## **HOUSE BILL 2735**

## AN ACT

AMENDING SECTIONS 15-1601 AND 15-1626, ARIZONA REVISED STATUTES; RELATING TO THE ARIZONA BOARD OF REGENTS.

1 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Arizona: 2 Section 1. Section 15-1601, Arizona Revised Statutes, is amended to 3 read: 4 15-1601. State universities; location; faculty powers; 5 report; definition 6 A. The Arizona board of regents shall maintain state universities 7 at Flagstaff in Coconino county, at Tempe in Maricopa county and at Tucson 8 in Pima county, and the universities are respectively designated northern 9 Arizona university, Arizona state university and the university of Arizona. The board shall maintain an Arizona state university campus in 10 11 western Maricopa county designated as Arizona state university west campus 12 and an Arizona state university campus in eastern Maricopa county 13 designated as Arizona state university east campus. The board may 14 establish and maintain other colleges and universities subject to 15 legislative authority. Subject to review by the joint committee on 16 capital review, the board may establish new campuses that are separate 17 from any location in existence on July 1, 2007. The Arizona state 18 university campus at Tempe shall provide administrative support for the 19 Arizona state university campuses in western Maricopa county and in 20 eastern Maricopa county. 21 B. The universities shall have colleges, schools and departments 22 and give courses of study and academic degrees as the board approves. NOTWITHSTANDING SECTION 15-1626, SUBSECTION A, THE BOARD MAY DELEGATE THE 23 24 BOARD'S AUTHORITY TO APPROVE ACADEMIC DEGREES OR ORGANIZATIONAL UNITS ONLY TO A UNIVERSITY PRESIDENT, AND A UNIVERSITY PRESIDENT MAY NOT DELEGATE THE 25 26 PRESIDENT'S AUTHORITY TO APPROVE ACADEMIC DEGREES OR ORGANIZATIONAL 27 UNITS. Subject to the responsibilities and powers of The ARIZONA board OF REGENTS and the university presidents, SHALL CONSULT WITH the faculty 28 29 universities, through their elected members of the faculty 30 representatives, shall share responsibility for REGARDING academic and 31 educational activities and matters related to faculty personnel. The 32 faculty members of each university, through their elected faculty 33 representatives, shall participate in CONSULT WITH THE ARIZONA BOARD OF 34 REGENTS AND THEIR RESPECTIVE UNIVERSITY PRESIDENT REGARDING the governance 35 of their respective universities and shall actively participate in the 36 development of university policy. 37 C. On or before November 15 of each year, Arizona state university

shall report to the joint legislative budget committee, the governor's office of strategic planning and budgeting, the speaker of the house of representatives and the president of the senate for each of its separate campuses all of the following:

42 1. The capital expenditure history made to each campus for each of43 the two previous fiscal years.

44 2. The actual number of full-time equivalent students at each 45 campus of Arizona state university as of the twenty-first day after

1 classes begin for the fall semester and the total headcount enrollment at 2 each campus. 3 3. Any revenues or allocations made to each campus of Arizona state 4 university that are available to report. 5 4. Any long-term capital or expansion plans for each campus. 6 D. FOR THE PURPOSES OF THIS SECTION, "ORGANIZATIONAL UNIT" MEANS A 7 DEPARTMENT, CENTER, INSTITUTE, COLLEGE OR OTHER ACADEMIC UNIT OF A 8 UNIVERSITY. 9 Sec. 2. Section 15-1626, Arizona Revised Statutes, is amended to 10 read: 11 15-1626. <u>General administrative powers and duties of board;</u> 12 definition 13 The ARIZONA board OF REGENTS shall: Α. Have and exercise the powers necessary for the effective 14 1. governance and administration of the institutions under its control. 15 То 16 that end, the board may adopt, and authorize each university to adopt, 17 such regulations, policies, rules or measures as are deemed necessary and 18 may delegate in writing to its committees, to its university presidents, or their designees, or to other entities under its control any part of its 19 20 authority for the administration TO ADMINISTER and governance of GOVERN 21 such institutions, including those powers enumerated in section 15-1625, 22 subsection B, paragraphs 2 and 4, paragraphs 3, 4, 8, 9, 11 and 12 of this subsection and subsection B of this section. THE BOARD MAY RESCIND any 23 24 delegation of authority may be rescinded by the board at any time in whole 25 or in part. 26 2. Appoint and employ and determine the compensation of presidents 27 with such power and authority and for such purposes in connection with the operation of the institutions as the board deems necessary. 28 29 3. Appoint and employ and determine the compensation of VICE PRESIDENTS, 30 vice-presidents deans. professors, instructors. 31 lecturers, fellows and such other officers and employees with such power and authority and for such purposes in connection with the operation of 32 33 the institutions as the board deems necessary, or delegate its authority pursuant to paragraph 1 of this subsection. 34 35 4. Remove any officer or employee when the interests of education

35 4. Remove any officer or employee when the interests of education 36 in this state so require in accordance with its personnel rules and 37 policies.

5. Fix tuitions and fees to be charged and differentiate the 38 institutions 39 tuitions and fees between and between residents, nonresidents, undergraduate students, graduate students, students from 40 41 foreign countries and students who have earned credit hours in excess of the credit hour threshold. For the purposes of this paragraph, the 42 43 undergraduate credit hour threshold is one hundred forty-five hours for students who attend a university under the jurisdiction of the board. The 44 45 undergraduate credit hour threshold shall be based on the actual full-time

1 equivalent student enrollment counted on the forty-fifth day of every fall 2 and spring semester, divided by two, and any budget adjustment based on 3 student enrollment shall occur in the fiscal year following the actual 4 full-time equivalent student enrollment count. The undergraduate credit 5 hour threshold shall not apply to degree programs that require credit 6 hours above the credit hour threshold, credits earned in the pursuit of up 7 to two baccalaureate degrees, credits earned in the pursuit of up to two 8 state regulated licensures or certificates, credits earned in the pursuit 9 of teaching certification, credits transferred from a private institution of higher education, credits transferred from an institution of higher 10 11 education in another state, credits earned at another institution of 12 higher education but that are not accepted as transfer credits at the 13 university where the student is currently enrolled and credits earned by students who enroll at a university under the jurisdiction of the board 14 more than twenty-four months after the end of that student's previous 15 16 enrollment at a public institution of higher education in this state. 0n 17 or before October 15 of each year, the board shall report to the joint 18 legislative budget committee the number of in-state students and 19 out-of-state students who were enrolled at universities under the 20 jurisdiction of the board during the previous fiscal year and who met or 21 exceeded the undergraduate credit hour threshold prescribed in this 22 paragraph. The amount of tuition and fees included in the operating budget for the university adopted by the board as prescribed in paragraph 23 24 13 of this subsection shall be subject to legislative appropriation and 25 deposited in a separate tuition and fees subaccount for each university. 26 All other tuition and fee revenue shall be retained by each university for 27 expenditure as approved by the board in a separate local tuition and fees 28 subaccount for each university. This subaccount shall consist of only 29 The universities shall not use any tuition or fee tuition and fees. 30 revenue to fund or support an alumni association.

31 6. Adopt rules to govern <del>its</del> THE BOARD'S tuition and academic fee 32 setting process that provide for the following:

(a) At least one public hearing at each university as an
 opportunity for students and members of the public to comment on any
 proposed increase in tuition or fees.

36 (b) Publication of the notice of public hearing at least ten days 37 before the hearing in a newspaper of general circulation in Maricopa 38 county, Coconino county and Pima county. The notice shall include the 39 date, time and location of the public hearing.

40 (c) Public disclosure by each university of any proposed increases 41 in tuition or fees at least ten days before the public hearing.

42 (d) A roll call vote of any final board action on changes in
43 tuition, including tuition rate changes for online programs, or academic
44 fees.

1 (e) Public disclosure by the board and each university of any final 2 board action on changes in tuition or academic fees.

7. Pursuant to section 35-115, submit a budget request for each institution under its THE BOARD'S jurisdiction that includes the estimated tuition and fee revenue available to support the programs of the institution as described in the budget request. The estimated available tuition and fee revenue shall be based on the tuition and registration fee rates in effect at the time the budget request is submitted with adjustments for projected changes in enrollment as provided by the board.

10 8. Establish curricula and designate courses at the several 11 institutions that in <del>its</del> THE BOARD'S judgment will best serve the 12 interests of this state.

9. Award such degrees and diplomas on the completion of such
 courses and curriculum requirements as *it* THE BOARD deems appropriate.

10. Prescribe qualifications for admission of all students to the 15 16 universities. The board shall establish policies for guaranteed admission 17 that ensure fair and equitable access to students in this state from 18 public, private and charter schools and homeschools. For the purpose of 19 determining the qualifications of honorably discharged veterans, veterans 20 are those persons who served in the armed forces for a minimum of two 21 years and who were previously enrolled at a university or community 22 college in this state. No Prior failing grades received by the veteran at 23 the university or community college in this state may NOT be considered.

24 11. Adopt any energy conservation standards adopted by the 25 department of administration for the construction of new buildings.

12. Employ for such time and purposes as the board requires attorneys whose compensation shall be fixed and paid by the board. Litigation to which the board is a party and for which self-insurance is not provided may be compromised or settled at the direction of the board.

30 13. Adopt annually an operating budget for each university equal to 31 the sum of appropriated STATE general fund monies and the amount of 32 tuition and fees approved by the board and allocated to each university 33 operating budget.

34 14. In consultation with the state board of education and other 35 education groups, develop and implement a program to award honors 36 endorsements to be affixed to the high school diplomas of qualifying high school pupils and to be included in the transcripts of pupils who are 37 38 awarded endorsements. The board shall develop application procedures and 39 testing criteria and adopt testing instruments and procedures to 40 administer the program. In order to receive an honors endorsement, a 41 pupil must demonstrate an extraordinary level of knowledge, skill and competency as measured by the testing instruments adopted by the board in 42 43 mathematics, English, science and social studies. Additional subjects may 44 be added at the determination of the board. The program is voluntary for 45 pupils.

1 15. Require the publisher of each literary and nonliterary textbook 2 used in the universities of this state to furnish to the Arizona board of 3 regents computer software in a standardized format when software becomes 4 available for nonliterary textbooks from which braille versions of the 5 textbooks may be produced.

6 16. Require universities that provide a degree in education to 7 require courses that are necessary to obtain a provisional structured 8 English immersion endorsement as prescribed by the state board of 9 education.

10 17. Acquire United States flags for each classroom that are 11 manufactured in the United States and that are at least two feet by three 12 feet and hardware to appropriately display the United States flags, 13 acquire a legible copy of the Constitution of the United States and the Bill of Rights, display the flags in each classroom in accordance with 14 title 4 of the United States Code and display a legible copy of the 15 16 Constitution of the United States and the Bill of Rights adjacent to the 17 flag.

18 18. To facilitate the transfer of military personnel and their 19 dependents to and from the public schools of this state, pursue, in 20 cooperation with the state board of education, reciprocity agreements with 21 other states concerning the transfer credits for military personnel and 22 their dependents. A reciprocity agreement entered into pursuant to this 23 paragraph shall:

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(a) Address procedures for each of the following:

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(i) The transfer of student records.

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(ii) Awarding credit for completed coursework.

(iii) Permitting a student to satisfy the graduation requirements prescribed in section 15-701.01 through the successful performance on comparable exit-level assessment instruments administered in another state.

31 (b) Include appropriate criteria developed by the state board of 32 education and the Arizona board of regents.

19. Require a university to publicly post notices of all of its THE
 UNIVERSITY'S employment openings, including the title and description,
 instructions for applying and relevant contact information.

36 20. In consultation with the community college districts in this 37 state, develop and implement common equivalencies for specific levels of 38 achievement on advanced placement examinations and international baccalaureate examinations in order to award commensurate postsecondary 39 40 academic credits at community colleges and public universities in this 41 state.

42 21. On or before August 1 of each year, report to the joint
43 legislative budget committee the graduation rate by university campus
44 during the previous fiscal year. The board shall also report the

1 retention rate by university campus and by class, as determined by date of 2 entry during the previous fiscal year.

B. The board shall adopt personnel policies for all employees of the board and the universities.

5 C. In conjunction with the auditor general, the board shall develop 6 a uniform accounting and reporting system, which shall be reviewed by the 7 joint legislative budget committee before final adoption by the board. 8 The board shall require each university to:

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1. Comply with the uniform accounting and reporting system.

10 2. PROVIDE THE BOARD WITH ACCESS TO THE UNIVERSITY'S ACCOUNTING AND 11 REPORTING SYSTEM FOR OVERSIGHT AND MONITORING PURPOSES.

D. The board may employ legal assistance in procuring loans for the institutions from the United States government. Fees or compensation paid for such legal assistance shall not be a claim on the STATE general fund of this state but shall be paid from funds of the institutions.

16 E. The board shall approve or disapprove any contract or agreement 17 entered into by the university of Arizona hospital with the Arizona 18 industrial development authority.

F. The board may adopt policies that authorize the institutions under its jurisdiction to enter into employment contracts with nontenured employees for periods of more than one year but not more than five years. The policies shall prescribe limitations LIMITS on the authority of the institutions to enter into employment contracts for periods of more than one year but not more than five years, including the requirement that the board approve the contracts.

G. The board may adopt a plan or plans for employee benefits that allow for participation in a cafeteria plan that meets the requirements of the United States internal revenue code of 1986.

29 H. The board may establish a program for the exchange of students between the universities under the jurisdiction of the board and colleges 30 31 and universities located in the state of Sonora, Mexico. Notwithstanding subsection A, paragraph 5 of this section, the program may provide for 32 33 in-state tuition at the universities under the jurisdiction of the board 34 for fifty Sonoran students in exchange for similar tuition provisions for 35 up to fifty Arizona students enrolled or seeking enrollment in Sonoran 36 colleges or universities. The board may direct the universities to work 37 in conjunction with the Arizona-Mexico commission to coordinate 38 recruitment and admissions activities.

I. The Arizona board of regents, in collaboration with the universities under its jurisdiction, shall adopt a performance funding model. The performance funding model shall use performance metrics that include the increase in degrees awarded, the increase in completed student credit hours and the increase in externally generated research and public service funding. The funding formula may give added weight to degrees related to science, technology, engineering and mathematics and other 1 high-value degrees that are in short supply or that are essential to this 2 state's long-term economic development strategy.

J. The Arizona board of regents shall use the performance funding model adopted pursuant to subsection I of this section in developing and submitting budget requests for the universities under its jurisdiction.

6 K. On or before November 1 of each year, the Arizona board of 7 regents shall submit to the joint legislative budget committee and the 8 governor's office of strategic planning and budgeting a report on 9 university debt and obligations, including:

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1. Long-term notes and obligations.

12 2. Certificates of participation and other obligations pursuant to 12 any lease-purchase agreements.

13 3. Revenue bonds.

4. Bonds issued pursuant to section 15-1682.03.

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5. Commercial paper issued pursuant to section 15-1696.

16 L. The report issued pursuant to subsection K of this section shall 17 contain, for the most recent fiscal year:

18 1. The aggregate level of outstanding principal and the principal 19 and interest payments, by type of debt or obligation.

20 2. An itemization, by campus and project, of the amount of yearly 21 principal and interest to be paid in the most recent and the next five 22 fiscal years.

23 M. The board may enter into an intergovernmental agreement pursuant 24 to section 15-1747 to manage universities under its jurisdiction subject 25 to the terms of the reciprocity agreement.

N. For the purposes of this section, "university debt and obligations" means debt and obligations, the principal and interest of which are paid in whole or in part with university monies.
