## **Overview**

Outlines requirements for social media platforms relating to the privacy of minors.

## **History**

A.R.S. <u>Title 18</u> regulates information technology, including chapters on government information technology, network access, network services and network security.

## **Provisions**

- 1. Requires each social media platform in Arizona that provides an online service, product or feature that is likely to be accessed by a minor to:
  - a) establish default settings that provide a high degree of privacy protections to each user;
  - b) allow each minor to opt out of the collection and use of the minor's personal information beyond what is necessary and disclosed to the minor; and
  - c) prohibit targeted advertising using a minor's personal information. (Sec. 1)
- 2. Excludes telecommunications service and broadband interactive service from the list of online services, products or features. (Sec. 1)
- 3. Defines de-identified data, personal information and social media platform. (Sec. 1)
- 4. Entitles this Act the Protecting Children on Social Media Act. (Sec. 2)
- 5. Becomes effective 90 days after the general effective date. (Sec. 3)
