<u>SB 1151</u>: school classrooms; ten commandments; posting Sponsor: Senator Kern, LD 27 House Engrossed

Overview

Includes copies or excerpts from the Ten Commandments in the list of materials a school administrator or teacher may read or post in any school building.

History

A school district governing board must exclude all books, publications, papers or audiovisual materials of a sectarian, partisan or denominational character from schools. Statute permits a school administrator or teacher to read or post in any school building copies or excerpts from: 1) the national motto *in God we trust*; 2) the national anthem; 3) the Pledge of Allegiance; 4) the Arizona Constitution's preamble; 5) the Declaration of Independence; 6) the Mayflower Compact; 7) writings, speeches, documents and proclamations of the Founding Fathers and U.S. presidents; 8) published U.S. Supreme Court decisions; 9) congressional acts; and 10) the state motto *Ditat Deus* (A.R.S. §§ <u>15-341</u>, <u>15-717</u>).

Provisions

1. Allows a school administrator or teacher to read or post in any school building copies or excerpts from the Ten Commandments.
