## AN ACT

AMENDING SECTION 41-563, ARIZONA REVISED STATUTES; RELATING TO EXPENDITURE LIMITATIONS.

(TEXT OF BILL BEGINS ON NEXT PAGE)

1 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Arizona: 2 Section 1. Section 41-563, Arizona Revised Statutes, is amended to 3 read: 41-563. Expenditure limitations; determination by the 4 5 commission; definitions 6 A. For political subdivisions, the commission shall: 7 Determine the base limit level of political subdivisions for 1. 8 each political subdivision subject to an expenditure limitation pursuant 9 to article IX, section 20, Constitution of Arizona. For the purposes of this subsection and subsection D of this section, the "base limit" of each 10 11 political subdivision means the amount of actual payments of local 12 revenues by such political subdivision in fiscal year 1979-1980 as used to 13 determine the expenditure limitation pursuant to paragraph 4 of this 14 subsection. 15 2. Determine and report to the governing board of each political 16 subdivision subject to an expenditure limitation pursuant to article IX, 17 section 20, Constitution of Arizona, prior to BEFORE February 1 of each 18 year, the following: 19 (a) The total of the estimated population of each such political 20 subdivision as of July 1 of the prior year and the estimated population of 21 any areas annexed by such political subdivisions thereafter, based on the 22 population estimates developed by the department of economic security OFFICE OF ECONOMIC OPPORTUNITY. The population of any areas annexed 23 24 thereafter must be estimated as of July 1 of the prior year. (b) The estimated change in the GDP price deflator used to 25 26 determine the expenditure limitation for the following fiscal year over the GDP price deflator used to determine the expenditure limitation for 27 28 the current fiscal year. 29 (c) The estimated expenditure limitation for each such political 30 subdivision for the following fiscal year. 31 3. Determine and report to the governing board of each political subdivision subject to an expenditure limitation pursuant to article IX, 32 33 section 20, Constitution of Arizona, prior to BEFORE April 1 of each year, 34 the following: (a) The total of the population of each such political subdivision 35 36 as of July 1 of the prior year and the population of any areas annexed by 37 such political subdivisions thereafter. The population of any areas annexed thereafter must be estimated as of July 1 of the prior year. 38 39 (b) The estimated change in the GDP price deflator used to 40 determine the expenditure limitation for the following fiscal year over 41 the GDP price deflator used to determine the expenditure limitation for 42 the current fiscal year. 43 (c) The expenditure limitation for each such political subdivision 44 for the following fiscal year.

4. Determine the expenditure limitation for each political
subdivision subject to an expenditure limitation pursuant to article IX,
section 20, Constitution of Arizona, as follows:

4 (a) Determine the population of the political subdivision as of 5 July 1, 1978.

6 7 (b) Determine the total population of the political subdivision as required by paragraph 3, subdivision (a) of this subsection.

8 (c) Divide the population determined in subdivision (b) of this 9 paragraph by the population determined in subdivision (a) of this 10 paragraph.

11 (d) Determine the estimated or actual GDP price deflator for the 12 1978 calendar year.

13 (e) Determine the estimated GDP price deflator for the calendar 14 year immediately preceding the fiscal year for which the expenditure 15 limitation is being determined.

16 (f) Divide the GDP price deflator determined in subdivision (e) of 17 this paragraph by the GDP price deflator determined in subdivision (d) of 18 this paragraph.

(g) Multiply the amount determined in paragraph 1 of this subsection for the political subdivision by the quotient determined in subdivision (c) of this paragraph and multiply the resulting product by the quotient determined in subdivision (f) of this paragraph.

5. If any annexation, consolidation or change in the boundaries of 23 24 a political subdivision occurs after the determination and report required by paragraph 3 of this subsection but before July 1 of the current year, 25 26 the commission, as promptly as feasible, shall redetermine the total population, calculated in paragraph 4, subdivision (b) of this subsection, 27 of the political subdivisions affected by the annexation, consolidation or 28 29 change in boundaries. The commission shall determine respective amended 30 expenditure limitations based on the amended population, which shall be 31 promptly reported to the governing board of each of the affected political 32 subdivisions. The political subdivisions affected shall use the revised 33 expenditure limitation if it is received before the annual financial 34 statement and estimate of expenses is prepared as required by section 35 42-17101.

6. In the event of the creation of a new city or town, the base imit of the new city or town shall be determined by multiplying the average amount of actual fiscal year 1979-1980 per capita payments of local revenues for all cities and towns within the county in which the new city or town is located by the population of the new city or town.

7. In the event of the division of a county into two or more new counties, determine the expenditure limitation for each of the new counties or the consolidation of counties, pursuant to article IX, section 20, Constitution of Arizona, using one of the following two methods. The board of supervisors of each new county upon ON the affirmative vote of

1 two-thirds of the members of the board of supervisors, on or before 2 February 1 following the county's establishment, shall adopt one of the 3 expenditure limitations determined:

4 (a) Method one:

5 (i) Determine the existing county which THAT has a population 6 closest to the population of the new county as of July 1 for the fiscal 7 year preceding the fiscal year for which the expenditure limit is being 8 determined.

9 (ii) Determine the per capita expenditure limit for the existing 10 county determined in item (i) of this subdivision based on the amount 11 determined in paragraph 3, subdivision (c) of this subsection for the 12 first full fiscal year following the establishment of the new county 13 government.

(iii) Multiply the per capita amount determined in item (ii) of this subdivision by the population of the new county as of July 1 in the fiscal year in which the new county government is established. The amount thus determined is the expenditure limit for the new county for the first full fiscal year following its establishment.

19 (iv) Determine a base limit for the new county which THAT will 20 yield the new expenditure limit determined in item (iii) of this 21 subdivision for the first full fiscal year following the establishment of 22 the new county government.

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## (b) Method two:

(i) Determine the per capita expenditure limit of the old county or
counties for the last full fiscal year prior to BEFORE the establishment
of the new county government based upon ON the amount determined in
paragraph 3, subdivision (c) of this subsection.

(ii) Multiply the per capita amount determined in item (i) of this subdivision by the population of the new county as of July 1 in the fiscal year in which the new county government is established. The amount thus determined is the expenditure limit for the new county for the first full fiscal year following its establishment.

33 (iii) Determine a base limit for the new county which THAT will 34 yield the new expenditure limit determined in item (ii) of this 35 subdivision for the first full fiscal year following the establishment of 36 the new county government.

37 8. If the governing board of a political subdivision authorizes expenditures in excess of the expenditure limitation determined pursuant 38 39 to paragraph 4 of this subsection as provided in article IX, section 20, 40 subsection (2), paragraph (b), subdivision (i), Constitution of Arizona, 41 the expenditure limitation for such political subdivision for the following fiscal year shall be reduced by the amount of expenditures in 42 43 excess of the limitation, unless the governing board has held an election as provided in article IX, section 20, subsection (2), paragraph (b), 44 45 subdivision (ii), Constitution of Arizona, and the excess expenditure has

1 been approved by a majority of the qualified electors voting in such 2 election.

9. If the citizens of a political subdivision approve an increase or decrease in the expenditure limitation as provided in article IX, section 20, subsection (6), Constitution of Arizona, the base limit of a political subdivision shall be adjusted by the commission such that the expenditure limitation of the political subdivision for the fiscal year following approval reflects the approved increase or decrease.

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B. For community college districts, the commission shall:

10 1. Determine the base limit of each community college district 11 subject to an expenditure limitation pursuant to article IX, section 21, 12 Constitution of Arizona. For the purposes of this subsection and 13 subsection D of this section, the "base limit" of each community college 14 district means the amount of expenditures of local revenues in fiscal year 15 1979-1980 as used to determine the expenditure limitation pursuant to 16 paragraph 4 of this subsection.

Determine and report to the governing board of each community
college district prior to BEFORE February 1 of each year the following:

19 (a) The estimated student population, utilizing USING the procedure 20 prescribed in section 15-1466.01, of each community college district for 21 the following fiscal year.

(b) The estimated change in the GDP price deflator as prescribed in
subsection A, paragraph 2, subdivision (b) of this section.

24 (c) The expenditure limitation for each community college district 25 for the following fiscal year.

26 (d) The modified expenditure limitation as prescribed in section 27 15-1471, if applicable.

Determine and report to the governing board of each community
college district prior to BEFORE April 1 of each year the following:

30 (a) The student population, utilizing the procedure prescribed in 31 section 15–1466.01, of each community college district for the following 32 fiscal year.

33 (b) The estimated change in the GDP price deflator as prescribed in
34 subsection A, paragraph 2, subdivision (b) of this section.

35 (c) The expenditure limitation for each community college district 36 for the following fiscal year.

37 (d) The modified expenditure limitation as prescribed in section
38 15-1471, if applicable.

39 4. Determine the expenditure limitation for each community college40 district, as follows:

41 (a) Determine the student population of each community college 42 district for fiscal year 1979-1980 using the definition of full-time 43 equivalent student in section 15-1401 in 1979-1980, except that if a 44 redefinition of full-time equivalent student changes the number of 45 semester credit units per semester from fifteen units, the student population for the 1979-1980 base year shall be recalculated using the new number of units.

3 (b) Determine the estimated student population of each community 4 college district for the fiscal year for which the expenditure limitation 5 is being determined using the definition of full-time equivalent student 6 in section 15-1401.

7 (c) Divide the student population determined in subdivision (b) of 8 this paragraph by the student population determined in subdivision (a) of 9 this paragraph.

10 (d) Determine the estimated or actual GDP price deflator for the 11 1978 calendar year.

(e) Determine the estimated GDP price deflator for the calendar
year immediately preceding the fiscal year for which the expenditure
limitation is being determined.

15 (f) Divide the GDP price deflator determined in subdivision (e) of 16 this paragraph by the GDP price deflator determined in subdivision (d) of 17 this paragraph.

18 (g) Multiply the amount determined in paragraph 1 of this 19 subsection for the community college district by the quotient determined 20 in subdivision (c) of this paragraph and multiply the resulting product by 21 the quotient determined in subdivision (f) of this paragraph.

5. In the event of an annexation, creation of a new community college district or a consolidation or change in the boundaries of a community college district, the base limit of a community college district shall be adjusted by the commission according to the following guidelines:

26 (a) In the event of the creation of a new community college 27 district, the base limit of the community college district shall be determined by multiplying the average amount of 1979-1980 per capita 28 29 expenditures of local revenues for all community college districts within the THIS state by the student population of the new community college 30 31 district. The expenditure limit of the county in which the new community college district is located shall be reduced by the amount paid to other 32 community college districts for tuition in the fiscal year preceding the 33 34 fiscal year in which the new community college district is created.

35 (b) In the case of an annexation, consolidation or change in the 36 boundaries of a community college district, the base limit of a community 37 college district shall be adjusted by the commission to reflect the change 38 by increasing the base limit of the community college district gaining the 39 newly included territory and decreasing the base limit of the community 40 college district losing the territory.

41 (c) If an existing community college district consolidates with a 42 contiguous county THAT IS not part of a community college district, the 43 commission shall:

44 (i) Increase the base limit of the existing community college 45 district by an amount equal to the amount of revenue which THAT would have been generated by applying the primary property tax rate of the existing community college district in the immediately prior year to the limited assessed valuation of the contiguous county in the immediately prior year.

4 (ii) Decrease the base limit of the contiguous county by the amount 5 of reimbursement prescribed by section 15-1469, subsection B, paragraph 1, 6 paid by such county in the 1979-1980 base year, except that no A decrease 7 shall NOT be made to the base limit of such county if the reimbursement 8 prescribed by section 15-1469, subsection B, paragraph 1 in the 9 immediately prior year was paid by the THIS state pursuant to section 10 15-1469.01.

11 (d) In the case of a decrease in service boundaries of a community 12 college district, the base limit of the community college district shall 13 be reduced by the commission to reflect the amount attributable to the service area in fiscal year 1979-1980 and the base student population of 14 the community college district shall be reduced by the commission to 15 16 reflect fiscal year 1979-1980 student population attributable to the 17 service area. The adjusted base limit and the adjusted fiscal year 18 1979-1980 student population shall be used in determining the expenditure 19 limitation for the community college district in the first year in which 20 the service boundaries are diminished and in each subsequent year.

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C. For school districts, the commission shall:

1. Determine the base limit of school districts subject to the expenditure limitation prescribed by article IX, section 21, subsection (2), Constitution of Arizona. For the purposes of this subsection and subsection D of this section, "base limit" means the total amount of expenditures of local revenues of all school districts in fiscal year <del>1979-1980</del> 2024-2025 as used to determine the expenditure limitation pursuant to paragraph 4 of this subsection.

Determine and report to the legislature prior to BEFORE March 1
of each year the following:

31 (a) The estimated total student population of all school districts32 for the current year.

(b) The estimated change in the GDP price deflator as prescribed in
subsection A, paragraph 2, subdivision (b) of this section.

35 (c) The estimated aggregate expenditure limitation for all school 36 districts for the following fiscal year.

37 3. Determine and report to the legislature, <del>prior to</del> BEFORE May 1 38 of each year, the following:

39 (a) The total student population of all school districts for the 40 current year.

(b) The estimated change in the GDP price deflator as prescribed in
subsection A, paragraph 2, subdivision (b) of this section.

43 (c) The aggregate expenditure limitation for all school districts44 for the following fiscal year.

1 4. Determine the aggregate expenditure limitation for all school 2 districts as follows:

3 (a) Determine the aggregate student population of all school 4 districts for the school year 1978-1979 2023-2024.

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(b) Determine the total student population of all school districts 6 for the current year.

7 aggregate student (c) Divide the population determined in 8 subdivision (b) of this paragraph by the aggregate student population in 9 subdivision (a) of this paragraph.

(d) Determine the estimated or actual GDP price deflator for the 10 11 1978 2023 calendar year.

(e) Determine the estimated GDP price deflator for the calendar 12 13 year immediately preceding the fiscal year for which the aggregate expenditure limitation is being determined. 14

(f) Divide the GDP price deflator determined in subdivision (e) of 15 16 this paragraph by the GDP price deflator determined in subdivision (d) of 17 this paragraph.

18 (g) Multiply the amount determined in paragraph 1 of this 19 subsection by the quotient determined in subdivision (c) of this paragraph 20 multiply the resulting product by the quotient determined in and 21 subdivision (f) of this paragraph.

22 D. In the case of a transfer of all or any part of the cost of providing a governmental function, pursuant to article IX, section 20, 23 24 subsection (4), Constitution of Arizona, or article IX, section 21, subsection (5) OR SUBSECTION (6), PARAGRAPH (a), Constitution of Arizona, 25 26 the base limit of political subdivisions, community college districts or school districts, whichever is applicable, shall be adjusted by the 27 commission to reflect the transfer by increasing the base limit of the 28 29 political subdivision, community college district or school district to which the cost is transferred and decreasing the base limit of the 30 31 political subdivision, community college district or school district from which the cost is transferred by the amount of the cost of the transferred 32 33 governmental function.

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E. For the purposes of this section:

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"Commission" means the economic estimates commission.

1. "GDP price deflator" means the average of the four implicit 2.

price deflators for the gross domestic product reported by the United 37 38 States department of commerce for the four quarters of the calendar year.

3. "Political subdivision" means any county, city, including any 39 40 charter city, or town.

41 4. "Population" shall be defined pursuant to article IX, section 20, subsection (3), paragraph (f), Constitution of Arizona. 42

43 5. "Student population" shall be defined pursuant to article IX, section 21, subsection (4), paragraph (e), Constitution of Arizona. 44

1 Sec. 2. Economic estimates commission 2 The economic estimates commission shall adjust any necessary 3 calculations to determine the aggregate expenditure limitation for fiscal 4 year 2025-2026 pursuant to section 41-563, Arizona Revised Statutes, as 5 amended by this act. 6 Sec. 3. <u>Conditional enactment; applicability</u> 7 This act does not become effective unless the Constitution of 8 Arizona is amended by vote of the people at the next general election by 9 passage of Senate Concurrent Resolution \_\_\_\_, fifty-sixth legislature, second regular session, relating to expenditure limitations, and applies 10

11 to fiscal years beginning from and after June 30, 2025.
