HOUSE BILL 2749

AN ACT

AMENDING TITLE 13, CHAPTER 6, ARIZONA REVISED STATUTES, BY ADDING SECTION 13-604.01; REPEALING SECTION 13-604.01, ARIZONA REVISED STATUTES; RELATING TO CLASSIFICATIONS OF OFFENSES.

1 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Arizona:
2 Section 1. Title 13, chapter 6, Arizona Revised Statutes, is
3 amended by adding section 13-604.01, to read:
4 13-604.01. Class 4, 5 or 6 felony; misdemeanor designation;
5 definition
6 A. NOTWITHSTANDING ANY OTHER PROVISION OF THIS TITLE, IF A PERSON
7 IS CONVICTED OF A CLASS 4, 5 OR 6 FELONY NOT INVOLVING A DANGEROUS
8 OFFENSE, THE COURT MAY ENTER JUDGMENT OF CONVICTION FOR A CLASS 1
9 MISDEMEANOR IF THE COURT DETERMINES ALL OF THE FOLLOWING:
10 1. THE PERSON HAS NOT PREVIOUSLY BEEN CONVICTED OF ANY FELONY
11 OFFENSE.
12 2. THE OFFENSE DID NOT INVOLVE A VICTIM.
13 3. THE PERSON HAS COMPLETED ALL OF THE TERMS AND CONDITIONS IMPOSED
14 BY THE COURT FOR THE CONVICTION, INCLUDING FULL PAYMENT OF ALL MONETARY
15 OBLIGATIONS.
16 4. AT LEAST FIVE YEARS HAVE PASSED SINCE THE COMPLETION OF THE
17 PERSON'S SENTENCE, AND THE PERSON HAS NOT BEEN CONVICTED OF A SUBSEQUENT
18 MISDEMEANOR OFFENSE INVOLVING A VICTIM OR A SUBSEQUENT FELONY OFFENSE
19 DURING THAT TIME.
20 5. ENTERING THE JUDGMENT OF CONVICTION FOR A CLASS 1 MISDEMEANOR IS
21 IN THE INTEREST OF JUSTICE.
22 B. THIS SECTION DOES NOT APPLY TO A PERSON WHO IS CONVICTED OF A
23 VIOLATION OF SECTION 13-2910, 13-3102 OR 13-3821.
24 C. FOR THE PURPOSES OF THIS SECTION, "VICTIM" HAS THE SAME MEANING
25 PRESCRIBED IN SECTION 13-4401.
26 Sec. 2. Delayed repeal
27 Section 13-604.01, Arizona Revised Statutes, as added by this act,
28 is repealed from and after September 30, 2028.
