SENATE BILL 1745

AN ACT

APPROPRIATING MONIES; RELATING TO LOCAL GOVERNMENT.

1 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Arizona:

2 Section 1. County fiscal obligations; report

3 A. Notwithstanding any other law, for fiscal year 2025-2026, a
4 county with a population of less than two hundred fifty thousand persons
5 according to the 2020 United States decennial census may meet any county
6 fiscal obligation from any source of county revenue designated by the
7 county, including monies of any countywide special taxing jurisdiction of
8 which the board of supervisors serves as the board of directors. Under
9 the authority provided in this subsection, a county may not use more than
10 \$1,250,000 for purposes other than the purposes of the revenue source.

11 B. On or before October 1, 2025, each county with a population of
12 less than two hundred fifty thousand persons according to the 2020 United
13 States decennial census shall report to the director of the joint
14 legislative budget committee whether the county used a revenue source for
15 purposes other than the purposes of the revenue source to meet a county
16 fiscal obligation pursuant to subsection A of this section and, if so, the
17 specific revenue source and amount of revenues that the county intends to
18 use in fiscal year 2025-2026.

19 Sec. 2. Gila county veterans' services

20 Of the monies appropriated in Laws 2023, chapter 133, section 94 to
21 the department of veterans' services for a Gila county veterans retreat,
22 Gila county may establish, maintain and operate facilities for the
23 purposes of providing services to veterans.
