charter schools for participation in the 38 school safety program and shall select school sites that are eligible to 39 receive funding based on school safety needs pursuant to this 40 section. The department of education may prioritize program proposals for 41 school resource officer, and juvenile probation officer AND SCHOOL SAFETY 42 OFFICER grants to school districts and charter schools that have 43 agreements to share the cost of the school resource officer, or juvenile probation officer OR SCHOOL SAFETY OFFICER with a law enforcement agency 44 45 or the courts.

1 H. J. The department of education shall evaluate the effectiveness 2 of all the approved program proposals submitted pursuant to subsections B, 3 and C AND D of this section within the school safety program and report on 4 the activities of the program and the participants in the school safety 5 program to the president of the senate, the speaker of the house of 6 representatives and the governor on or before November 1 of each year and 7 shall provide a copy of this report to the secretary of state. The 8 evaluation and report shall include survey results from participating 9 schools and data from participating schools on the impact of participating in the school safety program. The department shall establish data 10 11 guidelines for school safety program participants to follow in reporting 12 pursuant to this subsection.

13 T. K. The school safety program established by this section shall 14 include a school safety program guidance manual adopted by the department of education that requires a dispute resolution process to be included in 15 16 the service agreement between a school district or charter school that 17 submitted a program proposal and received a school resource officer grant 18 OR SCHOOL SAFETY OFFICER GRANT from the school safety program and the law 19 enforcement agency that provides services to the school district or 20 charter school. THE SCHOOL SAFETY PROGRAM ESTABLISHED BY THIS SECTION 21 SHALL INCLUDE A SCHOOL MENTAL HEALTH PROFESSIONALS GUIDANCE MANUAL ADOPTED 22 BY THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION THAT INCORPORATES A MULTIDISCIPLINARY 23 SAFETY APPROACH AND IS CONSISTENT WITH SECTION 1-602.

24 **J.** L. Any appropriations that are made to the department of 25 education for the approved program proposals within the school safety 26 program are exempt from the provisions of section 35-190 relating to 27 lapsing of appropriations. All monies that are not used for an approved 28 program proposal within the school safety program during the fiscal year 29 for which the monies were appropriated revert to the department of 30 education for distribution to the program in the following fiscal year.

31 K. M. Monies received by a school district or charter school under 32 the SCHOOL SAFETY program shall be spent to implement the approved program 33 proposals.

N. The auditor general shall include the school safety program
as part of its ongoing sunset review of agencies and programs.

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M. O. For the purposes of this section:

37 1. "Law-related education" means interactive education to equip
38 children and youth with knowledge and skills pertaining to the law, school
39 safety and effective citizenship.

40 2. "Law-related education program" means a program designed to 41 provide children and youth with knowledge, skills and activities pertaining to the law and legal process and to promote law-abiding 42 43 behavior with the purpose of preventing children and youth from engaging 44 in delinquency or violence and enabling them to become productive 45 citizens.

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1 3. "School counselor" means a professional educator who holds a 2 valid school counselor certificate issued by the department of education. 3 4. "School guidance and counseling program" means a counseling 4 program that supports, promotes and enhances the academic, personal, 5 social, emotional and career development of all students. A SCHOOL-BASED MENTAL HEALTH 6 5. "SCHOOL PSYCHOLOGIST" MEANS 7 PROVIDER WHO HOLDS A VALID SCHOOL PSYCHOLOGIST CERTIFICATE ISSUED BY THE 8 DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION. 9 5. 6. "School resource officer" means ANY OF THE FOLLOWING: 10 (a) A peace officer. or 11 (b) A full-authority reserve peace officer who is certified by the Arizona peace officer standards and training board. 12 13 (c) AN INDIVIDUAL WHO WAS PREVIOUSLY EMPLOYED AS A PEACE OFFICER IN 14 STATE, WHO RETIRED IN GOOD STANDING AND WHO IS ASSIGNED TO THIS PARTICIPATE IN THE SCHOOL SAFETY PROGRAM BY A LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCY 15 16 PURSUANT TO SECTION 15-155. 17 7. "SCHOOL SAFETY OFFICER" MEANS A SCHOOL RESOURCE OFFICER WHO IS 18 WORKING IN AN OFF-DUTY CAPACITY. 19 6. 8. "School social worker" means a professional educator who 20 holds a valid school social worker certificate issued by the department of 21 education. 22 Sec. 2. Section 15-155, Arizona Revised Statutes, is amended to 23 read: 24 15-155. <u>School safety program; funding</u> A. The department of education shall cooperate with the county 25 26 school superintendent, the county sheriff and the local chief of police to allow a law enforcement agency, with the consent of the school, to assign 27 28 a peace officer, or a full authority Arizona peace officer standards and 29 training board certified reserve peace officer OR AN INDIVIDUAL WHO WAS PREVIOUSLY EMPLOYED AS A PEACE OFFICER IN THIS STATE AND WHO RETIRED IN 30 31 GOOD STANDING to participate in the school safety program in each school in the county. The cost of the peace officer is a state charge that is 32 funded by the department of education, except for agreements to share the 33 34 cost of the school resource officer pursuant to section 15-154, subsection 35 € I. 36 B. In cooperation with the department of education and the county 37 school superintendent and with the consent of the school, the presiding 38 judge of the juvenile court may assign juvenile probation officers to 39 participate in the school safety program in each school in the county. 40 The cost of juvenile probation officers is a state charge that is funded

by the department of education, except for agreements to share the cost of

the juvenile probation officer pursuant to section 15-154, subsection
