AMENDING TITLE 1, CHAPTER 3, ARTICLE 1, ARIZONA REVISED STATUTES, BY ADDING SECTION 1-323; AMENDING SECTION 15-203, ARIZONA REVISED STATUTES; AMENDING TITLE 15, CHAPTER 7, ARTICLE 1, ARIZONA REVISED STATUTES, BY ADDING SECTION 15-710.03; RELATING TO SCHOOL INSTRUCTION.

1 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Arizona: 2 Section 1. Title 1, chapter 3, article 1, Arizona Revised Statutes, 3 is amended by adding section 1-323, to read: 4 1-323. <u>Victims of communism day; observation</u> 5 A. NOVEMBER 7, IN EACH YEAR, SHALL BE OBSERVED AS VICTIMS OF 6 COMMUNISM DAY. 7 B. VICTIMS OF COMMUNISM DAY IS NOT A LEGAL HOLIDAY. 8 IF VICTIMS OF COMMUNISM DAY FALLS ON A SATURDAY, SUNDAY OR OTHER С. 9 DAY WHEN A PUBLIC SCHOOL IS NOT IN SESSION, THE PRECEDING OR FOLLOWING SCHOOL DAY SHALL BE OBSERVED IN THE PUBLIC SCHOOL AS THE HOLIDAY. 10 11 Sec. 2. Section 15-203, Arizona Revised Statutes, is amended to 12 read: 13 15-203. Powers and duties; definition A. The state board of education shall: 14 1. Exercise general supervision over and regulate the conduct of 15 16 the public school system and adopt any rules and policies it deems 17 necessary to accomplish this purpose. 18 2. Keep a record of its proceedings. 19 3. Make rules for its own government. 20 4. Determine the policy and work undertaken by it. 21 5. Subject to title 41, chapter 4, article 4, employ staff. 22 6. Prescribe and supervise the duties of its employees pursuant to 23 title 41, chapter 4, article 4, if not otherwise prescribed by statute. 24 Delegate to the superintendent of public instruction the 7. execution of board policies and rules. 25 26 8. Recommend to the legislature changes or additions to the 27 statutes pertaining to schools. 28 9. Prepare, publish and distribute reports the concerning 29 educational welfare of this state. 30 proper 10. Prepare a budget for expenditures necessary for 31 maintenance of the board and accomplishment of its purposes and present 32 the budget to the legislature. 11. Aid in the enforcement of laws relating to schools. 33 Prescribe a minimum course of study in the common schools, 34 12. minimum competency requirements for the promotion of pupils from the third 35 36 grade and minimum course of study and competency requirements for the promotion of pupils from the eighth grade. The state board of education 37 38 shall prepare a fiscal impact statement of any proposed changes to the 39 minimum course of study or competency requirements and, on completion, 40 shall send a copy to the director of the joint legislative budget committee and the director of the school facilities division within the 41 department of administration. The state board of education shall not 42 43 adopt any changes in the minimum course of study or competency requirements in effect on July 1, 1998 that will have a fiscal impact on 44 45 school capital costs.

1 13. Prescribe minimum course of study and competency requirements 2 for the graduation of pupils from high school. The state board of 3 education shall prepare a fiscal impact statement of any proposed changes 4 to the minimum course of study or competency requirements and, on 5 completion, shall send a copy to the director of the joint legislative 6 budget committee and the director of the school facilities division within 7 the department of administration. The state board of education shall not 8 any changes in the minimum course of study or competency adopt 9 requirements in effect on July 1, 1998 that will have a fiscal impact on 10 school capital costs.

14. Pursuant to section 15-501.01, supervise and control the 12 certification of persons engaged in instructional work directly as any 13 classroom, laboratory or other teacher or indirectly as a supervisory 14 teacher, speech therapist, principal or superintendent in a school 15 district, including school district preschool programs, or any other 16 educational institution below the community college, college or university 17 level, and prescribe rules for certification.

18 15. Adopt a list of approved tests for determining special 19 education assistance to gifted pupils as defined in and as provided in 20 chapter 7, article 4.1 of this title. The adopted tests shall provide 21 separate scores for quantitative reasoning, verbal reasoning and nonverbal 22 reasoning and shall be capable of providing reliable and valid scores at 23 the highest ranges of the score distribution.

24 16. Adopt rules governing the methods for the administration of all 25 proficiency examinations.

26 17. Adopt proficiency examinations for its use and determine the 27 passing score for the proficiency examinations.

18. Include within its budget the cost of contracting for the purchase, distribution and scoring of the examinations as provided in paragraphs 16 and 17 of this subsection.

31 19. Supervise and control the qualifications of professional 32 nonteaching school personnel and prescribe standards relating to 33 qualifications. The standards shall not require the business manager of a 34 school district to obtain certification from the state board of education.

20. Impose such disciplinary action, including disciplinary action pursuant to section 15-505 or the issuance of a letter of censure, suspension, suspension with conditions or revocation of a certificate, on a finding of immoral or unprofessional conduct.

21. Establish an assessment, data gathering and reporting system for pupil performance as prescribed in chapter 7, article 3 of this title, including qualifying examinations for the college credit by examination incentive program pursuant to section 15-249.06.

43 22. Adopt a rule to promote braille literacy pursuant to section 44 15-214. 1 23. Adopt rules prescribing procedures for the state board of 2 education to investigate every written complaint alleging that a 3 certificated person, a person seeking certification or a noncertificated 4 person has engaged in immoral or unprofessional conduct.

5 24. For purposes of federal law, serve as the state board for 6 vocational and technological education and meet at least four times each 7 year solely to execute the powers and duties of the state board for 8 vocational and technological education.

9 Develop and maintain a handbook for use in the schools of this 25. state that provides guidance for the teaching of moral, civic and ethical 10 11 education. The handbook shall promote existing curriculum frameworks and 12 shall encourage school districts to recognize moral, civic and ethical 13 values within instructional and programmatic educational development programs for the general purpose of instilling character and ethical 14 principles in pupils in kindergarten programs and grades one through 15 16 twelve.

17 26. Require pupils to recite the following passage from the 18 declaration of independence for pupils in grades four through six at the 19 commencement of the first class of the day in the schools, except that a 20 pupil shall not be required to participate if the pupil or the pupil's 21 parent or guardian objects:

We hold these truths to be self-evident, that all men are created equal, that they are endowed by their creator with certain unalienable rights, that among these are life, liberty and the pursuit of happiness. That to secure these rights, governments are instituted among men, deriving their just powers from the consent of the governed. . . .

28 27. Adopt rules that provide for certification reciprocity pursuant29 to section 15-501.01.

30 28. Adopt rules that provide for the presentation of an honorary 31 high school diploma to a person who has never obtained a high school 32 diploma and who meets both of the following requirements:

33

(a) Currently resides in this state.

(b) Provides documented evidence from the department of veterans'
services that the person enlisted in the armed forces of the United States
and served in World War I, World War II, the Korean conflict or the
Vietnam conflict.

29. Cooperate with the Arizona-Mexico commission in the governor's 38 office and with researchers at universities in this state to collect data 39 and conduct projects in the United States and Mexico on issues that are 40 41 within the scope of the duties of the department of education and that 42 relate to quality of life, trade and economic development in this state in 43 a manner that will help the Arizona-Mexico commission to assess and 44 enhance the economic competitiveness of this state and of the 45 Arizona-Mexico region.

1 30. Adopt rules to define and provide guidance to schools as to the 2 activities that would constitute immoral or unprofessional conduct of 3 certificated and noncertificated persons.

4 31. Adopt guidelines to encourage pupils in grades nine, ten, 5 eleven and twelve to volunteer for twenty hours of community service 6 before graduation from high school. A school district that complies with 7 the guidelines adopted pursuant to this paragraph is not liable for 8 damages resulting from a pupil's participation in community service unless 9 the school district is found to have demonstrated wanton or reckless disregard for the safety of the pupil and other participants in community 10 11 service. For the purposes of this paragraph, "community service" may 12 include service learning. The guidelines shall include the following:

13 (a) A list of the general categories in which community service may14 be performed.

15 (b) A description of the methods by which community service will be 16 monitored.

17 (c) A consideration of risk assessment for community service 18 projects.

(d) Orientation and notification procedures of community service opportunities for pupils entering grade nine, including the development of a notification form. The notification form shall be signed by the pupil and the pupil's parent or guardian, except that a pupil shall not be required to participate in community service if the parent or guardian notifies the principal of the pupil's school in writing that the parent or guardian does not wish the pupil to participate in community service.

26 (e) Procedures for a pupil in grade nine to prepare a written 27 proposal that outlines the type of community service that the pupil would like to perform and the goals that the pupil hopes to achieve as a result 28 29 of community service. The pupil's written proposal shall be reviewed by a 30 faculty advisor, a guidance counselor or any other school employee who is 31 designated as the community service program coordinator for that school. 32 The pupil may alter the written proposal at any time before performing 33 community service.

(f) Procedures for a faculty advisor, a guidance counselor or any other school employee who is designated as the community service program coordinator to evaluate and certify the completion of community service performed by pupils.

38 32. To facilitate the transfer of military personnel and their 39 dependents to and from the public schools of this state, pursue, in 40 cooperation with the Arizona board of regents, reciprocity agreements with 41 other states concerning the transfer credits for military personnel and 42 their dependents. A reciprocity agreement entered into pursuant to this 43 paragraph shall:

44 45 (a) Address procedures for each of the following:

(i) Transferring student records.

1

(ii) Awarding credit for completed coursework.

2 (iii) Allowing a student to satisfy the graduation requirements 3 prescribed in section 15-701.01 through the successful performance on 4 comparable exit-level assessment instruments administered in another 5 state.

6

(b) Include appropriate criteria developed by the state board of 7 education and the Arizona board of regents.

8 33. Adopt guidelines that school district governing boards shall 9 use in identifying pupils who are eligible for gifted programs and in providing gifted education programs and services. The state board of 10 education shall adopt any other guidelines and rules that it deems 11 12 necessary in order to carry out the purposes of chapter 7, article 4.1 of 13 this title.

34. For each of the alternative textbook formats of human-voiced 14 audio, large-print and braille, designate alternative media producers to 15 16 adapt existing standard print textbooks or to provide specialized 17 textbooks, or both, for pupils with disabilities in this state. Each 18 alternative media producer shall be capable of producing alternative 19 textbooks in all relevant subjects in at least one of the alternative 20 textbook formats. The board shall post the designated list of alternative 21 media producers on its website.

22 35. Adopt a list of approved professional development training providers for use by school districts as provided in section 15-107, 23 24 subsection J. The professional development training providers shall meet 25 the training curriculum requirements determined by the state board of 26 education in at least the areas of school finance, governance, employment, 27 staffing. inventory and human resources. internal controls and 28 procurement.

29 36. Adopt rules to prohibit a person who violates the notification requirements prescribed in section 15-183, subsection C, paragraph 8 or 30 31 section 15-550, subsection D from certification pursuant to this title 32 until the person is no longer charged or is acquitted of any offenses listed in section 41-1758.03, subsection B. The state board shall also 33 34 adopt rules to prohibit a person who violates the notification requirements, 35 certification surrender requirements or fingerprint 36 clearance card surrender requirements prescribed in section 15-183, 37 subsection C, paragraph 9 or section 15-550, subsection E from certification pursuant to this title for at least ten years after the date 38 39 of the violation.

37. Adopt rules for the alternative certification of teachers of 40 41 nontraditional foreign languages that allow for the passing of a nationally accredited test to substitute for the education coursework 42 43 required for certification.

1 38. Adopt rules to define competency-based educational pathways for 2 college and career readiness that may be used by schools. The rules shall 3 include the following components:

4

(a) The establishment of learning outcomes that will be expected for students in a particular subject, beginning with math.

5 6

6 (b) On or before December 31, 2022, A mechanism to allow pupils in 7 grades seven through twelve who have demonstrated competency in a subject 8 to immediately obtain credit for the mastery of that subject. The rules 9 shall include a list of applicable subjects.

In consultation with the department of health services, the 10 39. 11 department of education, medical professionals, school health professionals, school administrators and an organization that represents 12 13 school nurses in this state, adopt rules that prescribe the following for school districts and charter schools: 14

(a) Annual training in the administration of auto-injectable epinephrine for designated medical and nonmedical school personnel. The annual training prescribed in this subdivision is optional during any fiscal year in which a school does not stock epinephrine auto-injectors at the school during that fiscal year.

20 (b) Annual training for all school site personnel the on 21 recognition of anaphylactic shock symptoms and the procedures to follow 22 when anaphylactic shock occurs, following the national guidelines of the American academy of pediatrics. The annual training prescribed in this 23 24 subdivision is optional during any fiscal year in which a school does not 25 stock epinephrine auto-injectors at the school during that fiscal year.

26 (c) Procedures for the administration of epinephrine auto-injectors 27 in emergency situations.

(d) Procedures for annually requesting a standing order for epinephrine auto-injectors pursuant to section 15-157 from the chief medical officer of the department of health services, the chief medical officer of a county health department, a doctor of medicine licensed pursuant to title 32, chapter 13, a doctor of naturopathic medicine licensed pursuant to title 32, chapter 14 or a doctor of osteopathic medicine licensed pursuant to title 32, chapter 17.

35 (e) Procedures for reporting the use of epinephrine auto-injectors36 to the department of health services.

40. In consultation with the department of education, medical professionals, school health professionals, school administrators and an organization that represents school nurses in this state, adopt rules that prescribe the following for school districts and charter schools that elect to administer inhalers:

42 (a) Annual training in the recognition of respiratory distress 43 symptoms and the procedures to follow when respiratory distress occurs, in 44 accordance with good clinical practice, and the administration of 1 inhalers, as directed on the prescription protocol, by designated medical 2 and nonmedical school personnel.

3 (b) Requirements for school districts and charter schools that 4 elect to administer inhalers to designate at least two employees at each 5 school to be trained in the recognition of respiratory distress symptoms 6 and the procedures to follow when respiratory distress occurs, in 7 accordance with good clinical practice, and at least two employees at each 8 school to be trained in the administration of inhalers, as directed on the 9 prescription protocol.

10 (c) Procedures for the administration of inhalers in emergency 11 situations, as directed on the prescription protocol.

12 (d) Procedures for annually requesting a standing order for 13 inhalers and spacers or holding chambers pursuant to section 15-158 from 14 the chief medical officer of a county health department, a physician 15 licensed pursuant to title 32, chapter 13, 14 or 17 or a nurse 16 practitioner licensed pursuant to title 32, chapter 15.

17 (e) Procedures for notifying a parent once an inhaler has been 18 administered.

19 41. Adopt rules for certification that allow substitute teachers 20 who can demonstrate primary teaching responsibility in a classroom as 21 defined by the state board of education to use the time spent in that 22 classroom toward the required capstone experience for standard teaching 23 certification.

42. For the purposes of Sandra Day O'Connor civics celebration day instruction under section 15-710.01, develop a list of recommended resources relating to civics education that align with the academic standards prescribed by the state board of education in social studies pursuant to sections 15-701 and 15-701.01. The state board shall establish a process that allows public schools to recommend resources for addition to the list.

43. Direct and oversee the work of all investigators related to investigating certificated persons, persons seeking certification and noncertificated persons for immoral or unprofessional conduct under this title and rules adopted pursuant to this title. The investigators shall be housed within and are employees of the state board of education.

36 44. Establish best practices for social media and cellular 37 telephone use between students and school personnel, including teachers, 38 coaches and counselors, and encourage school district governing boards and 39 charter school governing bodies to adopt policies that implement these 40 best practices. The state board of education shall make these best 41 practices available to both public and private schools.

42 45. For the purposes of 9/11 education day instruction under 43 section 15-710.02, develop a list of recommended resources relating to 44 age-appropriate education on the terrorist attacks of September 11, 2001 45 that align with the academic standards prescribed by the state board 1 pursuant to sections 15-701 and 15-701.01. The state board shall 2 establish a process that allows public schools to recommend resources for 3 addition to the list.

4 46. FOR THE PURPOSES OF VICTIMS OF COMMUNISM DAY INSTRUCTION UNDER 5 SECTION 15-710.03, DEVELOP A LIST OF RECOMMENDED RESOURCES RELATING TO 6 EDUCATION ON THE HISTORY OF COMMUNIST REGIMES AROUND THE WORLD THAT ALIGN 7 WITH THE ACADEMIC STANDARDS PRESCRIBED BY THE STATE BOARD OF EDUCATION IN 8 SOCIAL STUDIES PURSUANT TO SECTION 15-701.01. THE STATE BOARD SHALL 9 ESTABLISH A PROCESS THAT ALLOWS PUBLIC SCHOOLS TO RECOMMEND RESOURCES FOR 10 ADDITION TO THE LIST.

11 12 B. The state board of education may:

- 1. Contract.
- 13

2. Sue and be sued.

14 3. Distribute and score the tests prescribed in chapter 7, article 15 3 of this title.

16 4. Provide for an advisory committee or hearing officers to conduct 17 hearings and screenings to determine whether grounds exist to impose 18 disciplinary action against a certificated person, whether grounds exist 19 to reinstate a revoked or surrendered certificate, whether grounds exist 20 to approve or deny an initial application for certification or a request 21 for renewal of a certificate and whether grounds exist to impose or lift 22 disciplinary action against a noncertificated person. The board may 23 delegate its responsibility to conduct hearings and screenings to its 24 advisory committee or hearing officers. Hearings shall be conducted 25 pursuant to title 41, chapter 6, article 6.

26 5. Proceed with the disposal of any complaint requesting 27 disciplinary action against a noncertificated person after the board has 28 imposed disciplinary action pursuant to section 15-505 or against a person 29 holding a certificate as prescribed in subsection A, paragraph 14 of this 30 section after the suspension or expiration of the certificate or surrender 31 of the certificate by the holder.

6. Assess costs and reasonable attorney fees against a person who files a frivolous complaint or who files a complaint in bad faith. Costs assessed pursuant to this paragraph shall not exceed the expenses incurred by the state board of education in the investigation of the complaint.

36 7. Issue subpoenas to compel the attendance and testimony of 37 witnesses and production of documents or any physical evidence in 38 connection with an investigation or hearing of an allegation that a 39 certificated person, a person seeking certification or a noncertificated 40 person has engaged in immoral or unprofessional conduct. If a subpoena 41 issued by the board is disobeyed, the board may petition the superior court to enforce the subpoena. Any failure to obey an order of the court 42 43 pursuant to this paragraph may be punished by the court as contempt.

44 C. For the purposes of this section, "noncertificated person" has 45 the same meaning prescribed in section 15-505.
